Higher Ed





- The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) was signed by President Obama on Dec. 10, 2015.
- This bipartisan measure reauthorizes the 50-year-old Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), the nation's education law and longstanding commitment to equal opportunity for all students.
- The new law builds on key areas of progress in recent years and ongoing efforts to improve educational opportunities for all students in Illinois.
- The majority of the law does not take effect until 2017-18, with implementation occurring over the next year and a half. ISBE staff continue to review the nuances of the 1,000-page law and will engage in deliberate stakeholder involvement throughout this process.

ESSA Illinois State Plan Draft #3

Highly Qualified

• With the passage of the <u>Every Student Succeeds Act</u> (<u>ESSA</u>), some provisions are being phased in or phased out, with full implementation set for 2017-18.

One provision that is no longer required for the 2016-17 school year is the Highly Qualified requirements for teachers and paraprofessionals as outlined in section 1119 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act.

Effective July 1, teachers and paraprofessionals must meet state and local licensure requirements found in the endorsement structure document.

At this time, our office will no longer be verifying highly qualified statuses. Individuals who became highly qualified in an area before July 1, 2016 can still use his or her "highly qualified" status to fulfill PD requirements, as long as the HQ criteria was completed during his or her current 5-year renewal cycle.

Summary of Rules effective August 9, 2016

Part 1

1.720: Requirements for Teachers of Middle Grades

- The K-9 elementary education endorsement must be issued by September 1, 2019 (program must be completed by September 1, 2018). Middle school endorsements under old structure can be added through January 31, 2018. (1.720[a])
- For assignability: a middle school endorsement is no longer required to teach either departmentalized or self-contained grade 5. The new middle grade endorsement will be required for anyone teaching grades 6-8 February 1, 2018 and after (who is not already endorsed.) Addresses school district issues with finding a sufficient number of teachers endorsed for grade 5.(1.720[a])
- For minor teaching assignments for coursework completed July 1, 1997 and after: **9 hours** needed to teach a "minor" area has been reduced to **6 hours**.(1.720[b][2])

Appendix A

- Individuals holding an ELS-CTE can now teach coursework in their skill area in grades 7-12, rather than the previous 11-12 grade range.
- This change addresses a shortage of qualified CTE staff for middle school and early high school. (1 appendix A)
- Old Text: CTE is...Valid in approved programs of career and technical education (CTE), for "skill-level" instruction in grades 11 and 12 in the field of specialization and for "orientation-level" instruction in grades 9 and 10 in the field of career and technical education endorsement to which the specialization belongs. Provided that the license holder is employed to teach in any of grades 9 through 12 in the field of specialization, the educator license is also valid for exploratory career and technical education courses in grades 7 and 8 in that field of endorsement.
- New Text: CTE is...Valid in programs of career and technical education (CTE), for instruction in grades 7 through 12 in the field of specialization indicated on the specific endorsement held.



Summary of Rules effective August 9, 2016

Part 20 and Part 26 and Part 25

• Elementary Education K-9 program completion extended by one year. Program must be completed by September 1, 2018 and endorsement must be issued by September 1, 2019.

Part 25

- <u>25.37: Acquisition of Subsequent Teaching Endorsements on a</u> <u>PEL:</u> Candidates who receive a 1-6 elementary education endorsement can earn a middle endorsement under the current structure (18 hrs + 6 hrs MG professional coursework) until January 31, 2018. (25.37[b][3] new)
- <u>25.40: Grade-Level Endorsements (New)</u>: Each individual will be endorsed for particular grade level for which he/she is qualified. Gradelevel endorsement takes precedence over content area endorsements for assignability purposes. (Refers to staff qualifications in Part 1...major and minor teaching assignments.)
- <u>25.72: Endorsement for Provisional CTE:</u> To renew the license, 20 hrs of coursework no longer has to be taken in the individual's CTE area. It can be taken in any area. (25.72[d][2])

- **25.99: Endorsement for Middle Grades:** Clarification that individuals who hold a 5-8 middle school endorsement (by virtue of completing an approved program) may teach in self-contained grade 5 as long as he/she has six semester hours of coursework in in area to be taught (if an endorsement in these areas is not held.) (25.99[e]) –new Ex: Educator who completed a 5-8 middle grade program in math can teach grade 5 in any other subject (PE, science, etc.) as long as she/he has six semester hours in the subject to be taught. (*Aligns to Part1-See previous slide*)
- <u>25.335—25.365 (All Administrative Endorsements)</u>: New change to allow individuals who have received their initial teaching or school support personnel certificate prior to July 1, 1988 to not be required to pass a test of basic skills for the endorsement.
- <u>25.425: Individuals Prepared in Out-of State Institutions--</u> Anyone who completed student teaching by August 31, 2015 can take the APT instead of the edTPA (whether prepared in-state or out-of-state). All individuals can also take the edTPA in place of the APT. 25.425 [a][4]
- Three years of teaching experience to waive the edTPA has been replaced **with 1 year of teaching experience**. Performance evaluation still applies. 25.425 [a][4][B]

Renewal



- **REGISTRATION** refers to the act of paying the fees to the ROE or ISC to register the license for the current renewal cycle.
- **RENEWAL** refers to completing any PD requirements and paying the fees to the ROE or ISC to keep the license current for another cycle.
- Licensees must log into their ELIS accounts, follow the prompts for registration/renewal, and pay the fees using a credit/debit card.
- The license is invalid for employment if not registered. Registration fees not paid within six months of renewal, reinstatement, or issuance causes the license to lapse.

- No PD for:
 - Positions that do not require licensure
 - Educators who worked less than 50% Full Time Equivalent (FTE)
 - Retired Educators
- Only PD offered by approved providers will count

- Must be documented by the provider completing the ISBE form 77-21B
 - This form must be maintained by the educator for a period of 6 years and produced if requested as part of an audit.

Reinstatement

- If an educator fails to pay their registration fees and/or enter Professional Development (PD), the license will lapse.
- In order for a license to be valid for public school employment, the educator will need to **reinstate** his or her license

• 2 Options:

- 9 hours of coursework on or after 9/1/2011
- \$500
- Back and current registration fees are due upon reinstatement of license, regardless of option selected.
