To ensure your School Year 2018 data is accurate in the Illinois Report Card on October 31, 2018, and for Summative Designations, review and finalize your Freshman on Track data.

- 1. Submit all Student Course Assignments.
- 2. Note: Student Course Assignments MUST have a final letter grade before reviewing Advanced Coursework reports. After you have submitted all student course assignments, review the "Freshman on Track" SIS report.
- 3. You can make adjustments to your course assignment data after running the report and looking for errors.

Steps for accessing IWAS and pulling these reports are included at the bottom of this message.

Where does this data come from and who is included in this report?

- This report includes 9<sup>th</sup> grade students enrolled in an Illinois public school on or before 10/02/2017 and exited on or after 5/01/2018 (and not previously enrolled in Grade 9).
- Metric sources include SIS student enrollment and student course assignment data.

Metric criteria include the following.

- Sum of 5 Credits or more (any subject/class) = Passing
- Cannot fail more than 0.5 credit on core subjects (Reading, Math, Science and Social Science)
- Metric does not include summer school terms
- Final Letter Grades
  - Passing

- 14 S (Satisfactory)

- 4. Click on Freshman on Track (Detail).
- 5. Select Report Criteria options are as follows.

- Click on Create PDF Report button to display report.
