

PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENT
Special Milk for Half-Day Students

_____ today announced its policy for the Special Milk Program. The Special Milk Program is available only to students enrolled in a half-day program who do not have access to a meal service. The following household size and income criteria will be used for determining eligibility:

Children from households that meet Federal guidelines are eligible for free milk through the Special Milk Program. **Complete one application per household for all children that attend the same school district.**

Milk served must meet the U. S. Department of Agriculture milk requirements. However, if a child has been determined by a doctor to have a disability and the disability would prevent the child from drinking the regular school milk, this school will make substitutions prescribed by the doctor. If a substitution is needed, there will be no extra charge for the milk. If you believe your child needs substitutions because of a disability, please contact the school for further information.

Application forms are being sent to all homes with a letter to parents or guardians. To apply for Special Milk Program services, households must complete the application as soon as possible, sign it, and return it to the school. Additional copies of the application form are available in the principal's office in each school. Households should answer all applicable questions on the form. An application which does not contain all the required information cannot be processed and approved by the school. Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) participants may be eligible for free milk and are encouraged to complete an application for milk benefits.

The required information is as follows:

SNAP/TANF HOUSEHOLDS: If you received a **letter** from the school stating that your child is directly certified for free milk, **you do not have to complete this application to receive milk benefits.** Households that currently receive Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) or Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) for their child(ren), only have to list the child(ren)'s name and SNAP or TANF case number and sign the application. **Applications listing LINK card numbers cannot be used for free milk.**

ALL OTHER HOUSEHOLDS: If a household's income is at or below the level shown on the income scale, children are eligible for the Special Milk Program. Households must provide the following information: (1) the names of all household members; (2) the social security number of the adult household member signing the application, or indicate if the adult does not have a social security number; (3) the amount of income each household member received last month, how frequently it is paid, and where it came from (wages, child support, etc.); and (4) the signature of an adult household member.

The information on the application may be checked by school or other officials at any time during the school year.

Households may apply for benefits at any time during the school year. Households that are not eligible now but have a decrease in household income, an increase in household size or a household member becomes unemployed, should fill out an application at that time.

In certain cases, foster children are eligible for free milk regardless of the household income. Households that have foster children living with them and wish to apply for free milk for them should complete the application. Homeless, migrant, and runaway youth are categorically eligible for free milk. Please follow instructions and return form to school.

Households that do not agree with the ruling of the official may wish to discuss it with the school. Households also have the right to a fair hearing. This can be done by calling or writing the following official:
