Updated EC FAQ

- <u>EC FAQ</u> is titled "Serving English Learners in Preschool Programs in Illinois Public School Districts."
- Released in March 2022.
- Changes are based on the updated rules and regulations set forth in 23 III. Adm. Code Part 228.

FAQ3

How are preschool students screened?

- Districts must establish standard English language proficiency (ELP) screening procedures.
- Procedures may include established screeners or other screening procedures.
- Screeners must be research-based.
- Screeners are used to determine ELP in the domains of speaking and listening.
- Screening procedures must:
 - Be appropriate (age, developmentally, culturally, and linguistically).
 - Include observations (culturally and linguistically appropriate).
 - Use multiple measure and methods.
 - Involve family.
 - Involve knowledgeable staff.



FAQ 5 Do staff who administer the screener need to be certified?

 It is recommended for qualified staff to be trained on the specific instrument for the sake of consistency and valid results.



FAQ 16

How does a child's EL status in preschool affect placement in kindergarten?

- All kindergarten students who had a "yes" answer on either of the Home Language Survey questions are screened, regardless of EL status.
- Previous early childhood screener info is not taken into consideration when a student is being placed into kindergarten.



FAQs 17 and 18 Professional Development

What professional development requirements apply to preschool TBE programs/TPIs?

- Districts must offer PD to all TBE/TPI staff.
- Two activities per year. (List of topics is in the FAQ.)
- Newly hired staff must have orientation that informs about TBE/TPI.

Should preschool staff be included in the training related to the implementation of the Spanish Language Arts Standards in districts that offer Spanish Language Arts?

- Spanish language arts (SLA) is not required.
- SLA PD that is provided should be about how preschool can prepare students for SLA in coming years.

#10 – Research-Based Curriculum

 Curriculum aligns with the Illinois Early Learning and Development Standards (IELDS).

Curriculum aligns with Early English Language
 Development Standards (when applicable).



#12 – Observation-Based Assessment

 Individualized portfolios that reflect the IELDS or indicators from the program's research-based assessment tool.

 Portfolios reflect, at a minimum, two benchmarks from the language arts, math, social-emotional, science, social studies, physical, fine arts, and English learners (if applicable) domains of the IELDS.



#15 – Teacher Qualifications

- ELs in a full-time Transitional Bilingual Education
 (TBE) program are provided instruction in the native
 language and English by teachers who are properly
 licensed and hold the bilingual endorsement.
- ELs in TBE or Transitional Program of Instruction
 (TPI) are provided instruction in English as a Second Language (ESL) by teachers holding an ESL or English as a New Language endorsement.



#17 – Home Language Survey

 Completed Home Language Survey on file for each child signed by the parent/guardian.

 Home Language Survey includes the two questions referenced in Adm. Code 228.15(a).

 Applies to all preschool programs that are administered by a public school district.




#18 – Screening Procedures

- The district screens the English language proficiency of each student identified through the Home Language Survey as having a language background other than English.
- The district uses the prescribed screening procedures identified by the preschool program to determine English language proficiency.
- Applies to all preschool programs that are administered by a public school district.
