ISBE's Entity Profile System (EPS)

- ISBE's Entity Profile System (EPS) serves as the directory for Illinois schools and districts, and most IWAS systems use information from EPS for important notifications, updates, due dates, etc.
- Districts should identify the name and contact for each test coordinator currently listed in EPS.
 Note: Two new contact types have been added: "District Test Coordinator" and "High School Test Coordinator."
- The same person may be identified for multiple contact types, based on the work they perform in the school/district (e.g., the principal may be listed as the ISA Coordinator).
- It is also important to identify a "Director of Technology," as this contact will receive assessment technology alerts, including those for NAEP. Note that individuals under this contact type need not have this specific job title locally.

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ISA Testing Information

- The ISA Blueprint is the same as last year.
- The ISA is made up of 3 units.
- Each unit contains 30 multiple choice or technology enhanced interactions and 2 constructed response items which require a student written response.
- The domains of Life, Physical & Earth Space science are evenly distributed throughout all 3 units of the exam.

ISA Testing Information

- Each unit takes approximately 45-50 minutes to complete. If you have students that you know will take more than the average 50 minutes to complete a unit, we suggest creating a separate proctor group for those students to allow for more efficient scheduling.
- There is a 2-hour time limit for any one unit of the exam, that is monitored by the test administrator.
- The Text-to-Speech (TTS) feature is automatically available to all students in the testing platform.
- Please do not select Assistive Technology –Screen Reader in accommodations for the TTS function.

HOT TOPICS

- 1. VOID and RETEST-Accommodations errors must be caught early to be considered for a void/retest. Please allow students to finish testing with the incorrect accommodation and then submit an irregularity form.
- 2. Apply RNVTA Codes-For students not participating in testing due to being homebound, hospitalization, etc. Accountability Codes Guidance
- **3. TRANSFER STUDENTS**-Once the student is visible on your roster and they HAVE NOT finished testing, provide them with the test code for the proctor group you wish for them to join. This will pull the student into the new proctor group and allow them to continue testing with your school.
 - 4. **SUBMIT BUTTON-**Pearson will submit ALL tests at the end of the testing window.
 - 5. MAKE UP TESTING-You have two options for make-up testing. Make Up Guidance Document
 - Test students from the existing proctor group
 - Use the **Move To Section** button to take students back to the section that was missed and provide the seal code for that section.
 - If a student leaves due to illness, early dismissal, etc. --Please allow students to finish testing during a makeup session.
 - 6. **RECOVER TIME LOSS**-Students must be allowed the full time designated for each section. If that time was compromised for any reason, then it must be recovered to avoid an irregularity.
 - Use the **Move To Section** button to move students back to the section that was affected by lost time.
 - ADDING ACCOMMODATIONS-A test that has been started <u>cannot be altered</u>. You must contact ISBE for guidance on next steps.

In the event of a testing irregularity, school staff has 5 business days to submit a test irregularity form to the Assessment Department at the Illinois State Board of Education. Please provide details of the incident and what steps school staff took to correct incident. The Irregularity Report can be submitted electronically through the ISBE **Attachment Manager** under *System Quick Links* on the Illinois State Board of Education website.

MATERIAL RETURN

With the close of the computer testing window next week, the test coordinator must do the following:

- Destroy scratch paper written on by students and IAR-supplied mathematics reference sheets written on by students.
- Destroy all printed student test tickets, rosters with TestNav username and passwords, any reports or other documents that contain personally identifiable student information.
- Recycle Test Administration and Proctoring Manuals, blank or unused scratch paper, and unused IAR-supplied mathematics reference sheets.
- ✓ Complete the Post-Test Certification Form.
- ✓ Maintain all testing documentation for 3 years.

For students who were able to start but not finish the assessment: RESUME ACT with Writing - Accountability/College-Reportable Any student who was able to access a test may resume from wherever they exited the test. This option may work best for those who made some degree of progress and prefer to complete their original attempt. ACT with Writing tests that are **resumed must be completed during the current testing window** (4.8-4.18), because a different test form is used in each window.

Schools do not need to resume all students at the same time on the same date, so long as each student is allotted their remaining time. Prior to resuming testing, ensure all students in a room are resuming in the same section. If necessary, reassign students who are in different sections to other test rooms. Verify all students in a room have completed the same section before moving on.

For students who were able to start but not finish the assessment:

RE-REGISTER ACT with Writing Accountability/College-Reportable

A school may request that **any number of students** that were impacted on April 8 be reregistered either to the current testing window (Window 2 4.8-4.18) or the final testing window (Window 3 4.22-5.2). As with option 1, students re-registered must begin and end their testing in the selected test window, as each test window has a unique form. Re-registration enables students to start an entirely new test. However, it also **requires the student to retake the entire test**, regardless of how much was completed in an earlier attempt. These students also need to be assigned to a new room and will need a new authorization ticket.

Re-registering a student renders the first attempt non-reportable. If you reregister a group of students but there are students that are unable to retest due to absence or some other factor, the original attempt can be retrieved for those students. There is no option to "choose" the better of two scores, however.



For students who were not able to start the assessment:

BEGIN ACT with Writing in Test Window 2 - Accountability/College-Reportable Students who were not able to login into TestNav and begin testing may simply begin their testing in this testing window or be reassigned to the third test window. ACT with Writing tests **begun in a test window must be completed during that same test window** (e.g., 4.8-4.18), because each test window uses a unique test form.

BEGIN ACT with Writing in Test Window 3 Accountability/College-Reportable Students who were not able to login into TestNav may be reassigned to the third test window. ACT with Writing tests **begun in a test window must be completed during that same test window** (e.g., testing days between 4.22 – 5.2), because each test window uses a unique test form. This option does NOT require you to re-register a student. however.



Combine any of these options:

- A school may utilize **any combination of beginning, resuming, or re-register** students in order to complete required testing.
- Schools may allow students who wish to complete their original attempt to do so using the appropriate remaining timing. This action must be completed during the current window (Window 2 testing days between 4.8 – 4.18).
- A school may also allow other students to re-reregister and restart the test either during the current window (Window 2 testing days between 4.8 – 4.18) or the final testing window (Window 3 testing days between 4.22 – 5.2).
- Different students could be assigned to different windows according to the capacity of the school.



Testing Disruption on April 8, 2025 ADDITIONAL ATTEMPTS OPTION

- If students at your school scheduled to take the ACT with Writing were impacted by the testing disruption on April 8 and would like to have a supplemental testing experience on a national ACT test date for purposes of receiving a college-reportable score, ACT is offering a remedy.
- These additional testing attempts offered by ACT will not fulfill a student's diploma requirement, nor will they be used for accountability.
- To request individual student vouchers for a June or July national ACT test, school staff will be asked to complete a survey by April 25, 2025.

ACT with Writing, PreACT Secure, PreACT 9 Secure

The procurement process for the high school accountability assessment has concluded. As the result, Illinois will transition to the ACT, beginning with the 2024-25 school year. Students in grade 11, and grade 12 as required as will participate in the ACT with Writing which includes tests in English. Mathematics. Reading, Science, and Writing. Students in grade 8 will participate in the PreACT 9 Secure and those in grade 10 will participate in the PreACT Secure, each of which includes tests in English. Mathematics. Reading, and Science, School staff will administer these assessments online. Accommodations and EL supports are available. Scores from the administration of the ACT with Writing (It taken with ACT Standard Time or ACT-approved accommodations) can be used by students for a variety of purposes including college admission.

Student Mobility During Testing

- 1. Add the new student's enrollment in SIS.
- 2. Edit the new student's Testing RCDTS, as needed, in SIS Pre-ID.

Note: If the student's previous school has not yet exited them from SIS, proceed to step #3 below and let SIS "catch up" as soon as possible.

- 3. Find the student in ACT Now using the "Student Transfer" functionality.
- 4. If a "Student Transfer" search does not find the student in ACT Now, manually enroll the new student directly in ACT Now.
- 5. Add a Test Event to the student in ACT Now.

Eligible Students

- Students in grades 9 and 10 will participate in the PreACT 9 Secure and the PreACT Secure, respectively.
- Students in grade 11, and <u>grade 12 as required</u>, will participate in the ACT with Writing. Students repeating grade 11 who have tested previously must test for accountability but have met the separate but related diploma requirement.
- Students who are completely or partially homeschooled **do not participate unless** they
 are receiving instruction from the public school in a tested content area. Note: These
 students will be included on the Pre-ID file and loaded into ACT Now. Apply <u>RNVTA 16</u>
 during the correction window for those not required to test. For students who test,
 they will take the entire test, and staff must contact ISBE after scores are posted to
 suppress data for subjects in which they are not receiving instruction.
- All **English learners**, including those for whom it is their first year in a U.S. school, must participate in all parts of the assessment, assigned based on their grade level in SIS.
- All **foreign exchange students** whom your school has classified as being in grade 9, 10, or 11, must participate.

Digital Testing Window "Test Event" Options: **Test Event 1:** March 25-28 and March 31-April 4, 2025 **Test Event 2:** April 8-11 and April 14-18, 2025 **Test Event 3:** April 22-25 and April 28-May 2, 2025

Each two-week "Test Event" begins on a Tuesday. All Test Events may be used. *IMPORTANT: A student with multi-day testing must begin and complete testing in the same Test Event.*

ACT Writing

 As in the past, the writing component is mandatory. While the score was not included in the ELA score previously, ACT renders an ELA score that is a composite of the ACT English, ACT reading, and ACT writing components. Participation in all three components is required to generate an ACT ELA score and to earn ELA participation credit for purposes of accountability.

<u>Understanding ACT ELA Scores</u>

The ACT[®] English language arts (ELA) score measures overall performance on the ACT English, ACT reading, and ACT writing tests. The ACT ELA score weights the English, reading, and writing scores approximately equally and is therefore reported only for students who take all three tests. This brief describes how the ACT ELA score is calculated and presents information for interpreting the score.

Students who are currently assigned to Test Event 3 should remain assigned to Test Event 3. Any students who are currently unassigned should be assigned to Test Event 3.

Spring 2025 Accommodations and EL Supports

- Accommodations for students with disabilities and supports for English learners (ELs) and are allowed for the ISBE-Provided PreACT 9 Secure, PreACT Secure, and ACT with Writing.
- Accommodations needs must be documented in an Individualized Education Program (IEP) or Section 504 Plan, and students who require English learner supports must be identified as English learners in ISBE's SIS.
- Accommodations and supports for English learners must be requested only for those who will take the ACT with Writing.
- Please note: Unlike the ACT with Writing, the use of accommodations and EL supports for the PreACT 9 Secure and the PreACT Secure do <u>not</u> require ACT authorization.



Important Note about Designated Supports

- ACT accommodations and support request responses may have indicated denial of certain accommodation and/or support requests that are considered as designated supports for a state administration of the ACT with Writing.

Spring 2025 EL Supports ACT with Writing, PreACT Secure, PreACT 9 Secure

Spring 2025 Accommodations and EL Supports ACT with Writing: Options after February 7, 2025

Option 1: Qualified Exception to the Deadline

The Qualified Exception to the Deadline (QED) option applies only if the student's situation satisfies specific criteria and they require the use of accommodations and/or EL supports; scores **are eligible to be college reportable**.

Option 2: Standard Time Testing

The Standard Time Testing option applies to any student who will elect not to use accommodations and/or EL supports for which they are eligible; scores **are eligible to be college reportable**.

Option 3: Non-College Reportable

The Non-College Reportable (NCR) option applies to all other students who require the use of accommodations and/or EL supports; scores **are not eligible to be college reportable** but will be reported to ISBE for accountability use only. This option requires students to test on **paper**.

Details for each option are provided in this document.



Pre-ID in ISBE's Student Information System (SIS) Paper Accommodations for ACT with Writing IMPORTANT

- ACT offers both online and paper versions for most accommodations (e.g., text-to-speech for online and human reader for paper).
- The **test format** (i.e., online or paper) for ACT with Writing is captured in the student registration file from SIS, *not* in the approved accommodation from ACT's TAA system.
- Therefore, if the accommodation that was approved for a student for ACT with Writing must be in a paper format, schools must identify this in the SIS Pre-ID file and directly in ACT Now. A screen shot of how to edit this in the SIS Pre-ID is on <u>slide #13</u> from the December 4, 2024, SIS webinar.



Student Creation of a MyACT Account is Optional

ISBE is working with ACT to provide screen shots of the limited details students will see when associating a MyACT account to the spring 2025 ISBE-provided administration.

Homebound Students

- Homebound students will not test
 Students must test in person, at school
- The student can be left as a student in Kite
- Districts who have a homebound student who did not test will enter an RNVTA 02 during the correction window.
 - This code makes the student not included in participation and proficiency calculations.



Need to Re-Roster Students?

- Students can be moved to a different teacher's roster, even if testing has already begun
- See the section, "Change Roster Data or Remove Data," in the Data Management Manual (page 151)
- If student needs to be moved outside of your organization, contact <u>Pam</u> <u>Hartwig</u> for assistance





How to Handle "No Response"

- All testlets at the lowest linkage levels and a few teacheradministered testlets at higher linkage levels have the "no response" option.
 - Not all testlets include a "no response" as an option
- If the student does not answer and "no response" is not an option, the teacher should leave the question unanswered.
- Whether answered with "no response" or left unanswered, the question will be scored as incorrect.



Red Lock Screen

- If a teacher experiences a locked screen while in Kite Student Portal, they need to call DLM support for assistance.
 - DLM will provide a password to unlock the screen.
- This only appears on Macs when Student Portal is not closed correctly, or the machine is shut down while Student Portal is still open.

Field Test Testlets

- After a student completes all required operational testlets in a subject, the student may receive zero or one field test testlet in each subject in which the student is rostered.
- The linkage level of the field test testlet may be one linkage level below, one above, or the same as the student's operational testlets.
- The naming convention for field test testlets always begins with FT SP.
- Field test testlet results are *not factored* into the Individual Student Score Reports.
- Field test items are required for completion.



Spring Teacher Survey

- This survey is located under the Other tab within KITE Student Portal. It contains 3 blocks of items.
- The best time to complete the survey is when the student has completed testing.
- Test coordinators can review the survey questions by contacting the Assessments department.

Finding Missing ACCESS Scores

Steps to Find Missing ACCESS Scores

- Check the Unassigned Records Report in SIS
- Check that test sessions were completed in WIDA AMS (online administration)
- Check that all paper materials were returned to DRC. If you know the test booklet numbers, that is one way that DRC or ISBE can search for results.
- Check whether results were assigned to another student
 - $\circ~$ A duplicate ACCESS test record exists for another student
 - A student whom you know did not test has scores
- Students that transferred in may have results reported to another district
- If the test booklet may not have been labeled, DRC can do a test booklet search for a fee (booklet number not required, but very helpful).

If the student was not enrolled or marked as an EL, the record cannot be assigned until the SIS record is updated.



- Please retain a copy of BOTH certificates of completion for your records.


