- _____ 6. **Proposal Narrative (maximum of seven (7) pages):** Respond to each of the “Proposal Narrative Requirements” on pages 8 and 9.
- _____ 7. **Evaluation Design (maximum three (3) pages):** Discuss how the school district or partnership will evaluate the success of its efforts to integrate technology into curricula and instruction, increase teachers’ ability to effectively use technology for instruction, and enable students to meet the Illinois Learning Standards. Include the methodology to be used, the data to be collected, and how the evaluation results will be used to make improvements in the program. Also describe the measures to be used to gauge the effectiveness of the steps taken to ensure that the project continues after the end of the grant period.
- _____ 8. **Budget Summary and Payment Schedule (Attachment 2):** Must be submitted on the form provided and signed by the district superintendent or official authorized to submit the proposal. The payment schedule should be based on the projected date of expenditures. Salaries and fringe benefits should be requested in equal intervals on the schedule. Supplies, equipment, contracted services and professional development should be requested in the month for which the expenditure is anticipated.
- _____ 9. **Budget Narrative (Attachment 3):** Must include descriptions of the anticipated expenditures, correlated to the line items set forth on the Budget Summary. Must include subcontract information, if applicable (see item 7 of the document titled “Certifications and Assurances, and Standard Terms of the Grant,” Attachment 6).
- _____ 10. **Enhancing Education Through Technology (EETT) Equitable Participation of Private Schools (Attachment 4):** This form must be completed and signed by each private school within the school district boundaries of the district and partnership member school districts. Duplicate as needed.
- _____ 11. **Certifications and Assurances (Attachments 5, 6, 7 and 8):** Each applicant, *including each entity that is participating in a joint application*, is required to submit the certification forms attached (“Certifications and Assurances, and Standard Terms of the Grant,” “Program-Specific Terms of the Grant,” “Certification Regarding Debarment,” and “Certification Regarding Lobbying”). These must be signed by the official legally authorized to submit the proposal and to bind the applicant to its contents.
- _____ 12. **Children’s Internet Protection Act (CIPA) (Attachment 9):** Complete the attachment.
- _____ 13. **General Education Provisions Act (GEPA) (Attachment 10):** Complete the attachment.

Proposal Narrative Requirements

Applicants must provide the following information in the order presented below. Applicants should note in their proposals, as applicable, the alignment of the proposed activities to the ISTE's standards referenced on page 4. In addition, applicants should address, in the appropriate section of the proposal narrative, how the proposed project addresses each of the system conditions enumerated on page 5.

Applicants should review the scoring rubric in Appendix C before completing this section.

Program Description

1. **Goal Alignment to Illinois Learning Standards.** Describe the specific goals of the EETT project for using advanced technology to improve student academic achievement and how they are aligned to the Illinois Learning Standards.
2. **Improving Academic Achievement.** Describe the strategies to be employed to improve the academic achievement, including technology literacy, of all students attending schools served by the applicant and to improve the capacity of all teachers in schools served by the applicant district to integrate technology effectively into curriculum and instruction.
3. **Curricula and Teaching Strategies that Integrate Technology.** Describe the process to be used to identify and promote curricula and teaching strategies, based on a review of relevant research, that integrate technology effectively into curricula and instruction and that will lead to improvements in student academic achievement.
4. **Improving Teacher Effectiveness.** Based upon a review of relevant research, describe the steps to be taken to ensure that all teachers will integrate technology effectively into curricula and instruction that will lead to improvements in student academic achievement.
5. **Innovative Delivery Strategies.** Describe the process to encourage the development and use of innovative strategies for the delivery of specialized or rigorous courses and curricula through the use of technology (including distance-learning technologies), particularly in areas that would not otherwise have access to such courses or curricula due to geographical distances or insufficient resources.
6. **Integration of Technology with Curricula and Instruction.** Describe how technology (including software and electronically delivered learning materials) will be integrated into curricula and instruction. Provide a timeline for this integration. Describe how the project will be continued after the current grant funding expires.
7. **Professional Development.** Describe the ongoing, sustained professional development that will be provided for teachers, principals, administrators, and school library media personnel to further the effective use of technology in the classroom or library media center.

8. **Parental Involvement and Collaboration with Adult Literacy Service Providers.** Describe how technology will be used effectively to promote parental involvement and increase communication with parents. Indicate how parents will be informed of the technology to be used. Describe how the program will be developed, where applicable, in collaboration with adult literacy service providers.
9. **Increased Accessibility.** Describe the steps to be taken to ensure that all students and teachers have increased access to technology. Indicate how EETT funds will be used to help students in high-poverty and high-needs schools or those attending schools identified for improvement or corrective action under section 1116 of Title I, and to help ensure that teachers are prepared to integrate technology effectively into curricula and instruction.
10. **Technology Type and Costs.** Indicate the type of technology to be acquired with EETT funds and the cost of the proposed technology. Include provisions for interoperability of components.
11. **Coordination of Activities.** Describe how the school district will coordinate activities funded through the EETT program with technology-related projects supported from other sources.

Criteria for Review and Approval of Proposals

Each proposal submitted will be evaluated in accordance with the rubric presented in Appendix C by impartial panelists with experience in integrating technology into school curricula and instruction in order to increase academic achievement. These educators will carefully consider the extent to which an applicant has provided evidence that the proposed program is of sufficient quality and scope to carry out the purposes of the EETT program effectively. Educators working within a district that submits a response to this RFP will NOT be considered as a review panelist.

It is the intention of the State Board of Education to award grants equitably among geographic areas within the state, including urban and rural communities, to the extent practicable. Final determination for selection will be made by the State Superintendent of Education and will be based upon recommendations resulting from the review process.

Total possible points is 100 and are divided as follows:

- up to 65 points for the proposal narrative,
- up to 15 points for the program evaluation, and
- up to 20 points for priority considerations described below.

Priority Considerations

1. **Formula Awards.** Up to an additional 10 points will be awarded to applicants whose formula grants are of insufficient size to be effective (i.e., formula grants of less than \$25,000). ISBE staff will assign points to applicants determined to have received insufficient EETT formula funds using the FY08 EETT formula allocations.

2. **Previous Competitive EETT Grant.** An additional 10 points will be awarded to applicants that have never received EETT competitive grant funding. Those districts that received competitive grant funding in 2003, but NOT in 2006, will receive 5 priority points.
