Partnering to get more bandwidth for your budget

An affordability project includes using our data transparency tool Compare & Connect K-12 to understand what other districts are paying for services in your surrounding areas. We can also facilitate webinars and regional convenings to meet peers and share data in order to support action for upgrades.

The current state of Illinois K-12 connectivity

We have used the latest public E-rate data to better understand the current state of K-12 connectivity in Illinois. Our findings indicated the following:

- 31% of districts do not meet the 100 kbps per student connectivity target set by the FCC
- 59% of students lack adequate broadband access to support digital learning
- Up to 12% of schools lack scalable connections

We seek to close the digital divide in Illinois through bringing fiber to every school and leveraging price transparency to increase affordability of broadband services.
