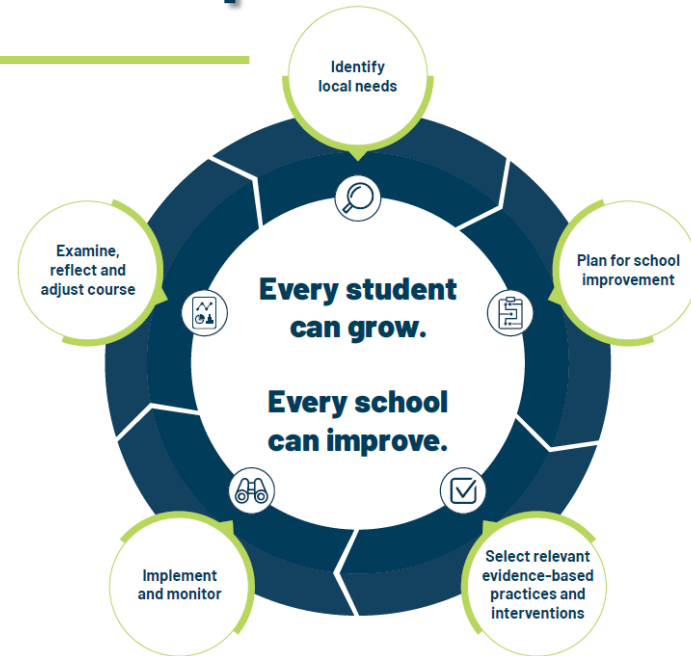

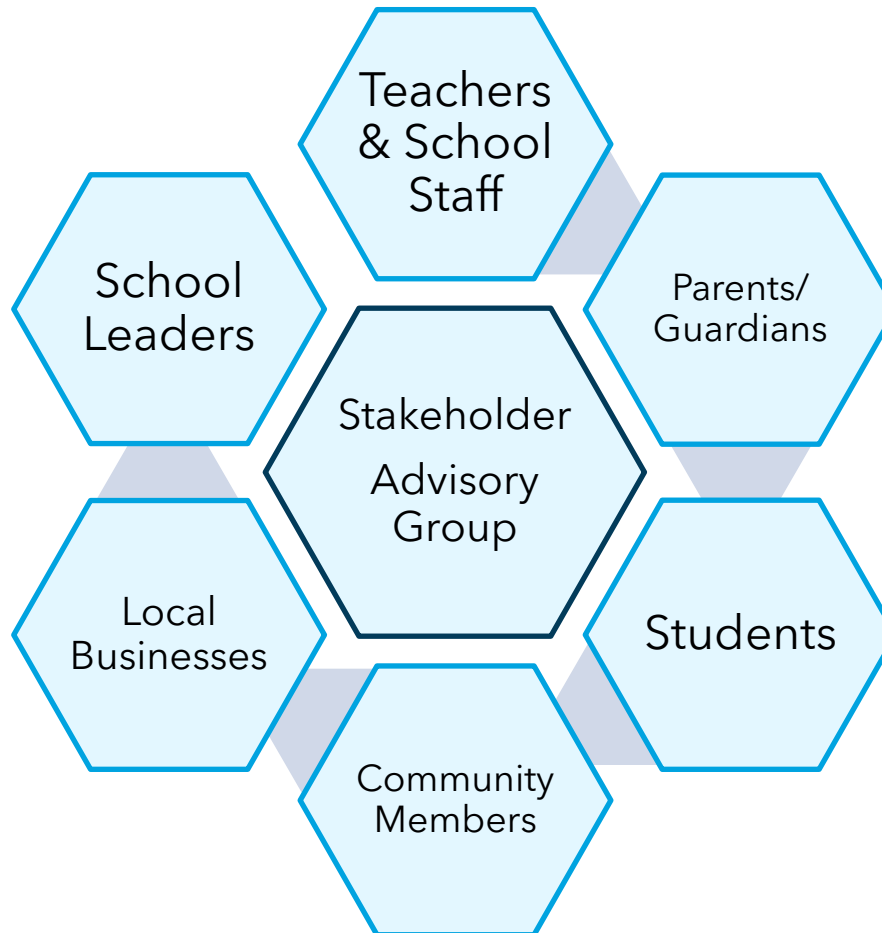

What is the purpose of the Stakeholder Advisory Group?

Engages the community to build understanding about the needs and the improvement processes of the school.



Provides an avenue for varied perspectives and concerns impacting the school and community.



Acts in an advisory capacity



How often should the Stakeholder Advisory Group meet?



Frequency may vary

At least yearly



How do the Stakeholder Advisory Group and the School Leadership Team differ?

Stakeholder Advisory Group (SAG)

- Diverse membership includes students, community members, local business partners, parents, teachers, and school leaders.
- Gathers varied perspectives and concerns impacting school community.
- Acts in an advisory capacity regarding SIP.
- Frequency of meetings may vary based on schools and community.
- Purpose is to engage the community in an understanding of the needs and improvement processes of the school and district.

School Leadership Team (SLT)

- Membership includes teachers, teacher leaders, school specialists, and school leaders.
- Develops, implements, evaluates, approves, and monitors the School Improvement Plan.
- Meets monthly or bimonthly.
- Purpose is to engage the school-level community in the development and oversight of the School Improvement Plan and champion the work of school improvement.
