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The ACT with Writing

All public-school students in grade 11, and grade 12 as required, will participate in The ACT with Writing in spring 2025 unless they take DLM-AA, the state's alternate assessment, instead.

The ACT with Writing is administered online.

Paper testing is available only in rare cases as an accommodation.

Scores from the administration of the ACT with Writing (if taken with ACT Standard Time or ACT-approved accommodations) can be used by students for a variety of purposes including college admission, scholarships, and NCAA eligibility.

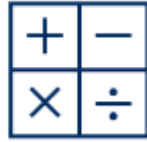

Four Free Score Sends

- Students may request to send data from the spring 2025 ISBE-provided ACT with Writing administration to up to four colleges/scholarship agencies. *Sending scores to colleges/scholarship agencies is optional.*
 - Closer to the test date, ACT will share details about how students may make these selections for free without having to create an optional ACT student account.
 - If students optionally elect to create an ACT student account prior to testing, they can select where to send their scores no later than two days after they complete testing.

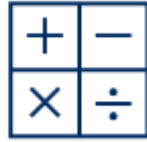

Spring 2025 ACT Test Event Dates

ACT with Writing (grade 11 students; grade 12 as required):

- **Test Event 1:** March 25–28, March 31–April 4, 2025
- **Test Event 2:** April 8–11, April 14–18, 2025
- **Test Event 3:** April 22–25, April 28–May 2, 2025

Please note that each Test Event begins on a Tuesday.

Monday testing **is** available during the second week of each Test Event.

Prior to testing—in ACT Now—schools will be asked to identify one Test Event for initial testing to support the timely receipt of any paper accommodated materials. Testing may be scheduled anytime within the selected Test Event.

If necessary for any reason (e.g., change in testing date, makeup testing, testing transfer students who haven't tested), schools may test in any subsequent Test Event. Students must begin and complete testing during the same Test Event.

ACT will provide a comprehensive Schedule of Events (SOE) that will detail all activities from school setup to reporting and is scheduled to be posted on the [ISBE website](#) by November 15, 2024.

School Setup

- ISBE provides school information to ACT from its Entity Profile System (EPS).
- Anticipated **the week of November 4**, ACT will send an email to the Superintendent, Principal, District Test Coordinator, and High School Test Coordinator listed in EPS to access and create an account in **ACT Now**, the test administration setup application. Designated school staff will then begin setting up for testing. Setup activities include, but are not limited to, selecting the Test Event Dates for ACT with Writing and adding staff contact information.

Accommodations and English Learner (EL) Supports for Illinois Students

- Accommodations for students with disabilities are allowed for the ISBE-Provided PreACT 9 Secure, PreACT Secure, and ACT with Writing only for students with accommodations needs documented in an Individualized Education Program (IEP) or Section 504 Plan.
- Supports for English Learners (ELs) are allowed for the ISBE-Provided PreACT 9 Secure, PreACT Secure, and ACT with Writing only for students identified as English learners in ISBE's Student Information System.
- Please note: Unlike the ACT with Writing, the use of accommodations and EL supports for the PreACT 9 Secure and the PreACT Secure **do not** require ACT authorization.

Accommodations for The ACT with Writing

- The ACT **Test Accessibility and Accommodations (TAA)** System is used to request authorization for accommodations and EL supports for the ACT with Writing.
 - Test Accommodations Coordinators (TACs) will access TAA by creating user accounts at success.act.org.
- Students who have tested with accommodations for ACT National or ACT District testing will **not** need a new request to be submitted on their behalf if nothing additional is needed. However, staff responsible for submitting requests must associate Illinois Spring 2025 to the existing request.
- School administrators should watch for information from ACT and ISBE with direction about when to begin submitting requests for ACT-authorized accommodations.
 - An On Demand version of the ACT with Writing Accommodations Webinar held on October 17, 2024, is available now.
 - The Schedule of Events for the ACT with Writing will be provided by ACT and will include timelines (including deadlines) for managing and requesting ACT-authorized accommodations. This will be posted on the [ISBE website](https://www.isbe.net) by early November 2024.

Creating an account in TAA

- School staff member(s) who are responsible for requesting accommodations and EL supports should be identified as the test accommodations coordinator (TAC). Schools may have more than one TAC. TACs must create an account in TAA.
- Go to success.act.org. If you do not see the TAA tile, follow these steps to request access.
 - Select the **Manage My Access** button.
 - Select **Request More Access** from the dropdown menu.
 - Begin typing the name of your organization in the field provided. When you see your school name/address, select it from the list.
 - Select the **Submit** button.
 - Select **Test Accommodations**.
IMPORTANT: If you do not select the Test Accommodations role, your access request will not be submitted properly.
 - Select **Request Access**
- You will receive an email from ACT notifying you that you have been granted access within 3-5 business days, although confirmation can happen faster.

The *Accessibility Supports Guide* helps educational teams select appropriate accessibility supports and accommodations for their students for use during the test. *Accessibility supports* refer to systems, tools, and accommodations that remove barriers for the entire testing population, including examinees identified as having disabilities and English learners (ELs), as well as examinees who do not have a disability. All examinees need to be able to communicate fairly and effectively what they know and can do when they take a test. ACT provides accessibility supports that include the following:

- Universal supports
- Designated supports
- English learner supports
- Accommodations

PreACT 9 Secure and PreACT Secure Accommodations and English Learner (EL) Supports

- Testing staff will assign accommodations and English learner supports in ACT Now – no ACT Authorization is required in order for these accommodations to be applied to students' tests.
 - ACT's TAA System is **not** used for PreACT 9 Secure and PreACT Secure.
 - Accommodations and supports should align with student accommodations/supports plans.
 - The Schedule of Events will provide timeframes for when to assign accommodations.
- An updated *Accessibility Supports Guide* will be available no later than January 15, 2025, for spring 2025 testing. This guide will cover the types of accommodations and supports available for the PreACT 9 Secure and PreACT Secure.
 - The supports listed in the current [PreACT Secure Accessibility Supports Guide](#) will be available in spring 2025.

ACT Now and Test Center Manager (TCM) Overview



What are ACT Now and Test Center Manager (TCM)?

- **ACT Now** is the application used by districts and schools to manage organizations, users, and students.
- **Test Center Manager (TCM)** is the application that testing staff will use to manage test center information and administer The ACT with Writing, PreACT 9 Secure and PreACT Secure. The TCM application streamlines test day activities, simplifies staff training, and provides data to ACT in real time.
 - Using TCM, **test coordinators** will:
 - Build virtual rooms for student testing.
 - Oversee test center activities during a test event.
 - Using TCM, **room supervisors** will:
 - Read verbal instructions.
 - Complete room seating charts.
 - Monitor the timing of the tests.
 - Log irregularities on test day.

Terms to Know



- **ACT Now:** The website used to manage organizations, users, and students.
- **Test Center Manager (TCM):** The application that testing staff will use to manage test center information and administer The ACT with Writing, PreACT 9 Secure and PreACT Secure. Users launch TCM via their ACT Now accounts.
- **TAA:** Test Accessibility and Accommodations System—used to request authorization for accommodations for The ACT with Writing.
- **Test Event:** All testing activities related to a testing window.

Terms to Know



- **Users and Roles**

- **District Test Coordinator:** District-level oversight
- **School Test Coordinator:** School-level oversight—manages students and test event staff in ACT Now, plus all test event details in TCM
- **Test Accommodations Coordinator:** Responsible for managing student accommodations on behalf of students in ACT Now and TCM
- **Test Event Staff:** Room supervisors, room proctors, and roving proctors

Note: Users will be invited to ACT Now either by the state or by their district or school. When users are invited, they will receive an email asking them to create their account. Users access TCM after they create their ACT Now account by navigating to TCM from ACT Now.

Administration activities—including inviting users—will begin:

The ACT with Writing: early November

PreACT 9 Secure and PreACT Secure: mid-January

Assigning Roles

- Superintendents and Principals will both receive the District Test Coordinator role to appoint School Test Coordinators, since roles cannot be assigned laterally. *Note that Principals will have access only to their school-level information.*
- ISBE has added two new contact types in its Entity Profile System (EPS) to facilitate assigning additional individual(s) to the roles of District Test Coordinator and High School Test Coordinator. ISBE will transmit these contacts to ACT on a regular basis.

TestNav Overview

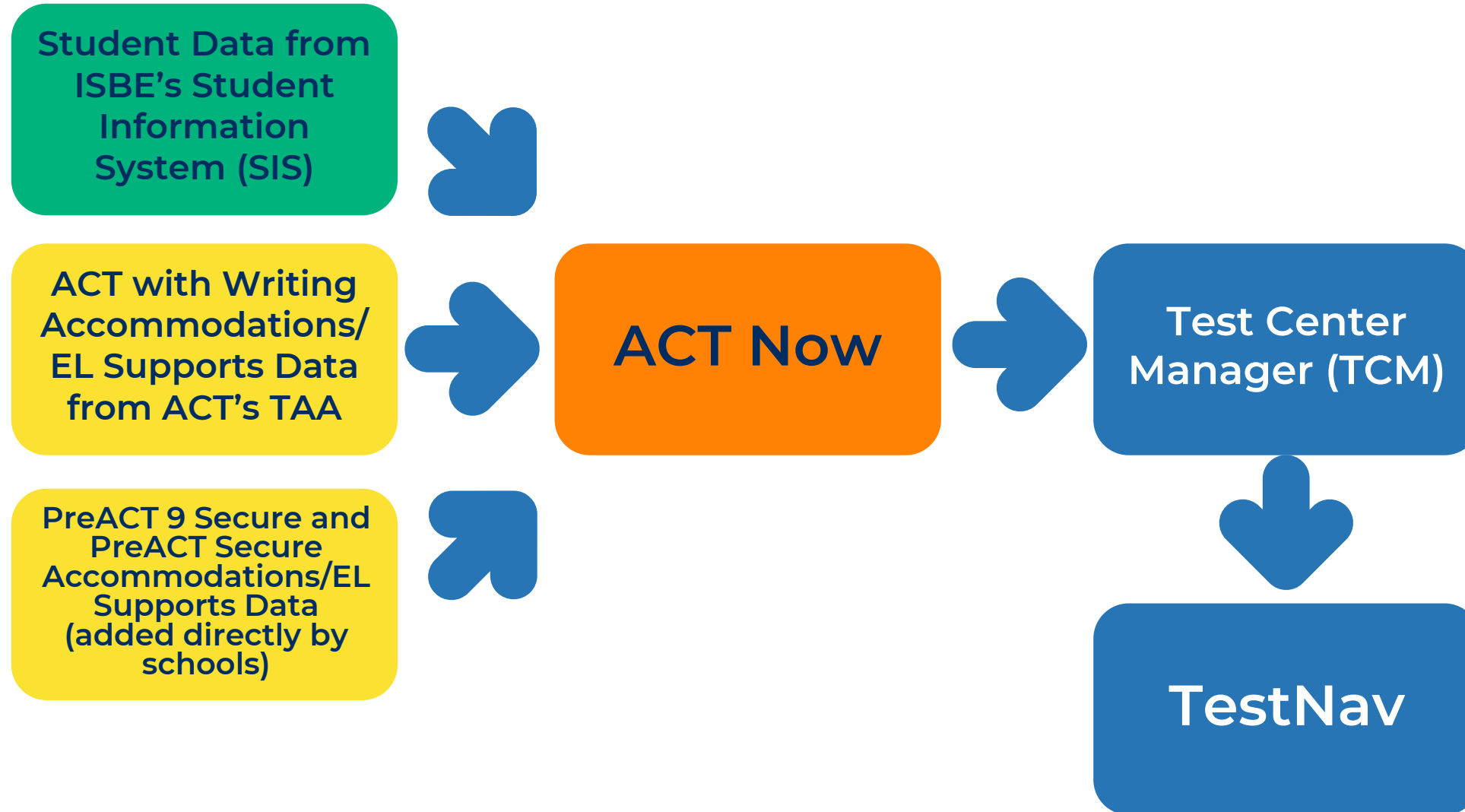
