

## **Administrators' Back to School Tips: Special Education**

<b>Ensure</b> that all children and families feel respected and welcome in the school, even if
children come from outside the school's attendance zone or if they are participating in
community-based programs.
<b>Ensure</b> that all school staff members, including specialists, feel welcome and respected.
Welcome and ensure access for all children with disabilities to any school-sponsored
program outside the typical instructional day (clubs, sports, tutorials, special events).
<b>Set</b> the tone and establish a climate of respect for diverse populations.
Demonstrate and encourage practices that respect children's cultural and ethnic
backgrounds.
Ensure that the contributions of all children and their families are acknowledged,
including children with disabilities.
Maintain ongoing communication with special education administrators for professional
planning, transportation and placement logistics, solution-focused collaboration and
support for all students, regardless of individual needs.
<b>Review</b> the ISBE planning calendars for important due dates and upcoming events.
Encourage the capabilities and emphasize the worth of all individuals.
