Community: The Kodiak Island Borough is located in the Gulf of Alaska approximately 250 miles southwest of Anchorage. The area includes 5,464 square miles of water and 6,560 square miles of land. The total population of approximately 13,500 includes the City of Kodiak, seven villages around the island and the nation's largest U.S. Coast Guard Base. The City of Kodiak, located near the northeastern tip of Kodiak Island, is a community of 6,500 people. Founded in 1792, Kodiak was the first capital of Russian America. Kodiak's personality reflects this history with a culture rich in Alutiiq Native and Russian influences. This cultural diversity is further enhanced by the highly transient fishing and Coast Guard communities. Commercial fishing and processing, recreational hunting and fishing, retail services, tourism, and government make up the Kodiak economy.

School: Kodiak High School is a public high school accredited by the Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges. Kodiak High School is part of the Kodiak Island Borough School District (KIBSD), which also has four elementary schools, one middle school, and seven rural sites. In addition, KIBSD has a correspondence based high school called AKTEACH. Students may attend full time or part time or take individual courses through this school.

Faculty and Staff: 43 certified classroom teachers, 3 administrators, 1 activities director, 3 counselors, 1 librarian, 1 nurse, 1 mental health clinician, 1 police liaison officer, and 25 classified staff.

Students: Kodiak High School has a total enrollment of approximately 630 students in grades 9-12. There are 159 seniors, 167 juniors, 158 sophomores, and 146 freshmen.

Ethnic Mix: African-American 0.32%, Alaska Native 5.9%, American Indian 0.48%, Asian 32.3%, Hawaiian/Pacific Islander 0.64%, White 36.2%, Hispanic 9.3%, and Multi-Ethnic 14.9%.

Programs and Schedule: Kodiak High School offers a wide variety of career technical and academic courses. This includes Advanced Placement courses, honors courses, and courses offered for both college and high school credit. Kodiak High School enjoys a partnership with Kodiak College, a branch of the University of Alaska-Anchorage. Facilities, faculty, and resources are shared to provide students with dual credit opportunities including Architectural Drafting, Advanced Welding Technology, and other courses.

In addition, Special Education and English Language Acquisition Programs are provided to qualified students.

The school year is divided into two 18-week semesters. A modified block schedule is followed with most students attending seven classes weekly. Most classes meet 4 times a week, once on Monday for 50 minutes, twice on Tues/Wed/Thurs for 70 minutes, and once on Friday for 40 minutes. Students are assigned by grade level to a teacher-advisor and meet for 60 minutes one day per week during Advisory. Every Friday students are released one hour early from school to allow for staff development. Students earn 0.5 credits for each semester course to typically earn a maximum of seven credits for the school year.

Currently, there is no testing requirement beyond course credits for graduation.

GPA and Class Rank: GPA and Class Rank are calculated at the end of each semester. The GPA is the total grade points in all courses for which the student received high school credit divided by the number of grades earned and listed on the student's transcript. NG, P and WP grades are not included when the student's GPA is calculated. WF grades are calculated as an F in the GPA. Grade Points: A=4.0 points; B=3.0 points; C=2.0 points; D=1.0 point. AP classes are weighted earning an additional point per letter for grades A - D.

Class Rank is determined using the cumulative GPA for all four years of high school.

Honors Diploma: Graduates of 2019 must have a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher to be eligible for an Honors Diploma.
