Exemplary Sexual Health Education (ESHE)

The Illinois State Board of Education Division of Regulatory Support and Wellness has completed a five-year project to improve sexual health education provided to students in middle and high schools. The project, which was funded by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, meets the requirements of Public Act 98-0441 for comprehensive and medically accurate, developmentally appropriate sex education in middle and high schools in districts that provide sex education.

One of the goals of this project is to provide resources and assistance to schools regarding evidence-based education related to sexual health.
