Fifteen-Year-Old Students with Disabilities (IEP) in Elementary School Districts

The following policy for testing pertains to the Illinois School Code (105 ILCS 5/14-6.01):

Fifteen-year-old students with disabilities who are enrolled in an **elementary district** become accountable to the **high school district** (according to school code). The high school district becomes financially responsible for the student. The high school district is also responsible for the educational program of the student. The law pertains only to elementary districts that feed into separate high school districts. It does <u>not</u> pertain to unit districts.



Fifteen-Year-Old Students with Disabilities (IEP) in Elementary School Districts

- In response to questions from school district staff regarding testing accountability, ISBE is working on detailed guidance.
- Our legal team is working with both Assessments and Special Education to develop guidance that fulfills all statutory requirements, but also gives ultimately flexibility to the responsible IEP teams to determine the developmentally appropriate placement for students.
- Detailed guidance will be forthcoming.





First Year in U.S. School Status

- Students with "First Year in U.S. School" status
 will take the math, ELA, and science (if applicable
 to the grade or course) assessments.
- The scores the students receive will not be used in the calculation for district and school accountability.

- PSAT 10 (NEW, required for grade 10)
- SAT (required for grade 11)
 - NEW, some grade 12 students will be required to participate in SAT in spring 2019.

 - PSAT 8/9 grade 9
 - PSAT 10 grade 10
 - SAT grade 11 and <u>some grade 12</u>
- Fall 2018 PSAT and Spring 2019 PSAT 8/9 for 8th Grade ISBE is not reimbursing districts/schools for any Fall 2018 PSAT/NMSQT (grades 10 and 11), Fall 2018 PSAT 8/9 (grades 8 and 9), or Spring 2019 PSAT 8/9 (grade 8) tests. SAT Spring 2019

- SAT (grade 11 and <u>some grade 12</u>)
 - April 9, 2019, primary day
 - April 23, 2019, makeup day
 - April 9-23, 2019, accommodated testing window

Who must test?

- All students enrolled in SIS as grade 11 at the time of testing must test (this includes foreign exchange students and student in grade 11 again who tested in 2018).
- This includes grade 11 homeschooled students who are receiving instruction in ELA and/or math from the public school.
- NEW English Learners (ELs) identified as "First Year in U.S. School" must take all ELA sections, including the essay, in addition to math, but scores will not be included for accountability in either content area.

Exceptions:

- Some grade 11 students take DLM-AA, the alternate assessment, instead of SAT.
- Homeschooled students who are <u>not</u> receiving instruction in ELA and/or math from the public school may <u>not</u> test.



PSAT Spring 2019

- PSAT 10 (Grade 10) and PSAT 8/9 (Grade 9)
 - April 9, 10, and/or 11, 2019, primary day(s)



- April 10-23, 2019, makeup test window
- April 9-23, 2019, accommodated testing window

Who must test?

- All students enrolled in SIS as grade 10 at the time of testing must take PSAT 10 and all students enrolled in SIS as grade 9 at the time of testing must take PSAT 8/9 (this includes foreign exchange students).
- This includes grades 9 and 10 homeschooled students who are receiving instruction in ELA and/or math from the public school.
- English Learners (ELs) identified as "First Year in U.S. School" must take ELA (and math), but scores will not be included for accountability in either content area.

Exceptions:

- Some grade 9 and 10 students take DLM-AA, the alternate assessment, instead of PSAT 8/9 and PSAT 10, respectively.
- Homeschooled students who are <u>not</u> receiving instruction in ELA and/or math from the public school may <u>not</u> test.

SAT/PSAT Pre-ID

- The SAT, PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9 Pre-ID is scheduled to be available in SIS Wednesday, November 14, 2018.
- Students will take the test consistent with their grade level in SIS <u>at the time of testing</u> (i.e., grade 9=PSAT 8/9, grade 10=PSAT 10, grade 11=SAT, <u>some grade 12=SAT</u>).
- Students with an IEP may be identified to take DLM-AA instead, as appropriate.
- Home school districts should be communicating <u>now</u> with serving schools to determine the most appropriate testing location for students. Only established test centers can be identified as the "Testing School" in Pre-ID.



SAT/PSAT Established Test Centers for Spring 2019

- If your school did <u>not</u> complete the survey as requested by College Board in October and would like to be an established test center, please immediately contact <u>ilsat@collegeboard.org</u> for assistance.
- Unfortunately, schools that establish after November 7
 may not receive Pre-ID labels as part of their materials
 shipment.



SAT/PSAT Established Test Centers for Spring 2019

- Materials and Pre-ID labels will be shipped only to established test centers.
- If the RCDTS code for the location where the student is served is not an established test center, the home school may adjust the Testing School in the SAT/PSAT Pre-ID to itself and apply for "off-site" testing, which allows the home school to transport secure materials to where the student will be tested.





SAT/PSAT Off-Site Testing

- College Board will again offer "off-site" testing in order to allow schools to transport test materials to an alternate location for test administration. College Board has contacted schools with more details if you indicated the need for "off-site" testing when completing the test center establishment survey.

- Where may students test?
 - 1. Home School or Serving School, as listed in SIS
 - 2. "Testing School" as listed in the SAT/PSAT Pre-ID
 - 3. "Off-site" location, as indicated in the request sent to College Board.
- The "Testing School" in the SAT/PSAT Pre-ID will determine initial standard materials counts and Pre-ID label production and will be provided to College Board on January 25, 2018.

SAT/PSAT Details...More to Come

- Accommodations materials for SAT, PSAT 10 (grade 10), and PSAT 8/9
 (grade 9) must be requested via College Board's Services for Students
 with Disabilities (SSD) Online system and not via SIS Pre-ID by the
 school that will receive the materials.
- <u>Federal regulations</u> require that states report the number of students who
 were provided accommodations on state tests. Because all three tests,
 including PSAT 8/9, are being used for accountability, ISBE must collect
 this information.
- Requests must be entered into SSD Online by February 19, 2019.
 Schools with existing AI codes can begin entering their requests now.
 Similar to last year, there will be a late request deadline of March 4, 2019, to account for late transfers to the school and for students with newly-identified accommodations. If accommodations requests are entered into SSD Online after March 4, 2019, the school must call SSD to confirm that materials can arrive in time for testing.



- English learners (ELs) will be able to utilize EL supports for the ISBE-provided spring 2019 SAT, PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9 administration.
- Use of any EL Support will allow for collegereportable scores.
- These supports include:
 - Use of an approved word-to-word bilingual glossary
 - Use of translated test directions, and
 - Use of 50% extended time



- Use of an approved word-to-word bilingual glossary:
 - List will be expanded to approximately 100 glossaries for spring 2019.
 - Use of glossary does NOT require an approval by College Board.
 - The approved list is now available at https://www.isbe.net/Pages/SAT-PSAT.aspx



Use of translated test directions:

- Translated test directions will be available in PDF format for each assessment. Schools must print the directions for students, no printed test directions will come with test materials.
- Directions will be available in Albanian, Arabic, Bengali, Chinese (Mandarin), Gujarati, Haitian Creole, Hindi, Polish, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish, Urdu, and Vietnamese. The College Board will also support "on the fly" translations of directions by district-approved translators.
- Use of translated test directions does NOT require an approval by College Board.
- Translations will be available to print in February at https://www.isbe.net/Pages/SAT-PSAT.aspx.



Use of 50% extended time:

- Students will receive 50% extended time on each section of the SAT,
 PSAT 10, or PSAT 8/9. Students must sit for the entire time allotted and cannot go ahead in the test even if they are the only one testing.
- Although not an accommodation, EL students requiring 50% extended time will need to be identified in SSD Online.
- Schools can request 50% extended time for ELs starting in late
 January 2019. Students will be automatically approved, and no
 supporting documentation is required. More information about the
 process for entering student information will be available this winter.
- EL students using 50% extended time can be tested with other students with accommodations testing with the same timing and test materials.

- Students in grades 3 through 11 will test in ELA and math.
- Students in grades 5, 8, and 11 will <u>also</u> test in science.
- Students in grade 12 will test only if required. For details, see www.isbe.net/Documents/Grade_12_Testers_Flow_Chart_2019.pdf



DLM-AA: Pre-ID

- Students must have the IDEA Services indicator marked "Yes".
- Previous test record was DLM-AA or IAA, the student is defaulted to DLM-AA.
- All third graders are defaulted to IAR and will need to be removed from that Pre-ID to the DLM-AA.
- Students are <u>not</u> to be manually added into Educator Portal for DLM-AA.
