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he mission of the IARSS is to support the role of the Regional Superintendents of Schools and Assistant Regional Superintendents and of Regional Offices of Education in Illinois, personally and professionally, in their efforts to promote quality education for the school children and citizens of Illinois, to provide educational leadership, to impact public policy and to deliver educational services effectively for the benefit of Illinois school districts, other educational entities and educational system clients of all ages.

SERVICES THAT YOUR REGIONAL OFFICE OF EDUCATION PROVIDES...

- Approves the recognition status of public schools.
- Assures local compliance with all state educational mandates.
- Certifies and reviews assignments of all teachers.
- Enforces truancy laws.
- Trains school bus drivers.
- Reviews and monitors teacher in-service and institute programs.
- Provides staff development services in the fundamental learning areas specified by code.
- Reviews and monitors school calendars.
- Collects and allocates institute funds.
- Issues and registers teacher and administrator certificates.
- Develops annually a Regional Improvement Plan of School Services.
- Facilitates local school district needs in developing and meeting district School Improvement Plans.
- Administers the Regional Safe Schools Program for students subject to suspension or expulsion due to violent behavior.
- Provides computer technology programs and services based on school district technology plans.
- Administers the Administrators' Academy for professional development.
- Establishes and maintains a directory of cooperating consultants used by Regional Offices to provide services to school districts.
- Provides for education of gifted children as specified by code.
- Administers GED programs.
- Reviews and monitors all school health/life safety projects, new construction, additions, rehabilitations, repairs, and reconstruction.

- Reviews and approves state and federal grants school districts.
- Acts as a hearing officer in teacher certification suspension procedures.
- Acts as ex-officio secretary to the Regional Boa Trustees and facilitates the work of the trustee all reorganization petitions.
- Prepares all financial records of the Regional C for annual audit by the State Board of Educati and county or counties of the particular region submits reports of same to all interested partiincluding legislators.
- Maintains and updates monthly listings of all unfilled teaching positions within the region.
- Provides information on organ donation to requesting schools.
- Serves as ombudsman for homeless children/ families.
- Constitutes a Regional Professional Developm committee for reviewing teacher certificate ren plan appeals.
- Constitutes a Regional Local Development committee for approving non-public teacher renewal plans and other exempt applicants.
- Reviews and approves health/life safety survey amendments.
 - Serves as a first resort for resolving school district legal disputes; obtaining legal opinions from ISBE legal department.
 - Visits public schools within the re at least once a year noting safety conditions.
 - Fills school board vacancies tha unfilled after 45 days.
