


Snapshot taken from I-Star Plus on July 15th – Any findings of noncompliance are tied to LEA Determinations and the Illinois Special Education Accountability and Support System for districts with less than 100% compliance. LEA Determinations are released in September every year.

No Action Needed Youth with IEPs aged 16 and above with an IEP that includes appropriate measurable postsecondary goals that are annually updated and based upon age-appropriate transition assessments; transition services, including course of study, that will reasonably enable the students to meet those postsecondary goals; and annual IEP goals related to the student's transition service needs



- ☐ Where noncompliance occurred
- ☐ Root cause of noncompliance (e.g., data entry error, lack of school personnel, etc.)
- The districts policies, procedures, and/ or practices that contributed to or resulted in the noncompliance and changes made to such policies, procedures and/ or practices.

CAP Must Include (Checklist)

- □ The corrective action steps that will be implemented to correct the noncompliance and the date by which they will be completed
- ☐ The persons responsible for ensuring the CAP is implemented
