Fifteen-Year-Old Students with Disabilities (IEP) in Elementary School Districts

- ISBE had hoped to produce updated guidance about 105 ILCS 5/14-6.01 for the spring 2019 testing season, this issue is deeply connected with other areas, including Evidence-based Funding, special education, and more. As such, it requires careful deliberation and research on intended and unintended outcomes.
- Previous ISBE guidance that students be enrolled in a high school district as grade 9 students, which was last confirmed in 2014-15 is still in effect.
- Detailed guidance to assist with Spring 2019 is posted now.

First Year in U.S. School Status for English Learners (ELs)

- EL students with “First Year in U.S. School” status will take the math, ELA, and science (if applicable to the grade or course) assessments.
- The scores the students receive will not be used in the calculation for district and school accountability.

Test Window:

- **Online Test Administration: March 11 (earliest) – April 26 (latest)**
 - Manuals and scripts for read-aloud accommodations will arrive by March 6.
- **Paper Test Administration: March 25 – April 26 (latest)**
 - Paper test administration material will arrive in district between March 13 and March 18.
- **Initial order for paper test material was based on information in SIS as of February 15.**
 - Additional order window opens March 18.
- **First student information upload from SIS to Pearson – February 15.**
- **Final student information upload from SIS to Pearson is March 1.**
 - Test session assignment will be sent with the March 1 upload (if you choose to assign sessions through SIS).

ILLINOIS Assessment of Readiness

Same Standards, Same Content, Improved Administration 2019 // PHASE ONE

The Illinois Assessment of Readiness is a federally required measure of student mastery of the Illinois Learning Standards in English language arts and mathematics in grades 3 through 8 – and their readiness for what's next.

What

Students, families, and schools will experience essentially no difference in the assessment this year. The Illinois Assessment of Readiness measures the same standards and includes the same high-quality test questions used the last four years. Using the same content and measuring the same standards ensures comparability from year to year – an essential commitment to including growth in our support and accountability system. The assessment may be slightly shorter this year to field test new questions needed for the transition to a computer adaptive test.

Who

All students in grades 3 through 8 in Illinois public schools or receiving the tax credit scholarship to attend Illinois private schools.

When

The online assessment window tentatively opens March 11. For the fewer than 10 percent of schools in the state using paper exams, the assessment window opens March 25, due to the logistics of printing and shipping paper. Schools using paper exams will receive the test materials March 18. The assessment window statewide closes April 26.


Why

The improvements to come to the Illinois Assessment of Readiness administration in the next few years reflect active partnership with educators and practitioners to make the assessment even more useful for improving student outcomes. It will provide the option of bringing all accountability assessments onto a single administration and management platform, and will maintain comparability throughout all changes. (See full timeline of changes below.)

How

ISBE has two contracts for the Illinois Assessment of Readiness – one for content and one for administration. Illinois' existing contract with New Meridian provides the assessment's high-quality PARCC content. A one-year contract with Pearson will provide the 2019 administration. The vendor for future administration is pending procurement resolution.



DLM-AA: Security Awareness

- When discussing student information via email, please do not use student PII (personally-identifiable information).

DLM-AA: Training

- Training still can be completed during the lockdown.
- Training that is not completed will delay access to students to complete the First Contact Survey and PNP.



DLM-AA: Student Uploads

- Students missing from Educator Portal are the result of these errors in the enrollment record and the DLM-AA Pre-ID:
 - The student is on the IAR Pre-ID due to the most recent test record being PARCC or SAT, or the student is in grade 3 and is defaulted to IAR Pre-ID.
 - The RCDTS code ends in 0000, 6100, or 6000.
 - The student does not have the IDEA Services (IEP) indicator marked "YES" in SIS enrollment.



DLM-AA: Student Uploads

- During the data lockdown, student uploads will no longer be completed by SIS.
- District test coordinators must complete the Student Upload Template to add students into Educator Portal.
- The Student Upload Template is made available to only district test coordinators through an email request to Laura Quimby at lquimby@isbe.net.



DLM-AA: Student Uploads

- Once the Student Upload Template is completed, the file must be submitted back to ISBE through a secure file link.
- The instructions for submission will be made available to the district test coordinator at the time the request is made for student uploads.



DLM-AA: Data Lockdown

- Student uploads will take about 24 to 48 hours to complete.
- Once the student has been uploaded, an email will be sent stating the upload is completed.
- The student must be added to the teacher's roster, and the teacher must complete the First Contact Survey.
- During the testing window, once the First Contact Survey is completed, it takes 24 to 48 hours for a testlet to be delivered for testing.



DLM-AA: Rosters

- Rosters can be created during the data lockdown.
- Users **must** click "Search" each time to create a roster.
- Subjects are only **English language arts, mathematics, and science.**
- Do not use "other" or "social studies."



DLM-AA: First Contact Survey

- Must be completed for every student prior to testing.
- First contact survey must be completed by March 12, 2019.
- If not completed, then it delays the delivery of the testlets when the test window opens.
- Currently, the status of complete or incomplete First Contact Surveys is noted below:

- 6,056 ready to submit

SAT/PSAT Spring 2019

- The SAT® School Day training has been updated to include various changes in how you plan for the test, administer the test, and return your test material.
- Even if you've taken the training in the past, if you'll be coordinating the SAT School Day administration at your school, you're required to complete it again by no later than two weeks before your test date.
- Online training is also available for the PSAT-related assessments. Training for the PSAT 10 and PSAT 8/9 is required unless you're also the SAT test coordinator and have completed the SAT School Day test coordinator training. There are slight nuances between the SAT and PSAT-related assessments that supervisors and staff should be aware of.





SAT/PSAT Pre-ID

- The SAT, PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9 Pre-ID is available now in SIS.
- Pre-ID data were sent to the College Board February 1, 2019. These data will be used to determine standard test booklet quantities and print Pre-ID labels.
- The Pre-ID will ***continue to update in real time*** as students are enrolled and exited, including any grade-level changes.
- ISBE will provide ***updated Pre-ID data*** to the College Board based on Pre-ID data scheduled to be captured on **Friday, March 29, 2019**.

- **March 4, 2019:** Late request deadline for late transfers to the school and students with newly-identified accommodations and **(NEW!) extended deadline for PSAT 8/9**

State-Allowed Accommodations

Note Regarding Grade 12 Students on the NAR in the College Board's SSD Online

- For 2019 SAT, the College Board will look in SSD Online for any grade 11 or grade 12 grade student associated with a participating school and send the materials for that student.
- The school should use materials only for those grade 12 students ISBE has designated as being required to test, according to the SAT Pre-ID.
- It is not possible for the College Board to limit materials to only those grade 12 students on the SAT Pre-ID for testing because there may not be an exact match (e.g., a student may be Thomas in SIS vs. Tom in SSD Online).
- This also ensures that the College Board ships materials to capture any grade 12 student deemed eligible to test after ISBE's initial Pre-ID upload.



Note Regarding Grade 12 Students on the NAR in the College Board's SSD Online

- Traditionally, the College Board does not send overages for nonstandard materials. While this may result in excess materials at the school, it does have the unintended benefit for schools to have some extra materials on hand in case they don't receive what they need to test all their students.
- Please follow the instructions in the coordinator manuals for returning any unused testing materials.

SAT/PSAT EL Supports

- **Use of 50% extended time:**
 - Although not an accommodation, EL students requiring 50% extended time will need to be identified in SSD Online.
 - Students will receive 50% extended time on each section of the SAT, PSAT 10, or PSAT 8/9. Students must be given the entire time and cannot go ahead in the test even if they are the only one testing.
 - Schools can request 50% extended time for ELs in SSD Online starting **January 16, 2019**. Students will be automatically approved, and no supporting documentation is required. More information about the process for entering student information will be available this winter.
 - EL students using 50% extended time can be tested with other students with accommodations testing with the same timing and test materials.
