Reflecting on the previous Week (February 11th-15th):

This week we introduced some new assisted devices, i.e., glasses, hearing aids, walkers, wheelchairs, and crutches. During group time, Jen showed the children each device and then asked them if they knew anyone that used them. Several of the children quickly identified the glasses and stated that Hen & Sarah both wear glasses and our friend M does too. During small groups this week we did some experimenting and a lot of hands on activities. Monday, we did two groups, one group made playdough with Jen and the other made moon sand with Sarah. Tuesday, we did an experiment with baking soda and vinegar. The children were able to make a hypothesis, some children thought it would bubble up and some thought that it would just change colors. We added liquid watercolor to the vinegar. We have been trying to enhance our story times by doing more interactive activities. B was talking about fishing and pretending to fish in the block area.

Individual Child Planning:

Using B's interest of fishing to support peer relationships and recognize feelings and perspective in dramatic play (changed to camping based on child's interest)

Support C's language development and peer interaction with sensory exploration (small group Monday making slime and small group Friday making playdough)

M has shown an interest in our Science Area and our classroom fish. He is taking great initiative in caring for our fish when he is the "Pet Helper". We will add realistic fish puzzles to the science area to support him in respecting materials.

D melts down during transitions. Continue to use our "Countdown to five" visual during transitions to support self-regulation and read Social-Emotional story before rest time.

Use K's interest in "cause and effect" toys to support wonder and curiosity and engagement with peers during choice time.

To Do List:

Update labels in our Dramatic Play Area.

Create naptime books on audio CD for non-sleeping children.

Create more "group time" social stories.

Place artwork in individual child folders.

Update more notes in TSG. Continue taking pictures for documentation during choice time as well as small groups for TSG.

Update our "word Wall" and Kindness Tree signs using Cricket.
