



- School food authorities (SFAs) participating in the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program that process HEAs are required to verify income for a small percentage of households approved for free or reduced-price meals each school year.



Local Food for Schools (LFS)



- LFS is funding for schools in the National School Lunch Program to purchase local unprocessed or minimally processed foods to serve as a part of your reimbursable meals.
- Local means grown, raise, produced and processed in Illinois or if outside of Illinois, then within 400 miles of your school.
- Additionally, the funds need to be used on a new local product or an expansion of a local food item that you have already been purchasing. Because of this milk is not an allowable item for LFS funds but there are a lot of other local foods that are eligible to purchase with LFS funds.

Local Foods for Schools Cooperative Agreement Program (LFS)

The Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) is excited to announce that Illinois will be participating in the USDA's Local Food for Schools Cooperative Agreement Program (LFS). This new program will provide 7.3 million dollars to ISBE, that will be distributed to eligible schools to purchase local unprocessed and minimally processed food. ISBE plans to issue non-competitive sub-awards of these funds to School Food Authorities (SFAs) that participate in the National School Lunch and/or School Breakfast Program for use by January of 2025.

The goal of LFS is to increase purchases of domestic, locally grown foods from local producers, small businesses, and socially disadvantaged farmers/producers for distribution to schools in order to build a more resilient local food chain by expanding and strengthening local and regional markets.

105 ILCS 125/5.5

Sec. 5.5. Plant-based school lunch option. As a part of the school lunch program, a school district shall provide a plant-based school lunch option that complies with federal nutritional mandates to those students who submit a prior request to the school district requesting a plant-based school lunch option.

105 ILCS 125/5.5

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Plant-Based School Lunch Option—What Next?

1 Set a local policy

- How far in advance do meals need to be requested?
- What documentation needs completed?

2 Reach out to the student making the request

- What type of diet do they follow or what restrictions do they have?
- How often will they be eating school lunch?

Research menu items

- What products does your distributor have available?
- What recipes fit your food service operation?

Set the menu

- Will you use a cycle menu?
- Will you menu a plant-based option regularly?



Plant-Based School Lunch Option— Considerations

Plant-based meat alternate examples: nuts, seeds, nut or seed butters, beans, lentils, tofu, tempeh, plant-based protein products or meat analogs

Processed meat alternates need crediting documentation, such as a Child Nutrition (CN) Label or Product Formulation Statement (PFS)

Meals must meet the NSLP meal pattern
