This waiver will be available to any school food authority in good standing electing to participate in the Community Eligibility Program (CEP) in Illinois.

4. Description of the challenge the State agency is seeking to solve, the goal of the waiver to improve services under the Program, and the expected outcomes if the waiver is granted. [Section 12(l)(2)(A)(iii) and 12(l)(2)(A)(iv) of the NSLA]:

Illinois recently passed a legislation to create the Healthy School Meals for All program, pending appropriation. Schools that want to participate in this new state program must maximize CEP participation. An extension of the deadline to elect CEP participation will allow schools and ISBE the additional time needed to onboard new CEP participants for school year 2023-24.
