





Schools performing in the top 10% of schools statewide, with no underperforming student groups. Summative Designation Narrative

	An Intensive Support designation initiates intensive school improvement status and the school begins a four-year cycle of school improvement.

There are five possible designations.



- Summative designations are calculated by assigning points for every accountability indicator.
- The indicators are weighted, meaning that each indicator is worth a different number of total possible points.
- Click "Accountability," then click "Summative Designation" to view the points your school earned for each of the accountability indicators.






Summative Designation Descriptive Statistics

- Schools are then ranked by points to find the threshold for the bottom 5% (Comprehensive) and the top 10% (Exemplary).
- The remaining 85% schools are Commendable or Targeted, if they have a low-performing student group.
- The points threshold changes yearly according to the statewide data.




