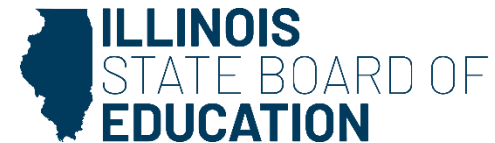

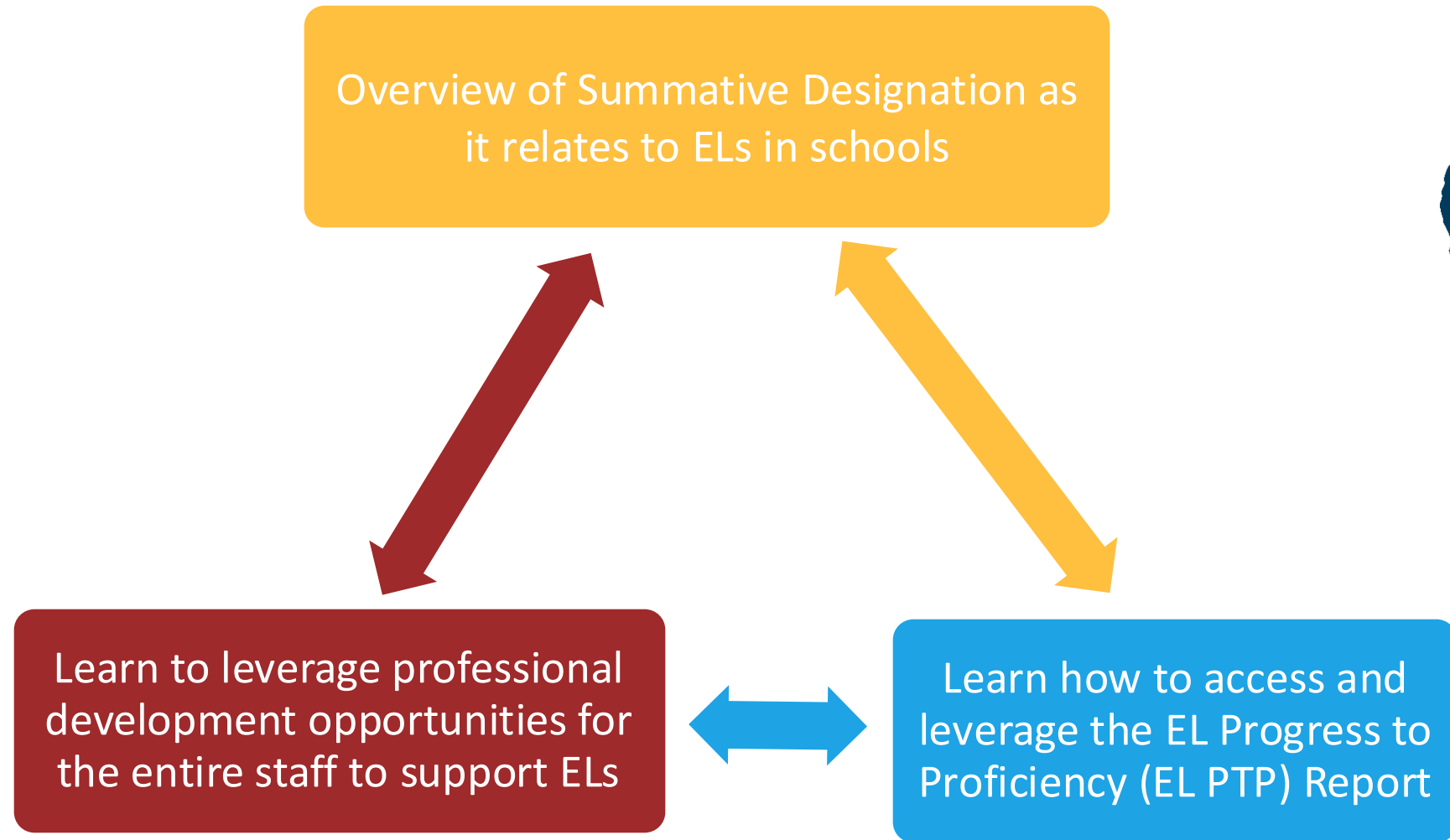

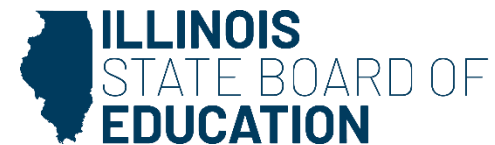
Understanding the Summative Designation

- SIP Goal: Increasing MAP/STAR/ACT reading scores for all students.....
 - Example Key Activity support EL students: Increasing EL supports during literacy instructional blocks.
 - Planning with English Language Development standards (part of the ISBE Literacy Plan)
 - Consider staff utilization to maximize support
 - Increasing teacher awareness/knowledge around EL scaffolded supports (using ISBE PD)

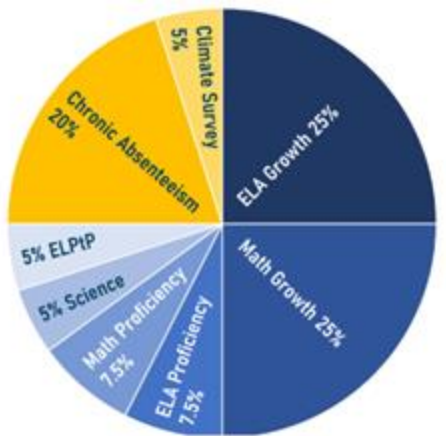

Summative Designation Rundown

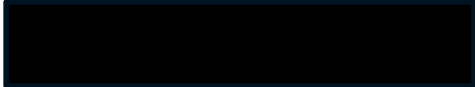
- Summative Designation Report
 - What do blank spaces mean? (<20 in student group)
 - 20 student threshold for summative designation
 - but all student groups are still part of the “All Students” count.
 - and all students groups are included in the Proficiency Scores Report.
 - Consider sub-groupings in each column
 - Ex: Climate Survey, Chronic Absenteeism, etc.

Current EL	Former EL	Never EL	Former EL, Pre-K only
Students who are currently identified and placed as an English learner (EL). Included in accountability for ELs.	Students who were EL, but who reclassified with an ACCESS score meeting state requirements in the past. Included in accountability for ELs	Students who have never been identified as an EL.	Students who were identified as ELs in pre-K programs only. Reclassified upon entry into kindergarten. For accountability, they are "Never EL".

Resources & Activities

Pitfalls/Misunderstandings

- Understand which students met and which did not
 - Value of being close, and what close means
- Understanding Growth over Meeting and who counts in your metric
- Skipping to step 5 by hiring a new interventionist/changing programs—without looking for a root cause

Value Coaching and your Team

- Help them identify trends in data, understand the story behind it and solve for it
- Know your Resources: Illinois Resource Center (IRC) & WIDA
- Looking ahead at numbers of ML students that are coming

Tool #3

Success for English Learners in ALL Subjects

Leveraging PD for entire staff

- All staff who work with ELs are required to complete 2 PDs annually related to ELs.
- These do not have to be just an overview.
- Free Targeted PD available
- WIDA and the IRC provide free PD for content specific supports
- Suggestions for ELA and/or Math PD with focus on growth.
 - Building strategies for ELs to engage with ELA and Math curriculum.
 - Strategies for engaging ELs in general education class.
 - Strategies to decipher between language proficiency and content knowledge.

Integrated Supports

- ELs are entitled to linguistic support in all classes.
- How does your school/district accomplish this
 - Are content teachers using ELD standards in preparing lessons?
 - Are language objectives and supports integrated in all classes?
 - Is it the sole responsibility of your ESL/Bilingual teachers to provide support?
 - Do your base curriculum and materials support language learning and multilingual students?
 - If native language instruction is required (TBE programming) does this curricula meet the same standards and level of quality as other curriculum?

Tool #4

Leveraging funding to support ELs schoolwide

Items to consider....

Title I, Part A, Section 1003 School Improvement grant funding does NOT have to be spent on particular student groups/sub-groups.

“But, I'm targeted for EL, so do I have to spend my grant money on EL students and EL staff support? NO.

Building adult capacity is paramount to increasing student achievement for all students.

A quality Standards Aligned Tier I Curriculum (Implemented with fidelity) has the greatest effect on the most vulnerable student populations.

1003 School Improvement Funding Opportunities

Function/Object	Allowable Purchase
1000-400	Multilingual core curriculum materials (ELA, math, science, social studies) for student use that are aligned to Illinois Learning Standards
1000-300	Technology software subscription (translation software)
1000-400	Technology hardware for student use (e.g., laptop, tablets, translation equipment)
2210-400	• Professional learning materials specific to SIP work or working with newcomers (e.g., books for book studies and training manuals) • Technology hardware for staff use (e.g., document camera, translation hardware/ software, laptops, tablets)
2210-300	Subscriptions to on-demand professional learning (e.g., Rosetta Stone, PD-360)
3000-100/200	Salary/Benefits for qualified staff (bilingual parent liaison, community outreach coordinator, etc.) to plan, develop, and implement family engagement programs.
3000-400	Supplies and materials related to family engagement programs (e.g., books, take-home math and literacy activities for multilingual learners)

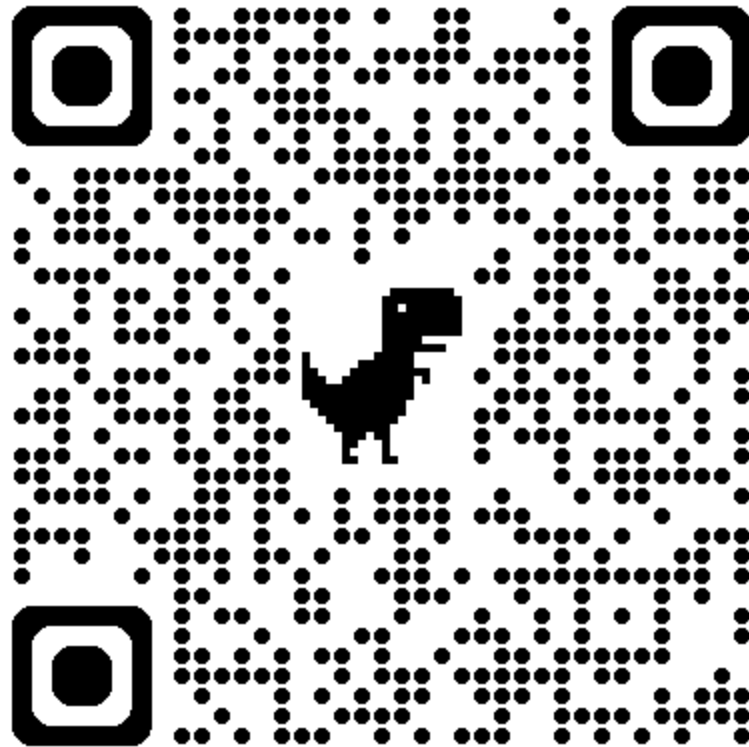
