edTPA

Reminders

ISBE recommends candidates create an ELIS account upon entry into a preparation program. This will help to alleviate unmatched edTPA scores. Also ensure candidates' name/SSN they use for the edTPA is consistent with that on their ELIS account. ISBE is still continuing to upload unmatched scores each time a new batch is received from edTPA.

ILLINOIS LICENSURE TESTING SYSTEMS

Basic Skills Mobile App

This December Pearson is launching a mobile app for educators preparing for the Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP 400). This app will include 60+ multiple choice and constructed response questions. The initial download will be free to candidates: however, the full version will cost \$1.99.

30 day Retake Policy

The ISBE has changed the Retake Policy for all ILTS tests, such that candidates may retake any ILTS test or subtest after no less than 30 days after the previous attempt, subject to the availability of computer-based testing appointments.

Effective December 15, 2015, candidates who register to re-take an ILTS test will be able to schedule a test appointment no sooner than 30 days after their previous attempt. Candidates who register to re-take an ILTS test before December 15 will still be subject to the 60 day retake rule. If a candidate who registered before December 15 wishes to take advantage of the change in the Retake Policy, they may withdraw their registration on the ILTS website for a full refund, then reregister for the test on or after December 15 and then schedule

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an appointment. Candidates who have already scheduled a test appointment must first cancel their appointment on the ILTS website before withdrawing their registration.

Note that some ILTS tests are offered during a limited number of testing windows per year, and are not available year-round (e.g., Foreign Language tests, Target Language Proficiency Tests, Learning Behavior Specialist II tests). Candidates may retake a test that is not offered yearround at the next available testing window, assuming that the next window occurs no less than 30 days after their previous attempt on the test.

If a candidate re-takes an ILTS before receiving their score report for their previous attempt, they assume full responsibility for all applicable fees for both attempts, even if they subsequently learn that they passed the test on the earlier attempt. No refunds will be made on the basis of passing performance on the earlier attempt.

Elementary Education Test

ILTS has announced March 21st. 2016 as the first date candidates can take the new Elementary Education (Grades 1-6) Test.

Until that date, any candidate that has completed or is currently enrolled in a program should take the Elementary/Middle Grades (110) Test. Students enrolled in the "new" (1-6) program should take the new Elementary Education (Grades 1-6)

(197-200) Test once it becomes available.

ISBE will keep the 110 Test available during the transition time frame until August 31st, 2017.

Middle Grades Test

Middle grade candidates should take the Elementary/Middle Grades (110) Test until the new middle grades tests are launched. We anticipate the middle grades test being available spring 2017.

ACT Writing Cut Score

The SEPLB will establish a new cut score (hopefully at the December 4 meeting). Once a decision is made, ISBE will release an official statement regarding the new cut score.

ENDORSEMENTS

ESL/Bilingual Matrix

We are beginning to update our collection of approved coursework for each endorsement area. Approved coursework files are used by the evaluators during transcript evaluation to determine appropriate coursework that can be honored toward endorsement. Some of the files have not been updated for several years! Thus, educators may not be receiving credit for coursework that has been completed.

Over the next several months, your ISBE consultant will be asking you to complete an updated matrix for specific endorsement areas.

We have begun this process with ESL and Bilingual endorsements. Please submit your institution's

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ESL/Bilingual endorsement matrix by Friday December 4th, 2015.

General Administrative

Candidates who hold an IL PEL and have completed an approved IL General Administrative program prior to September 1st, 2014 must pass the Principal (186) Test by June 30th 2016.

Candidates who hold an Out-of-State license but have completed a General Administrative program prior to September 1st, 2014 must meet the current IL PEL requirements and pass the Principal (186) Test by June 30th, 2016.

Secondary Science & Social Science *Endorsements*

Candidates entitled in secondary biology may still teach other science classes (Chemistry, Earth & Space Science, Environmental Science, Physics) to students enrolled in "regular" classes. Candidates must be entitled in subsequent areas (Chemistry, Earth & Space Science, Environmental Science, Physics) if they plan to teach students in "Honors" or "AP" classes in those areas.

This applies to all areas of secondary Social Sciences.

To attain a second designation in secondary science or social science, candidates must either complete 12 semester hours in that designation and pass the content test or complete an entire major in that designation area.

Foreign Language

If an educator already holds a PEL endorsed in a foreign language, a subsequent endorsement in a

different language may be added by passing the appropriate foreign language test.

If an educator is seeking an initial endorsement in a foreign language, the requirements include 24 semester hours in the foreign language and passing the appropriate foreign language test.

Questions & Answers

Q: If a candidate is completing a double major in Elementary **Education and English literature** and wish to be entitled in ELED and secondary ENG ED, would they need to complete two edTPAs?

A: No. Only one edTPA is required for licensure. ISBE recommends candidates align their edTPA to their student teaching classroom.

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O: Do educators have to hold an LBSI to obtain an LBSII?

A: No. If an educator has *completed a program for "Teacher* of students who are deaf or hard of *hearing*" or "Teacher of students who are blind or visually impaired" or "Speech Language Pathologist", they do not have to hold an LBSI endorsement to add the LBSII endorsement. All other educators seeking the LBSII endorsement must hold a LBSI (PK-21) endorsement.

O: Can an educator that holds an **ELS endorsed in transitional** bilingual educator be paid during student teaching?

A: YES Per 25.620(f)(4)

Q: Can an educator that was not able to pass the TAP submit ACT scores from 8 years ago?

A: YES. ACT scores are valid indefinitely as long as the writing portion is included.

Q: If a candidate completed student teaching in the spring of 2015 and submitted the edTPA for official scoring and did not pass, can they take still take the APT?

A: YES. Candidates that completed their student teaching prior to September 1st, 2015 can submit APT scores.

Q: Does someone who holds an **OOS license have to meet the Test** of Basic Skills and coursework requirement for an IL PEL endorsed in Reading Specialist?

A: YES. The reading specialist endorsement can only be added to an educator who already holds an IL PEL endorsed in a teaching field (unless the educator is completing the requirements for a PEL at the same time). They would also need to meet the teaching experience requirement, pass the content test and complete an approved Reading Specialist Masters' degree.

O: What is the total cost to IL candidates to apply and register their license? If they have additional endorsements, are they charged a fee to add each of those as well?

A: The application fee is \$100 and the fee to initially register their IL PEL is \$60, which is good for five full fiscal years (plus the remainder of the current fiscal year in which they initially register). Any endorsements that will go along with the initial entitlement for the PEL will not have additional fees associated with them. However, if a subsequent endorsement is applied for after the initial PEL has been issued, the fee is \$50 per endorsement. Click here for further fee information.
