WHEREAS, science education in Illinois emphasizes an engaged, hands-on learning experience, in which teachers facilitate student-led inquiry, discussion, research, and experiments; and,

WHEREAS, the Illinois State Board of Education believes a high-quality science education equips students with the knowledge and skills – such as communication, collaboration, inquiry, and flexibility – that are necessary for all careers; and,


WHEREAS, ensuring all students have access to a high-quality science education is crucial to developing the innovative thinkers Illinois needs to lead the country and the world; and,
