

Administrators' Back to School Tips: Title I

Congress and ISBE expect schools that receive federal funds will ensure parents are actively involved and knowledgeable about their schools and their children's education.

Develop a district-level parent involvement policy.
Develop a school-level parent involvement policy for each Title I school.
Verify every school receiving Title I funds (including private school students receiving
Title I services) has developed a school-parent compact.
Notify families that they have the right to request specific information about the
professional qualifications of their child's classroom teacher(s). This notification should
inform families that they can request
 □ Whether the teacher has met state qualifications and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction. □ Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or conditional certification. □ The baccalaureate degree major and other graduate certification or degree of the teacher and the field of discipline of the certification and/or degree. □ The information must also disclose whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals.
Schedule and plan an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of the parent
involvement policy in improving the academic quality of the schools served with Title I,
Part A funds.
Schedule and plan an Annual Title I Parent Meeting to review policies, the requirements
and components of Title L and to involve parents in decision-making
