DDSL created a work plan to pursue three goals with a focus on equity, diversity, and partnership.

The purpose of the Principal Recruitment Program is to recruit diverse, committed candidates to enroll in principal preparation programs.

Entities that were awarded demonstrated their capacity to identify and cultivate interest among talented educators to pursue a principalship and support these candidates into leadership roles.



ISBE approved the release of a Request for Proposals (RFP) in FY 2022 for a three-year continuation grant for \$1.8 million each year.

The Principal Recruitment Grant was funded through General Revenue Funds.

The New Principal Mentoring Program will match new principals in their first year of employment in Illinois with veteran principals who have demonstrated success as instructional leaders.

The program seeks mentors who are well-trained and available to provide consistent support and mentorship to new principals.



Role of the Mentor:

- Identify and guide the principal in areas for improvement.
- Form supportive professional relationship.
- Assist in the adjustment to the role and the development of skill as an instructional leader.
- Coach, observe, and provide feedback.
- Help identify barriers to school improvement and find solutions.



Eligibility of Mentor:

- Served as a principal in Illinois for at least three full years.
- Demonstrated success as an instructional leader.
- Completed the required training in the Professional Standards for Education Leaders, Culturally Responsive Teaching and Leading Standards, ethics, principles of adult learning, establishing a mentoring relationship, and mentoring skills and techniques.



ISBE approved the release of an RFP in In FY 2022 for a three-year continuation grant for \$1.2 million each year.

The FY 2022 and FY 2023 grants were funded through ESSER II.

The FY 2024 grant is currently funded through ESSER III.
