Early Childhood Block Grants

SUSPENSION AND EXPULSION LEGISLATION

Subpart D was added to the Administrative Code at 44 Ill. Reg. 1942 effective January 10, 2020. This applies to exclusionary discipline in early childhood programs that receive Early Childhood Block Grant funding (Section 2-3.7(a)(7) of the School Code). The exclusionary discipline amendment is composed of a Behavior Support Plan, a Program Transition Plan, and annual reporting requirements based on these plans. Behavior Support Plans must be completed to document support that is being provided to address challenging behaviors in the classroom. A Program Transition Plan is to be completed prior to a child being removed from a program as a last resort when the previous steps have not been successful. PREVENTION INITIATIVE PARENT AND OUTCOMES QUESTIONNAIRES

The fiscal year [2023 Parent and Outcomes Questionnaires](#) must be completed by **Aug. 31**. The Parent and Outcomes Questionnaires offer opportunities to capture the parent perspective and the activities occurring within the program. The systems and questionnaires are the same as FY 2022. The data is required to fulfill Section 2-3.89 (c) of the Illinois School Code (105 ILCS 5/2-3.89). Prevention Initiative staff who are responsible for the data collection and entry should watch a brief [training webinar](#) to learn about the data collections.

TRANSITION PLANNING CONFERENCES

Transition planning conferences or transition meetings for children currently enrolled in early intervention must be held no sooner than nine months and at least 90 calendar days before the child's third birthday. The Child and Family Connections (CFC) service coordinator is responsible for convening, conducting, and keeping a record of this meeting. At the transition planning conference, the CFC service coordinator (with input from the Local Education Agency) shall keep a record and provide the parents/guardians:

- Information about preschool services under Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) Part B,
- A description of IDEA Part B eligibility definitions,
- State timelines and processes for consenting to an evaluation and conducting eligibility determinations under IDEA Part B, and
- Information about the availability of special education and related services.

The school district has an obligation under the law to participate in transition planning conferences. The conferences must be held, whether or not the school district participates.

EARLY CHILDHOOD OUTCOMES

Early Childhood Outcomes ratings are required **annually between Feb. 1 and July 31**. [The Early Childhood Outcomes in Illinois module](#) was developed by Early CHOICES. This module reviews the three Early Childhood Outcomes that are used to help measure the impact early childhood intervention has on a child's ability to have positive social relationships, acquire and use knowledge and skills, and take appropriate action to meet their needs.
