

CHILD NUTRITION PROGRAM STATE WAIVER REQUEST TEMPLATE

Child Nutrition Programs are expected to be administered according to all statutory and regulatory requirements; waivers to the requirements are exceptions. However, Section 12(l) of the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act, 42 U.S.C. 1760(l), provides authority for USDA to waive requirements for State agencies or eligible service providers under certain circumstances. When requesting the waiver of statutory or regulatory requirements for the Child Nutrition Programs (CNP), including the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP), the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP), the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), the Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program (FFVP), the Special Milk Program (SMP), and the School Breakfast Program (SBP), State agencies and eligible service providers should use this template. State agencies and eligible service providers should consult with their FNS Regional Offices when developing waiver requests to ensure a well-reasoned, thorough request is submitted. State agencies and eligible service providers are encouraged to submit complete waiver requests at least 60 calendar days prior to the anticipated implementation date. Requests submitted less than 60 calendar days prior to the anticipated implementation should be accompanied by an explanation of extenuating circumstances.

3. Eligible service providers participating in waiver and affirmation that they are in good standing:

Any Illinois approved School Food Authority (SFA) approved to operate in the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) in good standing and operating during a school closure or COVID social distancing remote e-learning.

4. Description of the challenge the State agency is seeking to solve, the goal of the waiver to improve services under the Program, and the expected outcomes if the waiver is granted. [Section 12(l)(2)(A)(iii) and 12(l)(2)(A)(iv) of the NSLA]:

In school year 20-21 due to COVID-19, Illinois schools will have modified school schedules where children may be in attendance in person, partial days with on-line instructions, every other day, or on-line. In addition, there may be unanticipated school closures due to a COVID-19 outbreak. ISBE is requesting this waiver to support school food authorities operating the Summer Food Service Program to allow parents/guardians to pick up meals on behalf of a child(ren) without the child being present to support access to nutritious meals while minimizing potential exposure to the novel coronavirus.

ISBE requests a waiver of requirements at 7 CFR 225.6(e)(15) to serve meals through the Summer Food Service Program in a non-congregate setting.

5. Specific Program requirements to be waived (include statutory and regulatory citations). [Section 12(l)(2)(A)(i) of the NSLA]:

7 CFR 225.2 (Meals), 7 CFR 225.9(d)(7).

6. Detailed description of alternative procedures and anticipated impact on Program operations, including technology, State systems, and monitoring:

Minimal Impact. Sponsors will be given technical assistance to provide meals in a non-congregant setting.

7. Description of any steps the State has taken to address regulatory barriers at the State level. [Section 12(l)(2)(A)(ii) of the NSLA]:

The State Agency does not anticipate regulatory barriers.

8. Anticipated challenges State or eligible service providers may face with the waiver implementation:

No significant challenges.

9. Description of how the waiver will not increase the overall cost of the Program to the Federal Government. If there are anticipated increases, confirm that the costs will be paid from non-Federal funds. [Section 12(I)(1)(A)(iii) of the NSLA]:

The waiver is not anticipated to increase the overall cost of the program.

10. Anticipated waiver implementation date and time period:

This waiver would go into effect during the 2020-2021 school year as schools require remote learning or a school is closed due to a coronavirus outbreak. The waiver is requested through the duration of the 2020-2021 school year or June 30, 2021 whichever is sooner.
