Fifteen-Year-Old Students with Disabilities (IEP) in Elementary School Districts

The following policy for testing pertains to the Illinois School Code (105 ILCS 5/14-6.01):

Fifteen-year-old students with disabilities who are enrolled in an elementary district become accountable to the high school district (according to school code). The high school district becomes financially responsible for the student. The high school district is also responsible for the educational program of the student. The law only pertains to elementary districts that feed into separate high school districts. It does not pertain to unit districts.



Fifteen-Year-Old Students with Disabilities (IEP) in Elementary School Districts

- Our legal team is working with both Assessments and Special Education to develop guidance that fulfills all statutory requirements, but also gives ultimately flexibility to the responsible IEP teams to determine the developmentally appropriate placement for students. Detailed guidance will be forthcoming.
- Even with this guidance, which will impact appropriate promotion to grade 9, a student takes the grade level assessment of their grade of enrollment.



First Year in U.S. School Status for English Learners (ELs)

- EL students with "First Year in U.S. School" status will take the math, ELA, and science (if applicable to the grade or course) assessments.
- The scores the students receive will not be used in the calculation for district and school accountability.






Illinois' accountability assessments provide critical information for educators and the State to give more support and resources to the students in the greatest need.



For students in grades 3–8, IAR measures the same math and literacy standards with the same types of questions, while reducing testing time by one-third.

The Biross Assessment of Readiness (IARI) is the state assessment and accountability resears for Biross students emplied in a public school district. IARI assesses the New Biross Learning Standards Incorporating the Common Core and will be administered in English Language Arts and Mathematics.

Test Window: March 1 – April 30, 2019

User Accounts

- User accounts were purged at the end of 2018.
- Initial accounts, per EPS data, were loaded 2/14/19.
- Additional accounts must be added by district and school staff after 2/14/19.

ISA Rostering (Delta Process)

- The delta process checks data in SIS for enrollment changes and updates the ISA roster with the changes.
- The delta process runs nightly for all schools.
- During the school's test window the delta process runs every 15 minutes.
- Once a student begins an ISA assessment the delta process will not update their roster record.

DLM-AA: Security Awareness

- When discussing student information via email, please do not use student PII (personally-identifiable information).

DLM-AA: Training

- Training needs to be completed as soon as possible.
- Training that is not completed will delay access to students to complete the First Contact Survey and PNP.



DLM-AA: Pre-ID

- All students must have a school-level RCDTS code, IDEA indicator marked "Yes", and be in the testing grades of 3-11.
- ISBE has identified some grade 12 students who are required to test and have assigned them to the appropriate assessment (i.e., SAT or DLM-AA) based on their most recent test record.
- Grade 12 students required to test were determined by SIS programming, based on descriptions in this flowchart:

DLM-AA: Student Uploads

- Students missing from Educator Portal are the result of these errors in the DLM-AA Pre-ID:
 - The student is on the IAR Pre-ID due to the most recent test record being PARCC or SAT, or the student is in grade 3 and is defaulted to IAR Pre-ID.
 - The RCDTS code ends in 0000, 6100, or 6000.
 - The student does not have the IDEA Services (IEP) indicator marked "YES" in SIS enrollment.



DLM-AA: Student Uploads

- During the data lockdown, student uploads will no longer be completed by SIS.
- District test coordinators must complete the Student Upload Template to add students into Educator Portal.
- The Student Upload Template is made available to only district test coordinators through an email request to Laura Quimby at lquimby@isbe.net.



DLM-AA: Student Uploads

- Once the Student Upload Template is completed, the file must be submitted back to ISBE through a secure file link.
- The instructions for submission will be made available to the district test coordinator at the time the request is made for student uploads.


To submit a file to ISBE through a secure link, districts must use the following steps:

- 1. Go to http://www.isbe.net
- 2. From "System Quick Links" at the top, click on "Send ISBE a file."
- Complete "Sender information": first and last name, school district name, current email address.
- Select "QUIMBY LAURA A" from the "Receiver Information" drop down menu.
- 5. Click on "Choose File", then open.
- 6. In the Subject Section, type "DLM Student Upload"
- In the Message Section...



DLM-AA: Data Lockdown

- Subject: Student Upload
- Message: District Name
- Click Submit





DLM-AA: Data Lockdown

- Student uploads will take about 24 to 48 hours to complete.
- Once the student has been uploaded, an email will be sent stating the upload is completed.
- The student must be added to the teacher's roster, and the teacher must complete the First Contact Survey.
- During the testing window, once the First Contact
 Survey is completed, it takes 24 to 48 hours for a testlet to be delivered for testing.



DLM-AA: Rosters

- Rosters can be created during the data lockdown.
- Users must click "Search" each time to create a roster.
- Subjects are only English language arts, mathematics, and science.
- Do not use "other" or "social studies."



DLM-AA: Security User Agreement

- The Security User Agreement must be accepted in order to complete the tasks related to students in Educator Portal.
- Users who reject the Security User Agreement have limited access.




DLM-AA: First Contact Survey

- Must be completed for every student prior to testing.
- First contact survey must be completed by March 12, 2019.
- If not completed, then it delays the delivery of the testlets when the test window opens.
- Currently, the status of complete or incomplete First Contact Surveys is noted below:
- \bigstar 4,490 completed \bigstar
 - 1,960 not started
 - 6,758 ready to submit
 - 2,910 in progress



DLM-AA: Data Extract Reports

- Reports should be used to verify completion of tasks prior to the data lockdown.
- Reports available to each unique role are shown to the right.






DLM-AA: Common Questions

- New to DLM-AA:
 - Please read through the Test Administration manual and the Assessment Coordinator manual.
 - Utilize the Educator Portal manual for tasks within Educator Portal.
 - Utilize the Guide to DLM-AA Required Test Administrator Training manual.
- Student transfers:
 - All student transfers from one district to another must be completed by ISBE within Educator Portal.



DLM-AA: Common Questions

- Users unable to access Educator Portal:
 - The user(s) did not activate account within a timely manner.
 - The DTC or BTC must send an email to the user in Educator Portal.





DLM-AA: Common Questions

- Verify all tasks are completed:
 - Data Extract reports will help verify that tasks are completed.

SAT/PSAT Spring 2019

- PSAT 8/9 (NEW, required for grade 9)
- PSAT 10 (NEW, required for grade 10)
- SAT (required for grade 11)
 - NEW, some grade 12 students will be required to participate in SAT in spring 2019. ISBE has posted a flowchart to help identify which grade 12 students will be included in SAT Pre-ID. www.isbe.net/Documents/Grade 12 Testers Flow Chart 2019.pdf

SAT Spring 2019

- SAT (grade 11 and <u>some grade 12</u>)
 - April 9, 2019, primary day
 - April 23, 2019, makeup day
 - April 9-23, 2019, accommodated testing window
- Who must test? (SAT School Day Coordinator Manual, page 60)
 - All students enrolled in SIS as grade 11 at the time of testing must test. This includes foreign exchange students and students who tested in 2018 but are in grade 11 again.
 - This includes grade 11 homeschooled students who are receiving instruction in ELA and/or math from the public school.
 - NEW English Learners (ELs) identified as "First Year in U.S. School" must take all ELA sections, including the essay, in addition to math, but scores will not be included for accountability in either content area.

• Exceptions:

- Some grade 11 students take DLM-AA, the alternate assessment, instead of SAT.
- Homeschooled students who are <u>not</u> receiving instruction in ELA and/or math from the public school may <u>not</u> test.



PSAT Spring 2019

- PSAT 10 (Grade 10) and PSAT 8/9 (Grade 9)
 - April 9, 10, and/or 11, 2019, primary day(s)
 - April 10-23, 2019, makeup test window
 - April 9-23, 2019, accommodated testing window

Who must test?

- All students enrolled in SIS as grade 10 at the time of testing must take PSAT 10 and all students enrolled in SIS as grade 9 at the time of testing must take PSAT 8/9 (this includes foreign exchange students).
- This includes grades 9 and 10 homeschooled students who are receiving instruction in ELA and/or math from the public school.
- English Learners (ELs) identified as "First Year in U.S. School" must take ELA (and math), but scores will not be included for accountability in either content area.


• Exceptions:

- Some grade 9 and 10 students take DLM-AA, the alternate assessment, instead of PSAT 8/9 and PSAT 10, respectively.
- Homeschooled students who are <u>not</u> receiving instruction in ELA and/or math from the public school may <u>not</u> test.



SAT/PSAT Pre-ID


- The SAT, PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9 Pre-ID is available now in SIS.
- Pre-ID data were sent to the College Board February 1, 2019. These data will be used to determine standard test booklet quantities and print Pre-ID labels.
- The Pre-ID will continue to update in real time as students are enrolled and exited, including any grade-level changes.
- ISBE will provide updated Pre-ID data to the College Board based on Pre-ID data scheduled to be captured on Friday, March 29, 2019.
- Pre-ID data from March 29 will <u>not</u> generate any additional test materials orders or Pre-ID labels but will be used to match score data in cases where students have moved from one school to another or been added since February 1, 2019.







SAT, PSAT 10, PSAT 8/9

New this year, ISBE will require public-school students in grade 9 to take the PSAT 8/9 and public-school students in grade 10 to take the PSAT 10, unless the student will take DLM-AA instead. ISBE will continue to require public-school students in grade 11 to take the SAT, unless the student will take DLM-AA instead.

Additionally, some public-school students in grade 12 may also be required to take the SAT or DLM-AA, as appropriate, Please see the flowchart document خ for details about which grade 12 students are required to test.

News & Updates



Submit a grade 12 exemption only for a student who will be graduating before the April 2019 administration of the SAT or DLM-AA and hasn't tested or been identified in SIS as being exempt or for a student whose exemption was not identified through ISBE SIS programming according to the flowchart document خ . If your district believes there is evidence in SIS of an exemption, please write to assessment@isbe.net for verification before completing any of the grade 12 exemption paperwork.

College Board-Approved Accommodations

- College Board-Approved Accommodations allow students to receive scores that are college- and scholarship-reportable.
- College Board-Approved Accommodations for ALL tests, including SAT, PSAT 10 (grade 10), and PSAT 8/9 (grade 9) must be requested via College Board's Services for Students with Disabilities (SSD) Online system by the school that will receive the materials.
- February 19, 2019: Deadline to request College Board-approved accommodations in SSD Online for SAT and PSAT 10 (Schools with existing Al codes may begin entering requests now.)
- March 4, 2019: Late request deadline for late transfers to the school and students with newly-identified accommodations and (NEW!) extended deadline for PSAT 8/9
- After March 4, 2019: Enter request in SSD Online, and call SSD to confirm that materials can arrive in time for testing.





State-Allowed Accommodations

- **State-Allowed Accommodations** <u>DO NOT</u> allow students to receive scores that are college- and scholarship-reportable.
- State-Allowed Accommodations for ALL tests, including SAT, PSAT 10 (grade 10), and PSAT 8/9 (grade 9) must also be entered via College Board's Services for Students with Disabilities (SSD) Online system by the school that will receive the materials.
- **January 16, 2019:** State-Allowed Accommodations may begin to be entered into SSD Online. (site opened early!)
- March 4, 2019: Deadline to request State-Allowed Accommodations in SSD Online
- After March 4, 2019: Enter request in SSD Online, and call SSD to confirm that materials can arrive in time for testing.

Parent Consent Forms for Students with Disabilities

The College Board does not require schools to submit the consent form, but evidence of consent must be kept on file at the school. Parent/guardian approval obtained through the student's IEP, 504 Plan, or other school documentation may be acceptable if it includes consent for requesting accommodations. Once you have obtained parent/guardian consent, it remains in effect for the student as long as the student is in high school.

Parent Consent Forms for English Learners (ELs)

The College Board does not require schools to submit the consent form, but evidence of consent must be kept on file at the school. Parent/guardian approval obtained through other school documentation may be acceptable if it includes consent for using EL supports and/or requesting 50% EL extended time. Once you have obtained parent/guardian consent, it remains in effect for the student as long as the student is in high school.

Note Regarding Grade 12 Students on the NAR in the College Board's SSD Online

- For 2019 SAT, the College Board will look in SSD Online for any grade 11 or grade 12 grade student associated with a participating school and send the materials for that student.
- The school should use materials only for those grade 12 students ISBE has designated as being required to test, according to the SAT Pre-ID.
- It is not possible for the College Board to limit materials to only those grade 12 students on the SAT Pre-ID for testing because there may not be an exact match (e.g., a student may be Thomas in SIS vs. Tom in SSD Online).
- This also ensures that the College Board ships materials to capture any grade
 12 student deemed eligible to test after ISBE's initial Pre-ID upload.



Note Regarding Grade 12 Students on the NAR in the College Board's SSD Online

- Traditionally, the College Board does not send overages for nonstandard materials. While this may result in excess materials at the school, it does have the unintended benefit for schools to have some extra materials on hand in case they don't receive what they need to test all their students.
- Please follow the instructions in the coordinator manuals for returning any unused testing materials.



- English learners (ELs) will be able to utilize EL supports for the ISBE-provided spring 2019 SAT, PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9 administration.
- Use of any EL Support will allow for college- and scholarship-reportable scores.
- These EL supports include:
 - Use of an approved word-to-word bilingual glossary
 - Use of translated test directions, and
 - Use of 50% extended time



- Use of an approved word-to-word bilingual glossary:
 - List is expanded to approximately 100 glossaries for spring 2019.
 - Use of glossary does NOT require an approval by College Board and does NOT require entry into SSD Online.

Use of translated test directions:

- Translated test directions are available in PDF format for SAT, PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9. Schools must print the directions for students, as no printed test directions will come with test materials.
- Directions are available in Albanian, Arabic, Bengali, Chinese (Mandarin),
 Gujarati, Haitian Creole, Hindi, Polish, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish, Urdu, and
 Vietnamese. The College Board will also support "on the fly" translations of
 directions by district-approved translators.
- Use of translated test directions does NOT require an approval by College Board and does NOT require entry into SSD Online.

Use of 50% extended time:

- Although not an accommodation, EL students requiring 50% extended time will need to be identified in SSD Online.
- Students will receive 50% extended time on each section of the SAT, PSAT 10, or PSAT 8/9. Students must be given the entire time and cannot go ahead in the test even if they are the only one testing.
- Schools can request 50% extended time for ELs in SSD Online starting January 16, 2019. Students will be automatically approved, and no supporting documentation is required. More information about the process for entering student information will be available this winter.
- EL students using 50% extended time can be tested with other students with accommodations testing with the same timing and test materials.
