FAQ – Student Expulsions Under the Illinois School Code (105 ILCS 5/10-22.6)

What are some behaviors that can get my child expelled under the School Code?

- The School Code provides that students may be expelled when they are found to be guilty of "gross disobedience or misconduct, including gross disobedience or misconduct perpetuated by electronic means[.]"
 - Illinois courts have generally found that local school boards have authority to determine the acts and/or omissions that constitute gross disobedience or misconduct for the purpose of student expulsion.
- Further, the School Code provides that students may be expelled for making internet threats that meet certain criteria.

How long can my child be expelled?

- The School Code provides that a student may be expelled for a period not to exceed two calendar years.
- However, a one-year expulsion is mandatory for bringing a weapon (as further detailed in statute) to school, any school-sponsored activity or event, or any activity or event that bears a reasonable relationship to school.
 - Note this period may be modified "by the superintendent, and the superintendent's determination may be modified by the board on a case-by-case basis."

What must occur prior to my child being expelled?

- Under the School Code, the following are to occur prior to student expulsion:
 - Other appropriate and available behavioral and disciplinary interventions have been exhausted.
 - o Determination that a student's continuing presence in school would either:
 - (i) Pose a threat to the safety of other students, staff, or members of the school community, or
 - (ii) Substantially disrupt, impede, or interfere with the operation of the school.
 - School officials have made all reasonable efforts to:
 - Resolve threats,
 - Address disruptions, and
 - Minimize the length of student exclusions to the greatest extent practicable.
 - Hold an expulsion hearing before the board (or hearing officer appointed by the board).

Where can I find out more about student expulsion?

- The provision generally covering student expulsion may be found in 105 ILCS 5/10-22.6.
