Illinois Assessment of Readiness

Families who refused to bring their students in for testing:

Remove all students from the testing session in PearsonAccess^{next} if they did not attend or log into the test. School staff will then need to enter the [RNVTA](#) code #10 in SIS after the testing window has ended.

Students who start testing but don't return:

If a student starts testing but does not return, mark the unfinished units as complete so that you can stop the session. Each content area is treated separately.



Illinois Assessment of Readiness

Test Irregularities:

School staff need to complete a test irregularity report and send to ISBE if there is an issue with the administration of the test(s) to a student(s). If an issue arises, and school staff can remedy the issue then school staff do not need to complete and submit an irregularity report. The agency needs a report for test irregularities that arise that could not be corrected by school staff.

Fillable irregularity report is posted on il.mypearsonsupport.com.

Traditional email is not a secure way to send in irregularity reports

To send an electronic file of an irregularity report, use the ISBE Attachment Manager under *Quicklinks* on the Illinois State Board of Education website Click on *Send ISBE a file* link, once there, complete the fields, select **IAR Irregularities** or **Victoria Henderson** from the *ISBE eMail Name* drop down menu, and then press *Submit*.

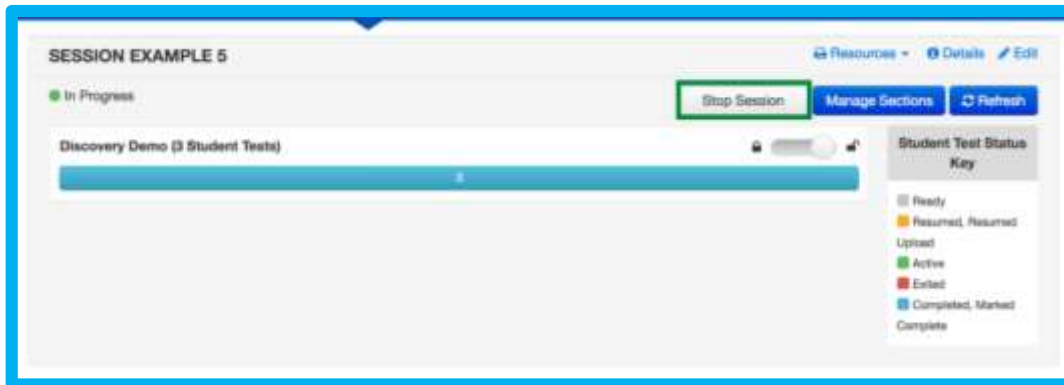


Illinois Assessment of Readiness

Remember to Stop ALL Test Sessions once you have concluded your testing:

All test units in the session have to be completed or marked complete before a session can be stopped. If there are student tests in the session that were never started, remember to remove the test(s) from the session, so the session can be stopped. Student tests are not submitted for scoring until the session is in **Stop** status.

Illinois Assessment of Readiness

Prepare Materials at the end of Testing

Immediately after the final unit is administered, collect the test materials below from Test Administrators:

Secure test materials that must be securely destroyed:

- Student testing Tickets
- Student rosters containing TestNav usernames and passwords
- Any reports or other documents that contain personally identifiable student information
- All scratch paper
- All printed mathematics sheets

Immediately after the final unit is administered, the below list needs to be collected from Test Administrator:

Secure test materials that must be shipped back to Pearson:

- Accommodated paper test booklets, if applicable. Braille and large print test booklets must be transcribed (Section 5.2.2) and returned (Section 4.2.4) in order to be scored.
- Human Reader scripts
- Tactile graphics

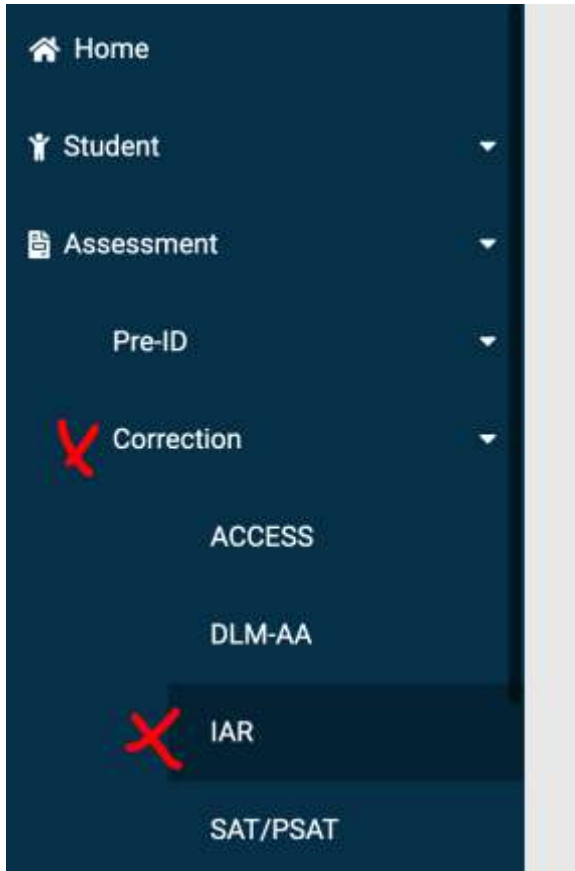


IAR Corrections

Beginning in spring 2017, ISBE began requiring all public-school students in grade 11 to take the SAT with Essay, unless the student takes the grade 11 DLM-AA instead. Additionally, in spring 2021 some public-school students in grade 12 may also be allowed to take the SAT or DLM-AA, as appropriate. Please see the [flowchart document](#) 📄 for details about which grade 12 students are allowed to test.

Beginning in spring 2019, ISBE began assessing all public-school students in grade 9 with the PSAT 8/9 and all public-school students in grade 10 with the PSAT 10, unless the student takes the grade 9 or 10 DLM-AA instead.

SAT/PSAT Spring 2021 Announcements

- As the result of deep collaboration and engagement with Illinois schools and districts, ISBE adopted the following changes for the 2021 state assessments related to the SAT with Essay, PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9. ISBE has:
 - Omitted the essay portion of the SAT (for both spring and fall administration).
 - Eliminated the PSAT 8/9 and PSAT 10 (for spring 2021).
- PSAT 10 and PSAT 8/9 test materials are not available to any schools for spring 2021, and schools are not to administer the essay portion of the SAT to any student.
- Additionally, current grade 12 students are not required to take the SAT as a graduation requirement. Current grade 12 students were allowed to take the SAT in spring 2021, but their participation was optional.
- All district superintendents were invited to choose to administer the SAT in spring 2021 or fall 2021. Your district will provide you with information regarding this decision.



Upcoming ISBE-Provided Dates

- ***Fall 2021 SAT dates apply only to schools in districts that did not test in spring and elected to shift testing from spring to fall.***
 - *SAT primary test date: Wednesday, October 13, 2021*
 - *SAT makeup test date: Thursday, October 28, 2021*
 - *SAT accommodated testing window: October 13-26, 2021*
- ***Spring 2022 SAT/PSAT dates are not yet determined but will be posted on the [SAT/PSAT website](#) as soon as they are available.***

- Every fall, the administrator listed in ISBE's Entity Profile System (EPS) receives an email invitation from College Board to establish their site as a test site for spring testing. Please ensure that data in ISBE's EPS is accurate!

- Staff with access to the secure SIS may now enter Reason for No Valid Test Attempt ([RNVTA](#)) codes for grade 11 students who did not test - this opened in SIS on Wednesday, April 28, 2021.
- SIS entered [RNVTA 50](#) for all grade 12 records since current grade 12 students are allowed but not required to be tested.
- If any RNVTA is added to a student record and a score is later matched to that student record, SIS will automatically remove the RNVTA.
- SAT scores are scheduled to be posted in SIS the week of July 26, 2021.

Illinois Science Assessment

- Students in grades 5,8, & 11 not taking the DLM-AA are rostered to take the ISA using SIS
- Student rostering will occur at the serving school
- 3 Sections - 32 items each section
- Estimated time - 40-60 minutes per section
- 1/3 Life, 1/3 Physical, 1/3 Earth Space Science aligned with the IL-NGSS Learning Standards
- All 3 domains in each section

Testing Windows-

- Superintendents have already selected an ISA test window for their districts.
- ISA Spring testing window:
 - March 15th – June 30th
- ISA Fall testing window:
 - August 9th – October 8th



No Remote Testing

- Testing must be done in constant line of sight of a qualified test administrator. This does **NOT** include remote software solutions. The TA must be co-located with the tester.
- The only way a student can test from home is in a homebound situation where a qualified test administrator is at the student's location.

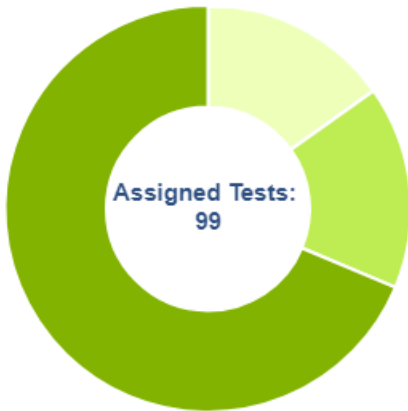

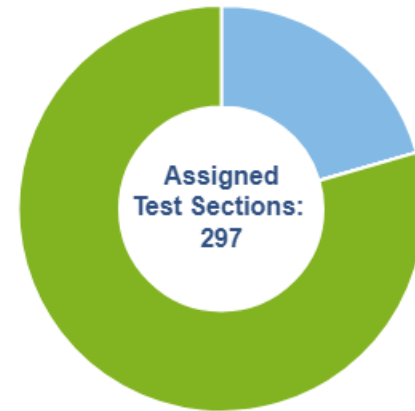

ACCESS Common Questions

- What should be done for remote students who do not come in to test? - Enter a [not-tested](#) reason in SIS during ACCESS Corrections (**July 1 to December 21, 2021**). Nothing needs to be done in WIDA AMS.
- Can ELs who test this spring test in the fall next year? **No, fall testing is an extension of spring testing for 2021. ACCESS testing for SY2022 is expected to be Jan 12 to Feb 15, 2022, with staggered optional windows, as in the past.**
- What if there are Pre-ID labels on test booklets that are not going to be used? - **Cover the Pre-ID label with a *Do Not Process* label and return it according to the instructions in the ACCESS Test Coordinator Manual.**



WIDA Screener for Kindergarten

WIDA has released a new screening tool for Kindergarten. Illinois will continue using WIDA MODEL for Kindergarten through the remainder of SY2021 and into SY2022.

Adding a new screener requires updating State rules and data systems. Watch for a fall announcement of implementation.

Once available, the kit may be downloaded and printed locally, or it can be ordered pre-printed from the WIDA Store.

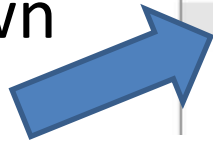

- Students won't appear on this report *unless* they are enrolled and rostered to at least 1 subject

- Instructional Number of Testlets – Displays number of testlets administered during the *optional* instructionally embedded assessment
- End of Year Number of Testlets – Displays number of testlets administered during the Spring/Fall window.
- Field Test Number of Testlets – Either 0 or 1 for each student in each subject

After DLM-AA Testing Is Completed

- Use the *DLM Test Administration Monitoring Report* to ensure students completed all tests.
- Provide RNVTA codes for any missing test scores when corrections window opens (July 1, 2021).
- Obtain individual score reports from Kite Educator Portal (mid-December 2021).



DLM-AA Corrections



- Corrections window for DLM-AA has an opening date of July 1, 2021.
- If a district opted to test during the Spring window and students did not test, they will *not* be able to test during the Fall window.
- Missing test scores are accounted for with the relevant RNVTA code.
- In the Student Information System, corrections are found under Assessment-Correction-DLM-AA.

Is KIDS required this year?

ISBE is requiring districts to collect the same 14 required measures as in past years:

For FY 20-21, the State Superintendent of Education has determined that:

- districts will begin the 40-day observation window and data collection period **on the first day of in-person instruction**.
- The **KIDStech data entry window will remain open until June 30, 2021**, to allow maximum time to enter student ratings.



KIDS and Remote Learning:

- For students learning **100% remote (remain remote for the entire school year)**, ISBE anticipates that some teachers will be unable to collect all 14 required KIDS measures and **is not requiring the completion of KIDS** in those cases.
- **HOWEVER:** If teachers **are** able to rate students on any of the 14 required measures while students are in remote learning situations by the same methods as in past years, they should not automatically exclude those students from the data set.



KIDS Data for 20-21, So Far...

- **761** Illinois School Districts have a Kindergarten Program;
- **710** of those districts have entered KIDS data for school year 20-21.

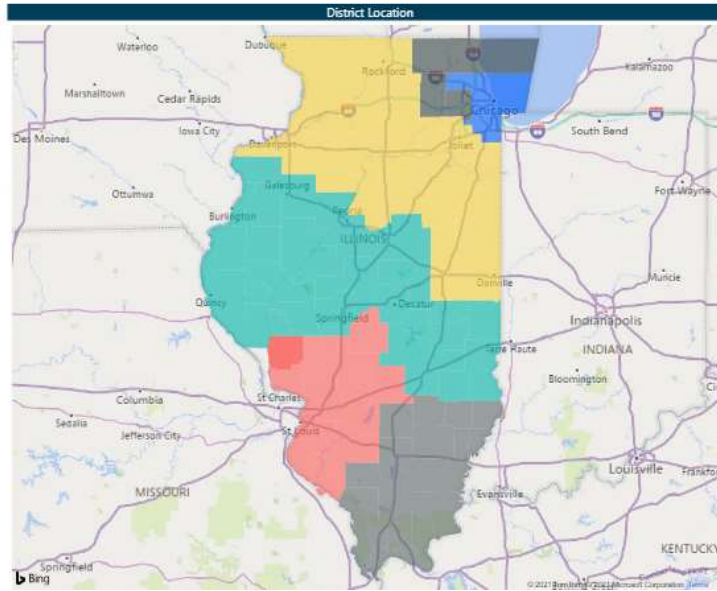
