**NOTE:** From 1977 through 1993 children were counted either on the Chapter I, 89-313 count, or the P.L. 94-142 count. In some of these years, birth through three year olds were required by the federal government to be counted. These counts are totaled together on the chart.

**NOTE:** Starting school year 1994-95 students were counted under IDEA. Students must be in a special education program on December 1, be at least age 3 and not more than 22, and have an individualized education program (IEP) in place to be eligible for the IDEA child count.
