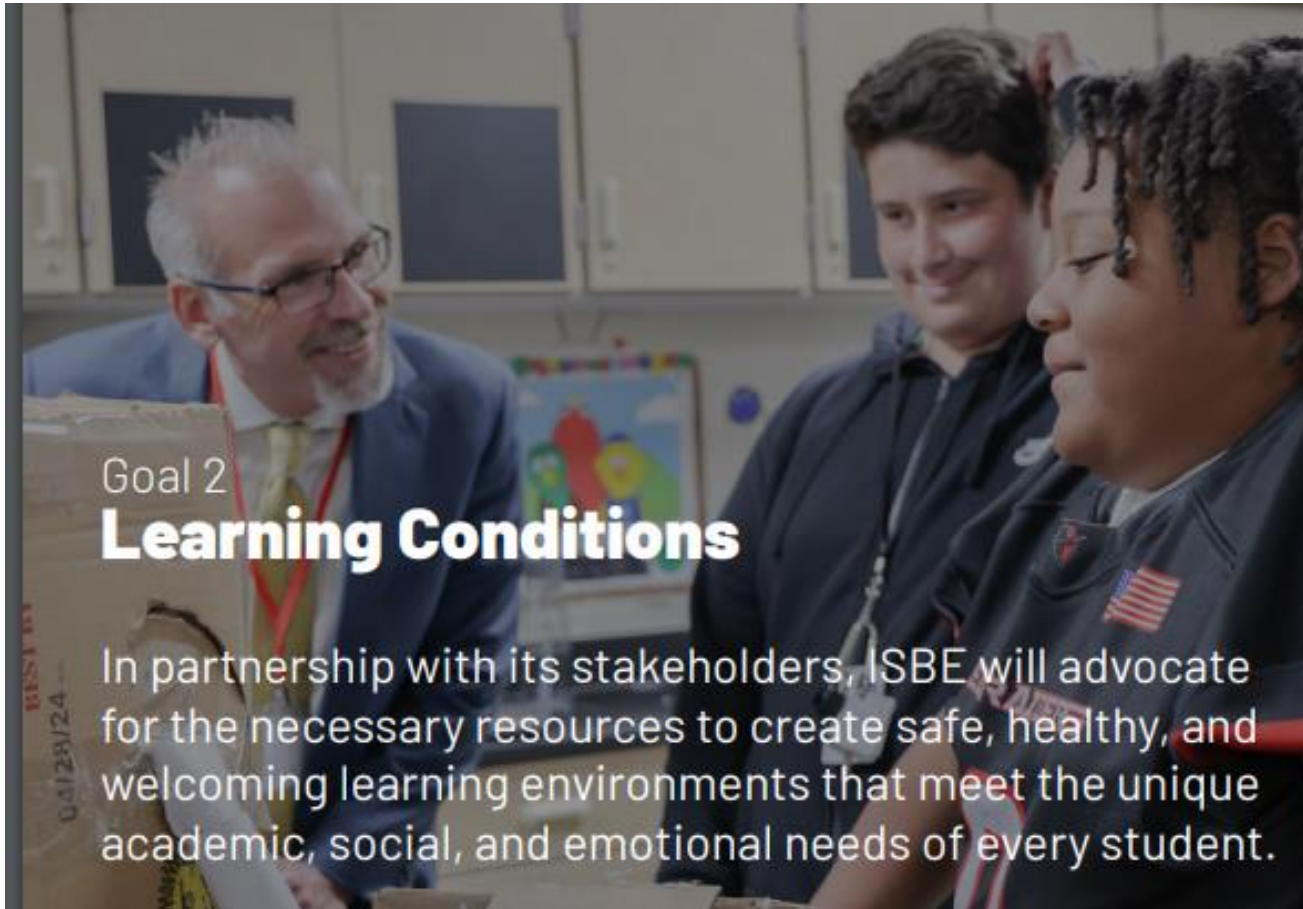

Impact

- the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) estimated about 111,000 people died from drug overdoses in the United States from January 2022 – January 2023 .
- That number included 3,900 Illinois residents who died from drug overdoses in 2022.
- Opioid fatalities increased over the past decade as a result of the influx of synthetic opioids, such as fentanyl into the drug supply.

DRUG EDUCATION RESOURCES

Public Act 102-894 specifies that the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) and the Illinois Department of Human Services (IDHS) collaboratively develop a comprehensive [Substance Use Prevention and Recovery Instruction Resource Guide](#) for public elementary and secondary schools across the state of Illinois by July 1, 2024, and regularly update it. This mandate is designed to address escalating concerns pertaining to substance abuse among youth and to provide necessary resources for prevention and recovery efforts.

ISBE and IDHS collaborated with stakeholders, including the Illinois Opioid Crisis Response Advisory Council, to ensure the relevance of the [Substance Use Prevention and Recovery Instruction Resource Guide](#). It will be regularly reviewed and updated based on the latest findings. The guide will be accessible on this page and disseminated electronically statewide. School districts are not required to use it, but are encouraged to do so for effective instruction. The guide, which is aligned with state standards and action plans, includes age-appropriate content, strategies for interactive instruction, and resources for diverse demographics. IDHS may reimburse costs for heroin and opioid prevention programs, emphasizing effective teaching methods and technological integration. There are also additional resources listed below.

Opioids - What You Need to Know: This lesson was developed by Scholastic in partnership with the National Institute on Drug Abuse. Students will learn what opioids are, their potential for dangers, and how to use opioids safely. Includes an adapted version for Grades 4-6 reading level.

Lesson is designed for students in Grades 6-12.

Number of Lessons and Lesson Length: Educators are provided with one lesson that is facilitated during one class period.

Writing prompts are provided for students in Grades 6-8, 9-10, and 11-12. Student skills that are addressed:

- Analyzing and interpreting information, data, and/or evidence.
- Critical thinking.
- Understanding health effects and risks.

Academic Standards Addressed in Lesson:

- Common Core State Standards RI.2., RI.9., and W.2.
- National Council for Social Studies 8.
- Next Generation Science Standards - Cause and effect, information processing, obtaining, evaluation, and communicating information.

Costs Associated with Materials: Teacher's Guide and student worksheet are downloadable for free.

Overdose Intervention

- Opioid antagonist required in Illinois Schools.
- Procedures at local level.
- Determine personnel to be trained.
- Protocol in place.
- Recognizing a possible overdose.
- Responding to an overdose.
- Reporting an incident.
- Reacting and reevaluating protocol.

Opioid Antagonists

ALL schools are now REQUIRED to maintain a supply of opioid antagonists.

Allows administration of undesignated opioid antagonist to any person suspected or appearing to be experiencing an overdose of opioid.

Requires a report to ISBE within three days of the administration of opioid antagonist.

State report on usage and availability found on ISBE School Nursing webpage.

Check with your local health department or EMS regarding supply.

Opioid Antagonists

ALL schools are now **REQUIRED** to maintain a supply of opioid antagonists.
