Dear Administrator:

Each year, from January through May, the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) surveys a representative sample of parents of students with disabilities to determine how well schools throughout the state are involving parents in their children's education. The survey results are a required component of ISBE's Annual Performance Report (APR) to the United States Department of Education, Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP). Your district or the districts within your cooperative are included in the January 2025 survey sample.

The purpose of this letter is to notify the districts and cooperatives that are being surveyed this year that the 2025 Indicator 8 Parent Involvement survey is being distributed to the parents of students with disabilities in your district. Parents of students with disabilities in your district receive a letter in the mail this month that contains a link and a QR code to the parent survey. It is suggested that districts and cooperatives prepare as well as provide information to parents regarding the survey so they can more easily complete it.


Districts and cooperatives can:
