Overview

The U.S. Department of Education Green Ribbon Schools (ED-GRS) program is a public engagement initiative structured as a federal recognition award for whole school sustainability. ED-GRS honors schools, districts, and postsecondary institutions' cost-saving, health-promoting, and performance-enhancing sustainability practices, in order to celebrate these schools and bring more attention to their work. The Illinois State Board of Education, in partnership with the Illinois Green Alliance, hosts a state-level awards process to select candidates who will go on to represent Illinois in the national awards competition.

Award Criteria:

Illinois applicants must show progress in each of the following:

- 1 Reducing environmental impacts
- 2 Improving health and wellness
- Offering effective environmental and sustainability education

Applicants will draft and submit an application describing their progress in each of the above areas and submit that application by December 22, 2023, to greenribbon@isbe.net.
