Checklist for Getting Started

Now that your school has received a comprehensive designation, your school is required to begin a four-year improvement cycle. During these four years, you will focus on building and/or modifying the systems needed to improve student achievement and performance outcomes and to exit status. Below are the first steps you should take to begin your school improvement work.

- Be responsive to communication from your assigned School Improvement Coordinator. Review your calendar and be prepared for an initial 60–90-minute meeting.
