Subject: ILLINOIS TYDINGS WAIVER REQUEST FOR MATH SCIENCE PARTNERSHIP FUNDS

Dear Ms. Smith:

The Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) is formally requesting a waiver of section 421(b) of the General Education Provisions Act, also known as the "Tydings Amendment," as it affects the authority of ISBE and its sub recipients to obligate Math and Science Partnership (MSP) funds in fiscal year 2019 after the September 30, 2018, deadline. Specifically, ISBE is requesting authority to waive the period of availability of MSP funds granted in FY 2016 under section Title II, Part B of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 program.

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Approval of the waiver request will enable Illinois to continue to focus on:

- Increasing teachers' content knowledge in applied mathematics in the areas of STEM, statistics, and technical math.
- Improving teachers' instructional practices and pedagogical skills in applied mathematics through the use of highly contextualized and authentic problems.

PROJECT PLAN

The award will go to a single entity that can demonstrate strengths in developing and facilitating
engaging professional learning to secondary teachers using content-rich, aligned, and targeted
applied mathematics learning activities through a variety of platforms and has extensive
experience facilitating learning and teaching applied mathematics aligned in the areas of STEM,
statistics, and technical mathematics.

 The plan is projected to increase student achievement in math applications and problem solving, specifically, in current high-demand areas of STEM, statistics, and technical math. Concurrently, the project is aimed at improving postsecondary and career opportunities for students, such as increasing college completion rates, and preparing students to enter skill-based careers upon graduation.

Timeline

May 2018 Tydings waiver request to U.S. Department of Education

May/June 2018 Compose Request for Proposals (RFP) at state level, obtain approvals

July 2018 Release RFP

Sept. 2018 Award RFP

Oct. 2018 Grantee begins to execute scope of work (estimated 6-12 months)

Sept. 2019 Grant project concludes/preparation of evaluation

ISBE currently has 11 MSP grantees concluding programming on Aug. 31, 2018.

ISBE assures it will provide notice and information regarding this waiver request to the public in its customary fashion, by posting it on the ISBE website at https://www.isbe.net/Pages/Waivers.aspx, and by publicizing the waiver request in the Superintendent's Weekly Newsletter on June 5 and June 12. Any comments received will be forwarded to the Department.

ISBE further assures the grantee will be held accountable under the Grant Accountability and Transparency Act (GATA) and through state evaluation and monitoring procedures.
