Have the teacher's contact information available:

- Reach out to the teacher if your child has any questions or is unable to complete an assignment.
- Reach out to the teacher if you do not have the necessary supplies or equipment for your child to complete an assignment.

Set a routine:

- Set a consistent time and a location for when homework should be done at home.
- Try not to schedule any important events during that time.

Set up an area to study. The area should:

- Have enough space to write.
- Have school supplies at hand.
- Have access to resources.
- Limit distractions. (Some children work best with little to no noise, while others need background noise.)
- Be organized.

Take breaks:

• Encourage breaks and work in 15-minute increments.


If there is no homework assigned:
