Student Mobility

- Please make student transfer requests in PAN, and also continue to submit new student exits and enrollments in SIS.

- ISBE assessment staff will monitor transfer requests in PAN and approve as quickly as possible.



PARCC Transfers

- The new school staff must add transferred records into sessions at their school for testing. Make sure test format is online.
- If a student has completed some but not all units, data from those completed units will be transferred automatically.

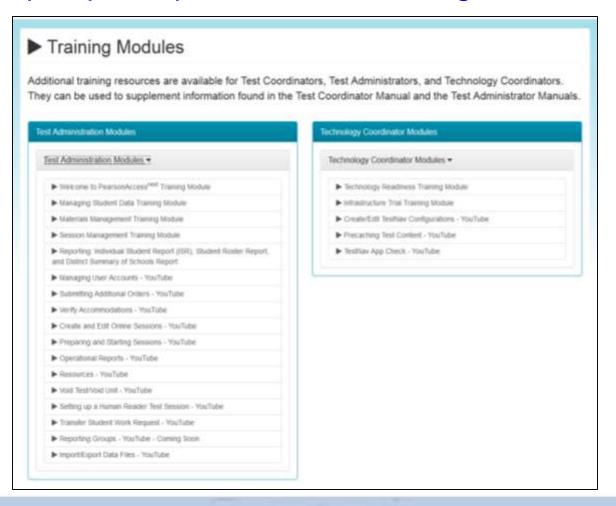
IMPORTANT:

- <u>Do not request a transfer in PAN for a new student who</u> completed <u>all</u> units of math and ELA in their previous school.
- <u>Do</u> enroll the new student in SIS. After testing, enter the reason for no valid test attempt in SIS using code 8 (Transferred in After Test Administration) to indicate both tests were completed before the student transferred to your school.

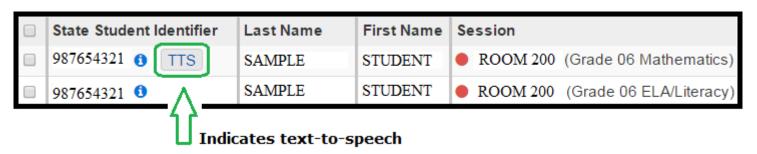
Stopping Test Sessions

- Please stop test sessions after all students (in the session) have completed testing.
- Student responses are not submitted for scoring until a test session is in "Stopped" status.
- A session cannot be stopped until all units in a session are "Completed" or "Marked Complete" status.



Incorrect Accommodations Online Assessment

 Prevent this from happening by checking the accommodation in PAN <u>before</u> beginning testing.



- Voiding a unit does NOT re-set the accommodations.
- To re-set test with correct accommodations, you must:
 (1) mark the test complete, (2) void the test, and (3) assign a new test with correct accommodations to the student.

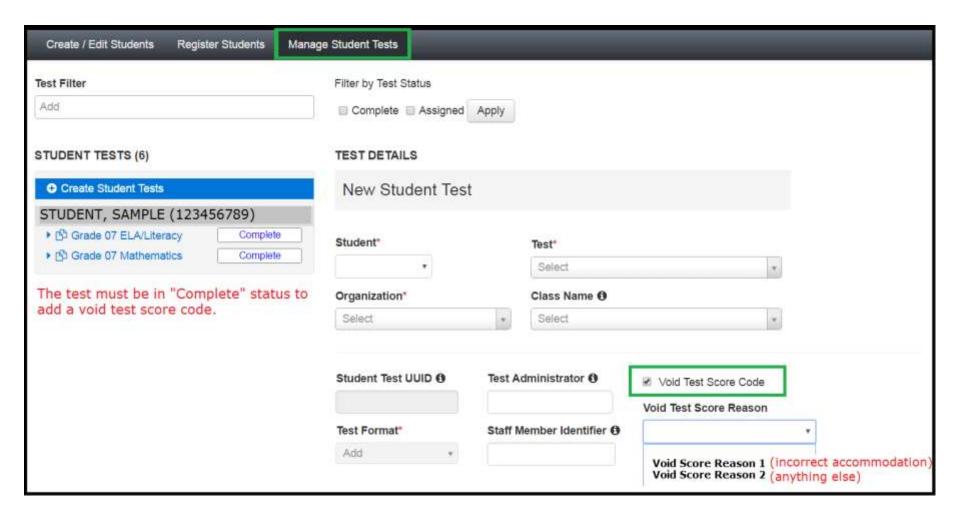


Voiding a Test

- When voiding tests, for void test score reason (in PAN):
- Enter 01 for incorrect accommodation assignment.
- Enter 02 for anything else.



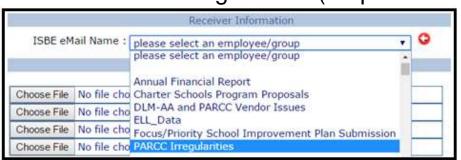

Technology Update

- Chrome OS 65 is <u>supported</u>.

 - If possible, do not upgrade until <u>after</u> testing is complete.
- Please STOP your sessions once testing is complete.
 - 44,000+ sessions still in progress (7:40 am 4/13/18)
 - Run either the "Student" report, Students Tests that have been Assigned but have not yet Completed.
 - Or run the "Online" report, Students Currently Testing Online.
 - They show any students with units not "Completed."

2018 ISA Translations

- Translation of the ISA is allowed for students either in a written copy or by a human translation at the time of testing.
- The written translation of the ISA assessment must be treated as secure material and must be disposed of in a secure manner once the assessment is completed.
- A written translation cannot be stored locally by either electronic version or in paper format.

ISA Test Security

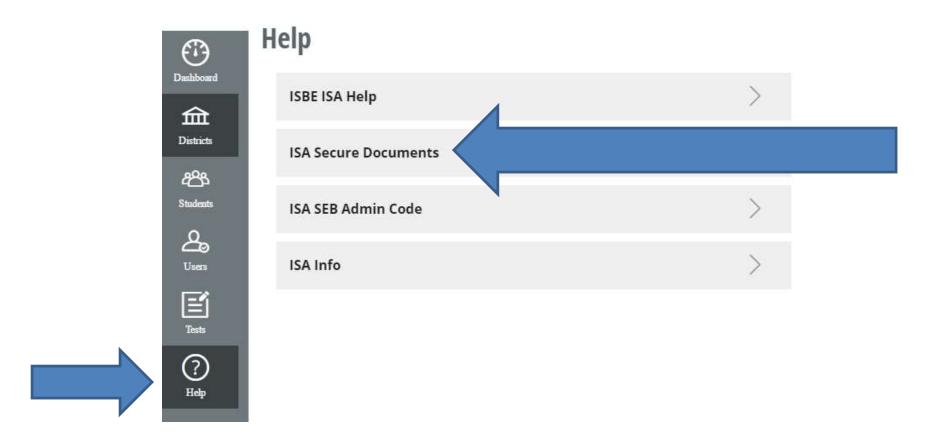
 Do not read, review, analyze, or copy in any way secure test materials (including pilot/field test materials) at any time before, during, or after test administration.

There are three exceptions:

- Reader Scripts Test administrators using a reader script as an accommodation should take some time to familiarize themselves with the format of the reader script immediately prior to the first test session.
- Language Translation Test administrators using translation as an accommodation should take some time to familiarize themselves with the format of the reader script immediately prior to the first test session.
- Copying/reproducing (for an accommodation) School staff members may reproduce secure test materials, in whole or in part, if this is necessary to provide a particular test accommodation for a student with IEPs, Section 504 Plans or EL Plans. All such copies are themselves secure materials and must be returned to the School Test Coordinator with the original test materials.
- Do not send test materials via electronic formats without expressed permission from ISBE staff.

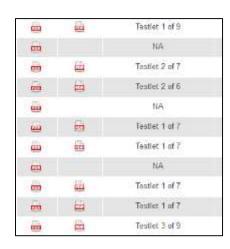

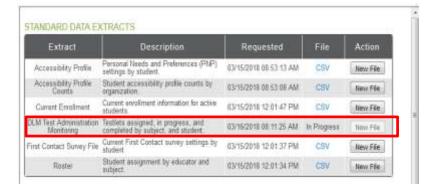

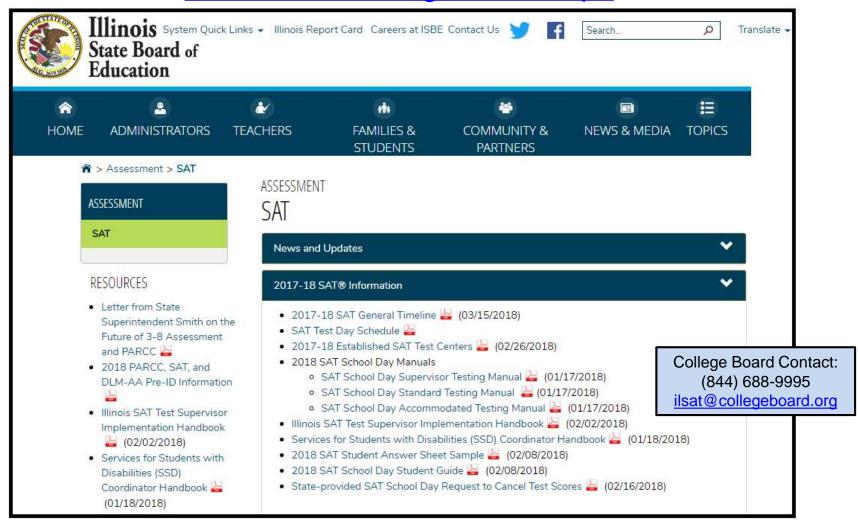

2017-18 SAT Eligibility Details

Who must test?

- All students enrolled as grade 11 at the time of testing must test.
- This includes foreign exchange students who are classified as grade 11.
- This includes students repeating grade 11 (even if tested in spring 2017).
- This includes home schooled students who take either ELA or math at the public school.

Exceptions:

- Some grade 11 students take DLM-AA, the alternate assessment, instead of SAT.
- Grade 11 students with EL status also identified as "First Year in U.S. School" must take mathematics but are exempt from ELA portions, including the essay.
- Homeschooled students who are <u>not</u> enrolled in ELA and/or math may <u>not</u> test.
- New students who are from outside an Illinois public school (e.g., out-of-state, homeschooled, parochial school) <u>enrolling with grade 12 status</u> do not test.

"First Year in U.S. School" Status

- Definition: First Year in U.S. School is an EL student who has attended schools in the United States for 12 months or less.
 - www.isbe.net/Documents/parcc-pre-id.pdf www.isbe.net/Documents/sat-pre-id.pdf www.isbe.net/Documents/dlm-aa-pre-id.pdf
- This status allows a student to be exempt from ELA testing and may be used one time only.
- Students from U.S. territories (e.g., Puerto Rico) may qualify for this status if they have attended schools in the U.S. for 12 months or less.
- Must be LEP=Yes in SIS enrollment and First Year in U.S. School=Yes in PARCC, SAT, and DLM-AA Pre-ID (or Corrections) file.
- For SAT, must order "State-Allowed Accommodations" to skip ELA sections (including essay). Students must still take math sections.

 - Students with Disabilities (Declined for College Board Accommodations)
 - For English Learners (e.g., 'First Year in U.S. School' planning to take math only)
 - Not College Reportable
 - Request Deadline Has Passed: March 05, 2018
 Note: make sure the request is in SSD Online under the
 Al code where the student will test. Transfer the request as needed.

Translated Test Directions

Directions in several languages for spring 2018 are available <u>now</u> for download from the ISBE SAT website under the '2017-18 SAT Information' accordion (<u>www.isbe.net/Pages/SAT.aspx</u>). The **thirteen** languages include Albanian, Arabic, Bengali, Chinese/Mandarin, Gujarati, Haitian Creole, Hindi, Polish, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish, Urdu, and Vietnamese. School staff may print and provide these directions to students on test day. School staff may also provide translated test directions for other languages using district/school translators. **Students using translated test directions <u>will</u> receive college-reportable scores.**

Word-for-Word Glossaries

Approved glossaries may be used by students on test day. ISBE has posted the current list on www.isbe.net/Documents/spring-2018-sat-sd-college-board-approved-glossaries.pdf. Be sure students are familiar with using the glossaries prior to test day. The approved glossaries should be distributed to students for their use on test day.

Additional languages have been added, and this document was updated 02/19/18.

Students using approved glossaries will receive college-reportable scores.

2017-18 SAT Makeup Orders

- Makeup testing day is April 24 for students who were unable to test on April 10 due to an absence or irregularity that allows makeup testing.
- The Test Supervisor received an email on April 9, 2018, with a link to the makeup survey for the purpose of placing makeup orders.
 - Makeup survey was due to College Board by Thursday, April 12.
 - Makeup materials should arrive no later than Friday, April 20.
- Keep unused answer sheets and pre-ID labels for use for makeup testing.
- Test manuals do not need to be returned, but additional manuals will accompany the makeup shipment.

2017-18 SAT "Canceling" Scores

- Grade 11 students are required to take the SAT with Essay as part of the ISBE-sponsored accountability testing.
- Any student who does <u>not</u> want their SAT scores to be included in College Board's official database of scores may, within three days of testing, complete the "State-Provided SAT® School Day Request to Cancel Test Scores" form that is shipped to schools with test materials.
- The "State-Provided SAT® School Day Request to Cancel Test Scores" form will also prevent a score from being reported to the student and any college or university. Once canceled, scores may not be reinstated.
- ISBE will receive the student's score for accountability reporting purposes.

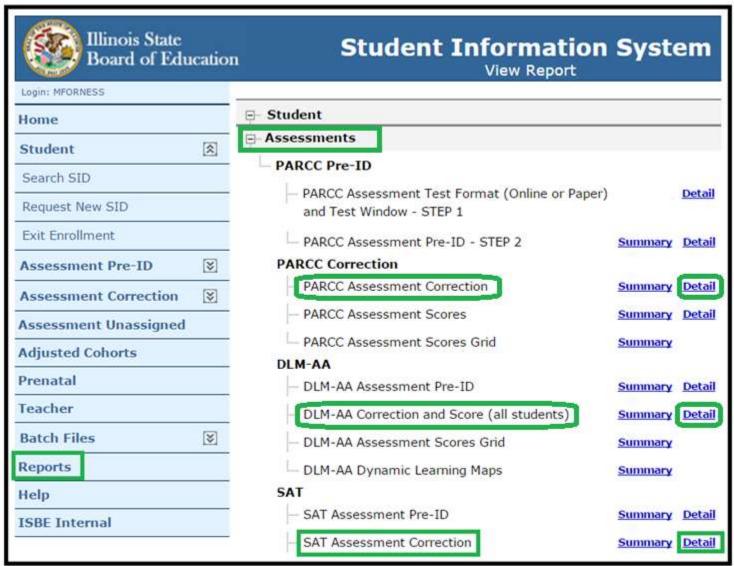


SAT Assessment Correction in SIS

- Any student who tests must be included on the SAT
 Assessment Correction report in SIS so their scores will
 "have a place to land" when they arrive in July.
- In order to be included on the SAT Assessment Correction report in SIS, a student must have a "grade 11" SIS enrollment on April 10, 2018.
- Districts may adjust grade levels as needed in SIS so students are included.
