The Illinois Learning Standards (ILS) defines what all students in all Illinois public school should know and be able to do in the seven core areas as a result of their elementary and secondary schooling. The Illinois learning standards have not changes since their adoption in 1997. The Performance Descriptors and the IL-aligned Classroom Assessments were developed by Illinois teachers for Illinois teacher to enhance the ILS and serve as resources to help teachers determine local performance expectation at each grade level.
