

Illinois Post-School Survey Expanded Version Interview Questions and Interviewer Script

CALLER PROMPTS (In Red)
GO TO CUES (Highlighted)
SCRIPTS (Highlighted)

THESE DATA MUST BE GATHERED BETWEEN MAY AND AUGUST OF THE YEAR FOLLOWING THE STUDENT'S EXIT FROM HIGH SCHOOL.

"Hello. My name is _____ and I am calling for the _____ School District. Recently, _____ (former student's name) received a letter stating that someone representing their former high school would be calling to ask questions about their current school, work and independent living activities, and how well high school prepared them for adult living. The answers will be used to better plan for classes and activities for current and future students."

As needed, assure the person answering the phone that you are not trying to sell anything. Refer to the letter they received again.

If Phone Answered by Former Student, say:

"I would like to ask you some questions about your current work, school and independent living activities, as well as your high school experiences. The questions will only take a short time. Your answers will be kept confidential and will be used to help your school district better plan classes and activities for future students. May I ask you these questions now?"

IF YES, GO TO QUESTION #1

IF NO ASK:

"Would it be okay to contact you again in a few days in the event you have changed your mind?"

"Is there a time when it would be more convenient to talk with you?"

"Is there any additional information I can provide that might help you decide to answer some questions?"

**IF NO SAY: "Okay, thank you for your time."
END SURVEY HERE**
