Student Eligibility

Student Eligibility

ISBE-provided administrations

- All public-school students, whether served by their home school or outplaced to a serving school, are required to participate in state assessments based on their grade level in ISBE's Student Information System (SIS) at the time of testing, unless they will take the state's alternate assessment, DLM-AA, instead. This includes foreign exchange students and English learners.
- Students enrolled in SIS in grades 9, 10, and 11 will be rostered automatically for the PSAT 8/9, PSAT 10, and SAT with Essay, respectively.
- All public-school students enrolled in grade 12 who have not previously participated in an ISBE-provided administration of the SAT with Essay and are not exempt will also be rostered to test. More details are available in this [flowchart](#).

Student Eligibility

Invest in Kids Act (IICA) administrations

- All students in grades 9, 10, and 11 who receive a scholarship through the IICA scholarship program are required to participate in PSAT 8/9, PSAT 10, and SAT with Essay, respectively.
- IICA schools are allowed to include non-scholarship recipients in spring 2024 testing.
- For spring 2024 testing, only the **SAT with Essay** is available to schools with grade 11 scholarship recipients.
- All questions regarding student eligibility should be directed to ISBE by calling 866-317-6034 or writing to assessment@isbe.net. Do not include any secure student information if sending an email inquiry.

- Schools may test students on any weekday(s) during the six-week testing window.
- Any student who is absent on the primary test date selected by the school will be afforded at least one opportunity to test on a subsequent day(s) during the testing window, as feasible with scheduling and staffing.
- Schools can test in the morning and/or in the afternoon and run multiple testing sessions in one day.
- Paper testing will be available only on a very limited basis (e.g., students with specific accommodations needs).

Student Registration (Pre-ID)

Student Registration – ISBE-Provided Administrations

- Students will be rostered automatically in ISBE's Student Information System (SIS), based on their grade level and DLM-AA indicator. ISBE will transmit these data to College Board to register students at the end of January 2024.
- Refer to the *Student Eligibility, ISBE-provided administrations* slide in this presentation to review these details.
- It is critically important that schools keep SIS enrollments accurate and up-to-date at all times.
- There will be a process to move registrations for students who move to new schools after January 2024. Details are forthcoming.

Student Registration – IKA Administrations

- For SAT with Essay, IKA schools **DO NOT USE** the SAT Suite Ordering and Registration (SSOR) system for spring 2024.
 - Staff from IKA schools must upload a list of students who will take the SAT with Essay to the password-protected Excel spreadsheet that will be sent by Rob Potempa the 1st week of November 2023.
 - For IKA schools that are testing the entire cohort of grade 11 students and/or any grade 12 students, please include all students your school plans to test to this roster, in addition to your grade 11 IKA scholars. Please make sure to identify the IKA students on the roster spreadsheet.
 - Student rosters for SAT with Essay are due to Rob Potempa no later than December 21, 2023.
- For PSAT 10 and PSAT 8/9, IKA schools **MUST USE** the SAT Suite Ordering and Registration (SSOR) system for spring 2024. Include all IKA scholars in grades 9 and 10 and any additional students you plan to test in those grade levels. More information to come in the January in-person implementation workshops.

Test Coordinator (TC)	Responsible for coordinating all aspects of test administration at the school.	Yes – via the establishment form.
Backup Test Coordinator	Responsible for coordinating all aspects of test administration in the event the primary TC cannot fulfill their duties.	Yes – via the establishment form.
SSD Coordinator	Responsible for requesting accommodations via SSD Online and working with the TC to coordinate testing for students with disabilities and English Learner (EL) supports.	Yes – via the establishment form. Technology Coordinator	Responsible for managing all technical aspects of delivering the digital SAT Suite.	Yes – via the establishment form.

Test Day Staff Selection



Please note that while many requirements remain the same as in previous years, there are some key differences for the digital SAT Suite.

Test Coordinator Role

- Staff members are prohibited from serving as test coordinators for the same test their child or member of their household is scheduled to take under the same established test site. For example, they can be the PSAT 10 test coordinator but not the PSAT 8/9 test coordinator if their child or member of their household is taking the PSAT 8/9 at the same established test site.

Proctor Role

- A proctor is not allowed to oversee their child or member of their household during a test. However, they can serve as a proctor in the same established test site, for the same test, so long as their child or member of their household is testing in a separate room.

Technology Monitor

- A technology monitor whose child or member of their household is testing in the same established test site is ineligible to assume that role.

Restrictions on Paid SAT Suite Preparation

- Staff members are not permitted to engage in any paid, private SAT Suite-related assessment preparation. Please note that this excludes teaching course content and providing test familiarization as part of the regular school curriculum.

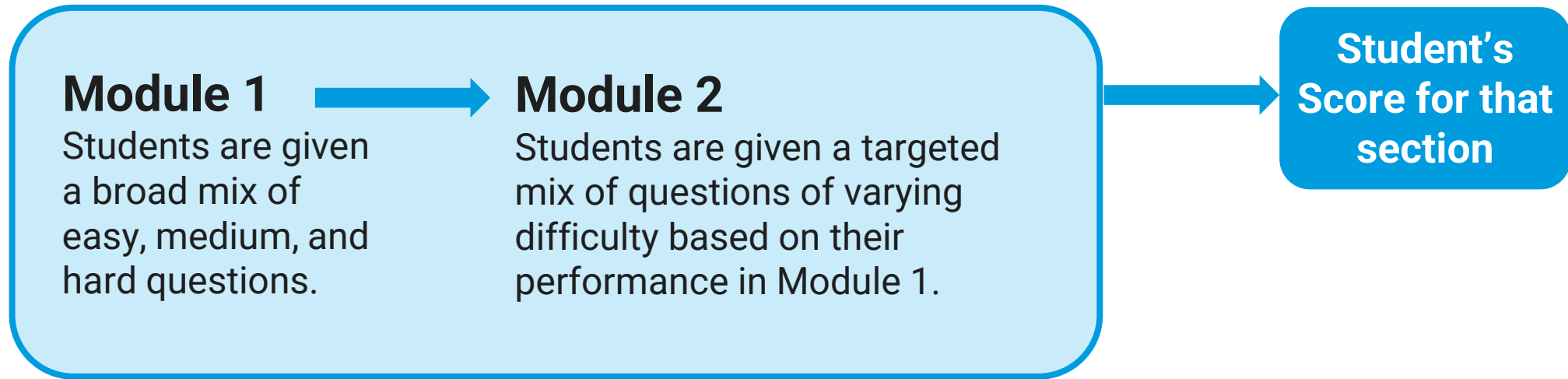

- The Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) requires SAT with Essay for all grade 11 Illinois public-school students (including those served at nonpublic facilities) and for some grade 12 public school students who have not tested previously or been identified as being exempt.
- Grade 11 students who receive scholarships through the IKA program are required to take the SAT with Essay.
- The essay section is 50 minutes for students using standard time.
- A computer keyboard is required for the essay portion of the SAT.
 - *Note: Tablet users will also be permitted to use a keyboard for the entire test.*

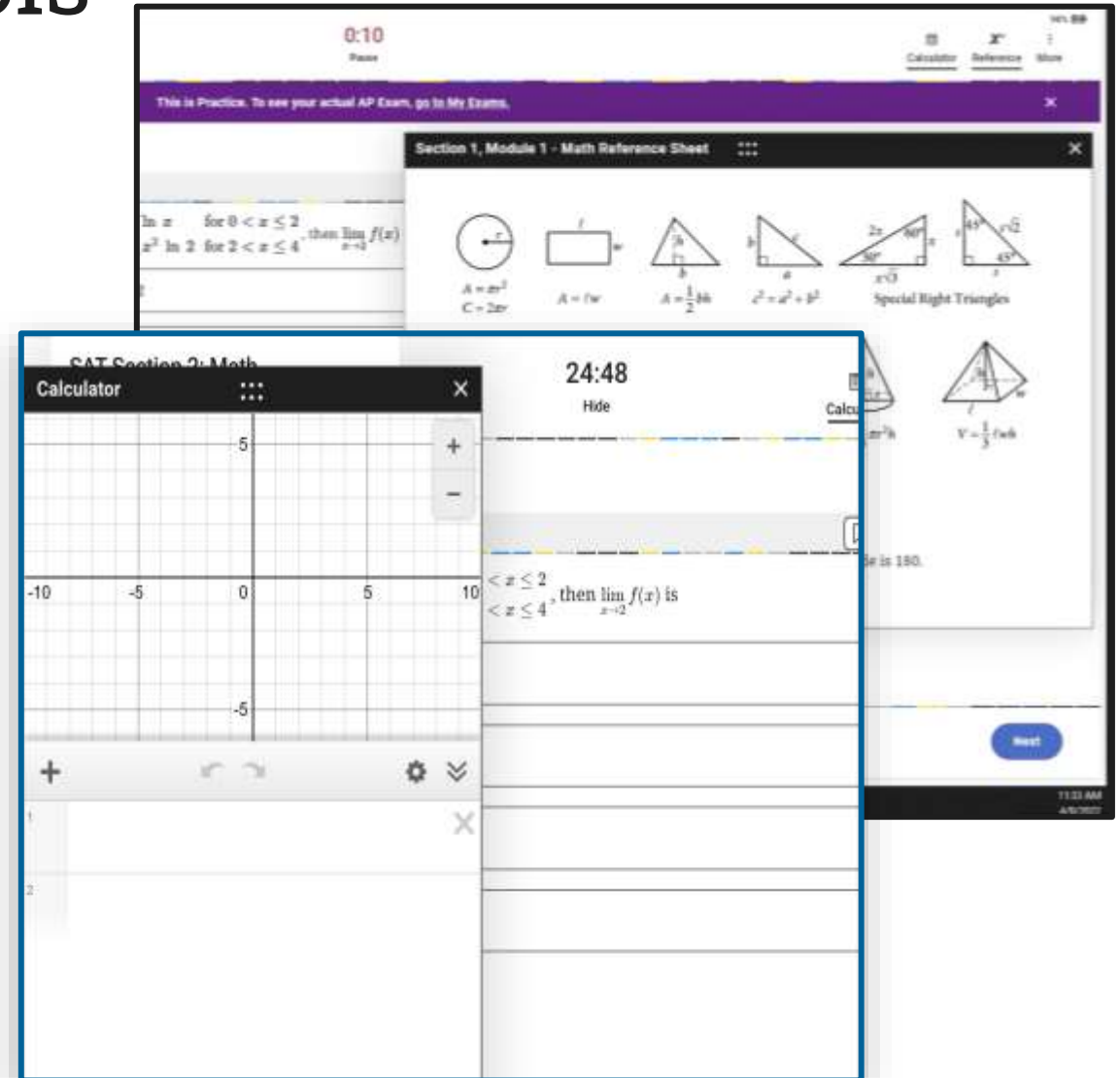



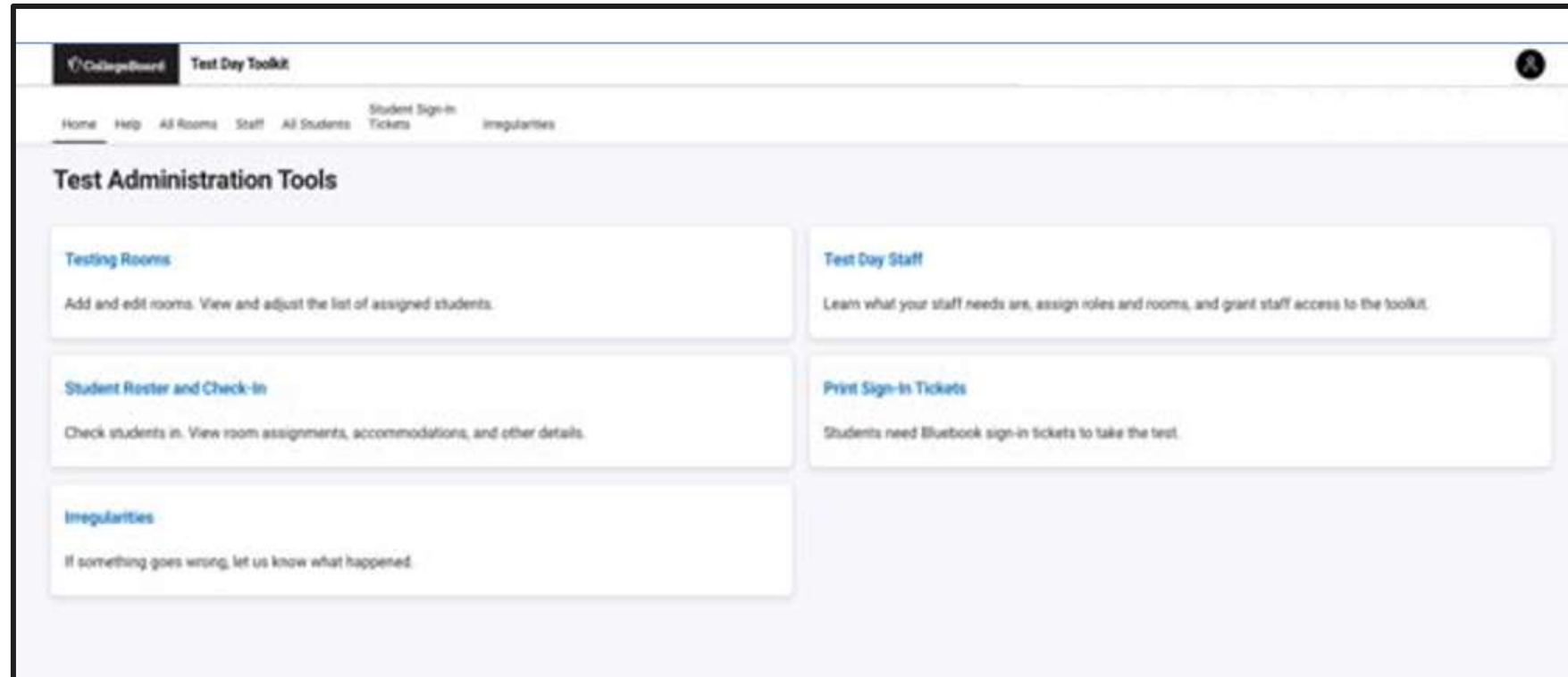

If a testing device runs out of battery, students can plug in, restart their device, and pick up where they left off—**all their work will be saved, and they won't lose testing time**.



Bluebook **automatically locks out other programs** to ensure testing integrity.

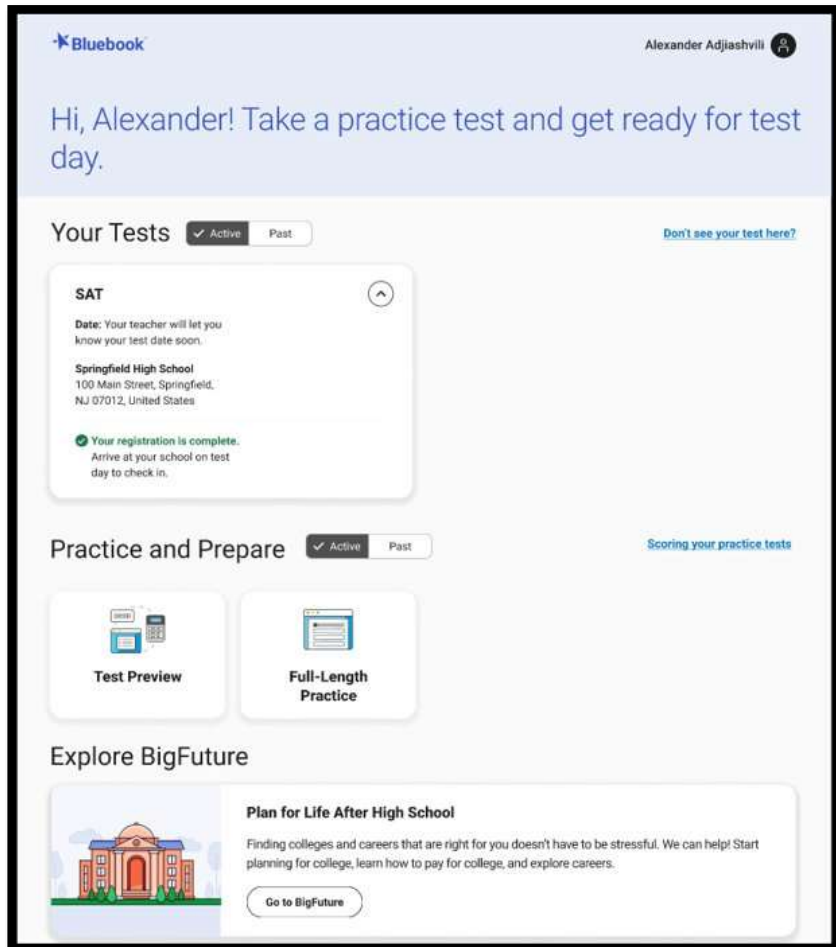


Students are **timed individually**. If their start times are slightly staggered, their breaks and stop times will be, as well.

Testing Device Specifications

- Specifications are posted online at <https://bluebook.collegeboard.org/technology/devices/requirements>
- Windows laptops/tablets must be running Windows 10 or later and have at least 250 MB of free space available.
- Mac laptops must be running macOS 11.4 or later and have at least 150 MB of free space available.
- iPads must be running iPadOS 14 or later and have at least 150 MB of free space available. An external keyboard is needed for students taking the SAT with Essay.
- School-managed Chromebooks must be running Chrome OS 102 or later and have at least 150 MB of free space available.
- Schools should never run Bluebook on a personal Chromebook for testing.

Digital Readiness Check



Digital Readiness Check Website

- Prior to testing, and ideally prior to the test date, all students must complete a Digital Readiness Check to ensure their device and app are ready for testing.
- Students will use the Digital Readiness Check to:
 - Confirm registration data.
 - Read and agree to exam rules.
 - Review the privacy notice.
 - Learn what to bring on test day.
 - Complete an optional test preview to familiarize themselves with how testing works in Bluebook.

Services for Students with Disabilities (SSD), Accommodations, and English Learner (EL) Supports

Spring 2024 SSD Deadlines

College Board-Approved Accommodations and English Learner (EL) Extended Time Requests	January 30, 2024
State-Allowed Accommodations (SAAs) Requests	January 30, 2024

State Allowed Accommodations for Illinois include:

1. American Sign Language (ASL) translation of the test
2. Student responds in ASL

Note: State-Allowed Accommodations should be used only in very rare circumstances, as they result in a non-college reportable score.

English Learner Supports (EL Supports)

EL students can utilize the following supports and still receive a college reportable and/or scholarship reportable score.

1. Translated test directions (no College Board approval needed)
 - The full list will be available in February 2024 at <https://www.isbe.net/Pages/sat-psat.aspx>. There are **17** available languages: Albanian, Arabic, Bengali, Chinese, French, Gujarati, Haitian-Creole, Hindi, Mexican Spanish, Pashto, Polish, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish, Ukrainian, Urdu, and Vietnamese.
 - College Board also supports ‘on the fly’ translations of test directions by district-approved translators for languages not listed.
2. An approved word-to-word bilingual dictionary (no College Board approval needed)

3. Time and one-half extended time – must be requested in SSD Online.

Note: EL Supports need to be renewed annually in SSD Online.

Paper Testing – SAT with Essay, PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9

Some accommodations may require a paper exam, which must be requested in SSD Online.

Note: Additional timings are possible with unique accommodation combinations, such as extended time plus extended breaks.

Special Circumstances

Off-site Testing

What is off-site testing?

If students are not able to test at the established test site, an off-site location may be used (e.g., a district office, a hotel conference room, another school in the district).

It is the test coordinator's responsibility to ensure the off-site location adheres to all College Board testing room policies and technology requirements. To submit an off-site request, please visit <https://sat.org/offsiterequest>. The request form closes on March 1 at midnight ET. If you require an off-site testing location after March 1, please contact College Board Support.

NOTE: Remember, there are no shipments to an off-site location. If a student testing at an off-site location requires paper test materials due to an accommodation, materials will be shipped to the school test coordinator at the established test site.
