Targeted Support	 One or more student groups performing at or below the "all students" group of the lowest-performing 5 percent of schools; groups must have at least 20 students in at least five of eight indicators, one of which must be non-academic A Targeted Support designation initiates targeted school improvement status and the school begins a four-year cycle of school improvement.

Intensive Support	A school that has completed a full Comprehensive Support school improvement cycle, but whose performance remains in the lowest-performing 5 percent of Title I-eligible schools statewide or is a high school with a graduation rate of 67 percent or below at the end of the four-year improvement cycle An Intensive Support designation initiates intensive school improvement status and the school begins a four-year cycle of school improvement.


Accountability Indicators

- **Summative designations** are calculated by assigning points for every accountability indicator.
- The indicators are weighted, meaning that each indicator is worth a different number of total possible points.
- Click "Accountability," then click "Summative Designation" to view the points your school earned for each of the accountability indicators.



Accountability Indicators


Student growth on the Illinois Assessment of Readiness is the biggest category at 50% of the total points for elementary and middle schools.

Summative Designation Descriptive Statistics

- Schools are then ranked by points to find the threshold for the bottom 5% (Comprehensive) and the top 10% (Exemplary).
- The remaining 85% schools are Commendable –
 or Targeted, if they have a low-performing
 student group.
- The points threshold changes yearly according to the statewide data.



- The new aligned performance levels for all ELA, math and science assessments.




