

  - Next meeting Aug 14 from 1-3 (WebEx)




# BURDEN OF FIREARM-RELATED DEATHS








# OVERVIEW OF EFFORTS TO LIMIT ACCESS TO LETHAL MEANS



#### Recent legislation - 1

- <u>Firearm Restraining Order Act Public Awareness</u> (PA 102-0345)
  - Promote awareness of firearms restraining orders (FRO) to the general public
    - Disseminate information of the options people have to seek assistance using a FRO and the process in which to file one
    - Production of materials that can be given to health care workers that assist in identifying people who may benefit from awareness of the FRO Act
    - Specific information on situations in which a FRO may be appropriate such as with situations of domestic violence, mental health crisis, or anyone who is at risk of injuring themselves or others
  - Led by IDPH Communications Staff in collaboration with IDPH VIPS staff

### Firearms Restraining Order

- What is a FRO?
  - A FRO is a tool to buy time when it matters most and empowers law enforcement and families to prevent gun violence and firearm related suicide.
  - Provides a formal legal process to ask a civil court to issue a FRO to temporarily limit an individual's access to firearms, ammunition, and firearm parts when that person poses a significant danger to themselves or others.
- When is a FRO needed?
  - In heightened moments, removing access to firearms to those at risk of harming themselves and others provide a time to pause.



### Firearms Restraining Order

- Who can petition for a FRO?
  - A family or household member or law enforcement can ask, or "petition," an Illinois circuit court for an order to temporarily limit firearm access for a "respondent," the individual who poses a danger of injury.
- How long does a FRO last?
  - There are two types of FROs:
    - an emergency FRO that immediately addresses a crisis and lasts up to 14 days,
    - and a plenary FRO that provides longer protection but only after there has been a full court hearing.

## Recent legislation - 2

- <u>Safe Gun Storage Public Awareness Campaign</u> (PA 102-1067)
  - comprehensive 2-year statewide safe gun storage public awareness campaign
  - The campaign is divided into the following 3 phases:
    - Statewide messaging (Lead by IDPH Communications in collaboration with IDPH VIPS)
      - Build upon the FRO Awareness campaign
    - A gun lock and gun safe distribution campaign and gun buy-back program
      - Partnership with the VA to distribute cable gun locks (request form; state fair)
    - A comprehensive evaluation



### Safe Storage Resources

- Families/Communities
  - Gun Safety Campaign Toolkit (American Academy of Pediatrics)
     includes materials on "Ask About Guns" before sending your child over for playdates, Firearm Safety for Families
  - Everytown for Gun Safety, who created <u>Be SMART</u> campaign to promote responsible gun ownership in order to reduce child gun deaths. SMART stands for Secure, Model, Ask, Recognize, Tell.
    - Under <u>Be SMART Resources</u> there are handouts on safe storage practices and types of safe storage. For instance, Asking About Secure Gun Storage, Guide to Secure Gun Storage Devices, Talking to Your Children About Guns, Keeping Your Home Safe with Secure Storage, etc.

#### Suicide Prevention

- Illinois Suicide Prevention Strategic Plan 2020
  - Goal 6: Reduce access to lethal means of suicide.
- Youth Suicide Prevention Early Intervention (SAMHSA)
  - Screening programs, post-suicide information; resources after an attempt; trainings for child welfare, juvenile justice, and higher education; address reduction of access to lethal means; input from those with lived experience and American Indian health services.
    - Depressions screening NOFO screen for a gun in the home
- Comprehensive Suicide Prevention (CDC)
  - Reduce access to lethal means among people at risk

  - multidisciplinary programs that identify patients at risk of repeat violent injury and link them with hospital- and communitybased resources aimed at addressing underlying risk factors for violence
- Data
