

## How to Host a Practice Test

Taking a full-length SAT practice test is one of the best ways to simulate test day. Eight official SAT practice tests are available for free, both online and on paper.

## **Online Practice Tests**

Created by the makers of the SAT\*, each practice test has the same types of questions students will see on test day. Four of the practice tests have even been given previously as actual SAT tests.

Students can take SAT practice tests online with **Official SAT Practice on Khan Academy**\*. Their answers will automatically be scored at the end of their test, and the timer will keep them on track with section time limits.

Best of all, after the practice test, students will get personalized practice recommendations so they can focus on what they missed.

## **Helpful Tips**

Reserve laptops or the school computer lab, and direct students to **Official SAT Practice on Khan Academy**.

- Ensure students have created accounts on Official SAT Practice.
- Provide students with guidance for taking an online Official SAT Practice test.
- Review with students how to answer grid-in questions in the math section.
- Remember to review the approved calculator list so students can practice with the same tools they'll use on test day.
- Encourage students to set aside about 4 hours to take the test.
- Review results of full-length practice test in the Teacher Dashboard.
- Set aside time with students to review their results and the answer explanations for the
  questions they missed, or encourage them to review their results on their own.
