Ashton-Franklin Center (AFC) C.U.S.D. #275 is located in the Rock River Valley of northwest Illinois on historic Lincoln Highway, 30 miles south of Rockford and 100 miles west of Chicago. The school district includes the communities of Ashton and Franklin Grove. Both are rural communities with a combined population of 2,500 people. Farming and related occupations form the basis for most businesses; however, a food-packaging corporation is also a major employer.

During the summer of 2004, the Ashton and Franklin Center schools consolidated to form AFC C.U.S.D, #275. The high school, located in Ashton, has 156 students with 19 teachers and one counselor, all with bachelor's degrees (9 with master's degrees). AFC requires 26 credits for graduation (four credits English, three math, three science, two and ½ social science including Constitution, four Physical Education/Health, and ½ Consumer Education). Each yearly 1-credit class is scheduled on a traditional schedule; class time is 47 minutes. Students take 7 courses every year. All courses are used in calculating a student's GPA except Coop and Teacher's Aide.

Students may participate in an extensive vocational-technical-career program in a nearby town sponsored by the high schools in the region. Students may also enroll for dual credit at a local community college. The agriculture department is an especially strong program, enabling students to attain state, regional, and national standings through their participation in an award-winning FFA chapter.

Each year, about three-fourths of the senior class attends college, including community colleges.
