#### A note concerning recognition:

The recognition status assigned to the school is a result of the school's compliance with relevant statutes, regulations, and rules as evidenced in part by the on-site review of the institution recorded in this document. When a school is recognized pending further review, the chief administrator may, within 30 days after receipt of notification to this effect, request a conference at which representatives of the school will have an opportunity to discuss compliance issues with representatives of the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE).
- Probationary Recognition The school shall be placed on probation if it
  - A Exhibits deficiencies that present a health hazard or danger to students or staff;
  - B. Fails to offer required coursework;
  - C. Employs personnel who lack the required qualifications;
  - D. Fails or refuses to serve students according to relevant legal requirements; or,
  - E. Prolongs or repeats instances of noncompliance to a degree that indicates an intention not to comply with relevant requirements.

When a school is placed on probation, the State Superintendent shall schedule a conference at which representatives of the school will discuss compliance issues with representatives of ISBE, unless the chief administrator has appealed the school's status as provided in 23 III. Admin. Code 425.50. Within 60 days following this conference, the school's chief administrator shall submit to the State Superintendent a plan for corrective action that conforms to the requirements of 23 III. Admin. Code 425.50(f).

**Non-recognition** – The team found the school to be greatly out of compliance such that remediation will require considerable time and effort or the school has been in probationary recognition yet failed to address deficiencies noted and to implement successfully a plan of remediation approved by the State Superintendent of Education as described in 23 III. Admin. Code 425.50.

**Appeals** – A chief school administrator who wishes to appeal a school's placement on probation or non-recognition shall submit to the State Superintendent of Education a written statement of appeal within 14 days after receiving notification of the recommended status in accord with 23 III. Admin. Code 425.70:

A. Within 30 days after receipt of the appeal, the State Superintendent or a designee shall convene a hearing to review all pertinent information, including the procedures that led to the recommended recognition status. Representatives of the affected school shall have an opportunity to present evidence demonstrating that the school complies with the requirements of the 23 III. Admin. Code Part 425.

No later than 30 days after the conclusion of the hearing, the State Superintendent shall inform the chief school administrator of the school's recognition status. The decision of the State Superintendent of Education shall be a final administrative decision, subject to the Administrative Review Law [735 ILCS 5/Art. III].
