Foreword

This survey was conducted in the fall of 2006 pursuant to HR 1148 to ascertain the need for state assistance to reduce class sizes to no more than 20 students in grades K through 3. Data were collected to determine the number of classrooms that would need funding and the potential cost for this effort.

This survey was based on the assumption that local district administrators will optimize the use of resources at their disposal. Questions on the survey may be directed to Richard Yong of the Data Analysis and Progress Reporting Division at 217/782-3950.

CLASS SIZE SURVEY - 2006-07

A total of 772 districts¹, including 376 elementary and 396 unit districts, were surveyed. Six hundred and nineteen (80.2%) districts indicated that they had classrooms in grades K through 3 with enrollments that exceeded 20 students. This survey found that:

- 1. To reduce class sizes to no more than 20 students in grades K through 3, there is a need to fund another 5,409 classrooms.
- 2. The estimated total cost to reduce class sizes to no more than 20 students in grades K through 3 is \$3.1 billion, of which, \$2.7 would be for providing additional physical classroom space.

I. Classrooms with enrollments exceeding 20 students

Within the 619 districts, there were 18,058 classrooms that had more than 20 students. The data are broken down by grade level below.
