Overview

- The College and Career Ready Indicator (CCRI) should serve as one part of a comprehensive approach to identifying next steps for a student in terms of identifying interests and experiences upon which a student can build.
- CCRI is composed of multiple points of data. Many data points are currently collected, while others will require additional collection efforts by districts.
- Data Points are mandatory for collection in the 2020-2021 school year.
- Only students in grades 9 12 will be able to enter a CCRI record.

- 1. GPA: 3.75/4.0
- 95% attendance junior and senior year
- 3. ACT Composite Score: 30 or SAT Composite Score: 1400
- One academic indicator in ELA and Math
- 5. Three career ready indicators

College and Career Ready

- 1. GPA: 2.8/4.0
- 2. 95% attendance junior and senior year
- 3. EITHER
 - a) College and Career Pathway Endorsement; **OR**
 - b) All of the following:
 - i. One academic indicator in ELA and Math
 - ii. Career area of interest
 - iii. Three career ready indicators



General Readiness Indicators

Grade Point Average

- Districts will continue to determine their own system for calculating GPA and the equivalent.
- Will be gathered on each student at the end of their senior year and will represent a cumulative GPA.
- The district will collect and compile the initial data prior to submitting aggregate data (3.75 or Above, 2.8 3.74, Below 2.8, and None) to ISBE through the CCRI Report in SIS.

95% Attendance Junior and Senior Years

 ISBE uses attendance data currently entered into SIS by districts to calculate an average of attendance junior and senior years for each student.



General Readiness Indicators

- Identify a career area of interest by the end of the sophomore year
 - The identification of a career area of interest by a student will be determined by school districts within a range of career exploration activities, such as those suggested in the <u>Postsecondary and Career Expectations (PaCE)</u> framework.
 - Students who were sophomores in spring of 2020 have until the end of 2020 to identify a career area of interest.
 - The district will collect and compile the initial data prior to submitting aggregate "yes" or "no" data to ISBE through the CCRI Report in SIS.




General Readiness Indicators

College and Career Pathway Endorsement

- Students earn endorsements by completing an individualized learning plan, a career-focused instructional sequence, academic readiness and professional learning opportunities.
- Students earning a <u>College and Career Pathway Endorsement</u>
 will not need to fulfill the criteria of the ELA and Math Academic
 Indicators, career area of interest by the end of the sophomore
 year, and three career ready indicators.
- After completion and approval of the application to ISBE, districts will provide ISBE the list of students that have been awarded a pathway endorsement. The names of students will then be shared with the SIS team.

College and Career Pathway Endorsement



INDIVIDUAL PLAN Each student completing an endorsement must have an individualized plan, which includes college planning linked to early understanding of career goals, financial aid, resume, and personal statement. Academic Indicators

- **AP Exam** (Official score of 3, 4, or 5 as reported by the College Board to ISBE or to the district)
- AP Course (Acceptable values are A+, A, A-, B+, B, B-, C+, C, C-, Exceeds Standards, and Meets Standards as reported in SIS)
- Dual Credit Course (Acceptable values are A+, A, A-, B+, B, B-, C+, C, C-, Exceeds Standards, and Meets Standards as reported in SIS)
- International Baccalaureate (IB) Course (Acceptable values are A+, A, A-, B+, B, B-, C+, C, C-, Exceeds Standards, and Meets Standards as reported in SIS)
- **IB Exam** (Official score of 4, 5, 6, or 7 as reported by the IB to the student, school, or district and reported in the CCRI Report in SIS)



Academic Indicators

- Transitional Math and English (Acceptable values are A+, A, A-, B+, B, B-, C+, C, C-, Exceeds Standards, and Meets Standards as reported in SIS)
 - Additional information can may be found on the <u>College and Career</u> <u>Academics</u> webpage and <u>the ISBE Transitional Math</u> webpage.
 - Districts may want to pursue partnerships with their local community college to explore options for early college opportunities.
- Algebra II (Acceptable values are A+, A, A-, B+, B, B-, C+, C, C-, Exceeds Standards, and Meets Standards as reported in SIS)
 - Courses designated Integrated Math II or High School Math III signify that student has completed the equivalent of Algebra II, thus fulfilling this indicator.

Academic Indicators

- Minimum ACT score (Official score as reported to the student, school, or district as reported in the CCRI Report in SIS)
 - English 18 and Reading 22; Math 22 plus math course in senior year
- Minimum SAT score
 - Official score as reported by the College Board either to ISBE as part of the state required SAT administration in grade 11, or as reported to the student, school, or district from an optional national administration day as reported in the CCRI Report in SIS.
 - Evidence Based Reading and Writing 540; Math 540 plus math course in senior year
 - Due to the suspension of grade 11 state required spring testing for FY 20, ISBE will use data from fall 2020 SAT School Day administration for FY21 as applicable to fulfill this indicator.



- Career Development Experience during high school career
 - One component of the Pathway Endorsement
 - Occurs in a workplace or under other authentic working conditions;
 - Is co-developed by an education provider and at least one employer in the relevant field;
 - Provides compensation or educational credit to the participant;
 - Reinforces foundational professional skills;
 - Includes a <u>Professional Skills Assessment</u>; and
 - Takes place for a minimum of 60 total hours.
 - Students whose experience was interrupted in March, April, or May of 2020 by COVID-19 related school and/or business closures or layoffs may receive credit on this indicator for the interrupted experience.
 - The district will collect and compile the initial data prior to submitting aggregate "yes" or "no" data to ISBE through the CCRI Report in SIS.



- Industry Credential at any point in time before graduation
 - Work-related credential, certification, or license.
 - A student must, depending upon the requirements of the recognized industry credential, either receive the license or be eligible to receive a license pending the receipt of a high school diploma.
 - The district will collect and compile the initial data prior to submitting a code which identifies the credential Endorsement area;
 - 01 Agriculture, Food, and Natural Resources
 - 02 Arts and Communications
 - 03 Finance and Business Services
 - 04 Human and Public Services
 - 05 Information Technology
 - 06 Manufacturing, Engineering, Technology and Trades
 - 07 Health and Sciences Technology



- Military Service or an ASVAB Score of 31 or Higher during high school career
 - Achieve an ASVAB score of 31 or higher
 - Students whose experience was interrupted after March 2020 by COVID-19 related school and/or business closures or layoffs may receive credit on this indicator for the interrupted experience.
 - The district will collect and compile the initial data prior to submitting aggregate "yes" or "no" data to ISBE through the CCRI Report in SIS.

Dual Credit Career Pathway Course

- A dual credit course, or a dual credit course in Career and Technical Education (CTE), or included within a careerfocused instructional sequence for the Pathway Endorsement program.
- A course that is used to fulfill an ELA or Math dual credit academic indicator cannot also be used to fulfill this Dual Credit Career Pathway Course indicator.
- This information is currently captured in the student course assignment record in SIS, which is entered annually by the district.

- Completion of a Program of Study before graduation
 - Completion of coursework that is necessary to qualify a student as a CTE Concentrator.
 - A student served by an eligible recipient who has completed at least 2 courses in a single career and technical education program or program of study.
 - This information is currently captured in the student course assignment record in SIS, which is entered annually by the district.

- Attaining and maintaining consistent employment for a minimum of 12 months during high school
 - Verified employment of a continuous nature during a 12month period.
 - Part-time employment may be verified through pay stubs, timesheets, or a signed letter from an adult supervisor.
 - Students may also self-report the information provided they supply the supervisor(s) name and contact information, date(s) of employment, and number of hours worked
 - The district will collect and compile the initial data prior to submitting aggregate "yes" or "no" data to ISBE through the CCRI Report in SIS.



- Consecutive summer employment during high school career
 - Verified employment for two consecutive summers.
 - Employment may be verified through pay stubs, timesheets, or a signed letter from an adult supervisor.
 - Students may also self-report the information provided they supply the supervisor(s) name and contact information, date(s) of employment, and number of hours worked
 - The district will collect and compile the initial data prior to submitting aggregate "yes" or "no" data to ISBE through the CCRI Report in SIS.



- 25 hours of community service during high school career
 - Volunteer service or activity performed by students to address a social issue in the community.
 - Student should receive written verification by an adult, nonrelative supervisor of the community service that both describes the services performed and documents the number of hours served.
 - Service learning opportunities may count towards this career ready indicator as well as school or classroom related community service projects.
 - The district will collect and compile the initial data prior to submitting aggregate "yes" or "no" data to ISBE through the CCRI Report in SIS.




- Two or more organized co-curricular or extracurricular activities during high school career
 - Activities, programs, and applied learning experiences that:
 - Are connected to or mirror the academic curriculum, but for which students do not receive academic credit;
 - Take place outside of school or after regular school hours and may be operated by outside organizations; and
 - Instill adaptive competencies and/or skills, including personal ethic, work ethic, teamwork, and communication.
 - Multiple years of the same activity do not represent different activities –
 e.g., multiple years of the same sport, multiples years on student council.
 - Students whose experience was interrupted after March 2020 by COVID-19 related school and/or business closures or layoffs may receive credit on this indicator for the interrupted experience.
 - The district will collect and compile the initial data prior to submitting aggregate "yes" or "no" data to ISBE through the CCRI Report in SIS.



- Only the most recent Home, Serving, or Service Provider RCDT can add or edit a CCRI Record.
- When an indicator is marked as "yes", the response will not change upon further uploads when leaving the column blank.






