

**IMMUNIZATION STATUS OF SCHOOL-
AGE CHILDREN IN ILLINOIS FOR
SCHOOL YEAR 2012-2013**

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FOREWORD

Immunization data are collected annually from Illinois public and nonpublic schools. This report is a compilation of data on the immunization status of school-age children in Illinois for school year 2012-2013. The interpretations and conclusions expressed herein are based on the available data and do not necessarily reflect the official position or policy of the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE). BACKGROUND

As mandated by Section 27-8.1 of the Illinois School Code [105 ILCS 5/27-8.1], all Illinois children must comply with immunization and health examination requirements established by the Illinois Department of Public Health. In addition, the Illinois School Code requires all public and nonpublic schools to submit annually to ISBE completed surveys summarizing the compliance status of enrolled students as of October 15, or as of an earlier date established by the public school district or nonpublic school. This report summarizes the statewide immunization and health examination compliance data. The data submissions used to produce this report are limited to those deemed sufficient by ISBE and approved at an appropriate level by the submitting public school district (for public schools) or nonpublic school.

MAJOR FINDINGS

The 2012-2013 immunization status of school-age children, as reported by Illinois schools, reveals the following facts and figures:

- The compliance level of all students in all reported schools is 97.01%.
- The compliance level of public school students in all reported schools is 96.85%.
- The compliance level of nonpublic school students in all reported schools is 98.48%.
- The data by specific disease category based on the percent of total reported students reveal that no more than 3.23% of reported Illinois students were unprotected and in noncompliance in any of the nine disease categories [polio, DTP/DTaP/Td, Tdap, measles, rubella, mumps, varicella/chickenpox, hepatitis B, and haemophilus influenzae type b (Hib)]. However, varicella/chickenpox, hepatitis B, and Hib percentages are calculated based on the number of children *required to be immunized*. For varicella/chickenpox, 0.68% of the required prekindergarten (preK) through grade 10 students were unprotected and in noncompliance. For hepatitis B, 0.86% of the required preK and grades 5 through 12 children were unprotected and not in compliance. For Hib, 0.51% of the required preschool children were unprotected and not in compliance.
- A statewide total of 68,139 reported students (2.99% of the total reported student enrollment of 2,279,502) were not in compliance with immunization and/or health examination mandates as of October 15, or as of an earlier date established by the public district or nonpublic school. Of this number, 54,495 children were not in compliance with immunization requirements in at least one disease category, while 13,644 were not in compliance with the health examination requirement only.
- Of the 4,397 public schools required to submit data, 397 (9.03%) did not submit.
- There were 403 public schools (9.16%) that had compliance levels of less than 90%.
- Of the 1,626 nonpublic schools required to submit data, 518 (31.86%) did not submit.
- There were 69 nonpublic schools (4.24%) that had compliance levels of less than 90%.

PROCEDURE

Data collection instruments and procedures used to collect immunization and health examination data were developed by ISBE staff in consultation with staff from the Illinois Department of Public Health. The 2012-2013 data collection was conducted using an online system.

School administrators were required to provide information on the total number of children enrolled, the total number of children in compliance, and the total number of children not in compliance for each of the nine disease categories, by grade level. The online immunization survey must be completed annually by November 15.

RESULTS

Compliance Data

Compliance and protection levels for students were calculated based on the information provided by Illinois school officials. Data reported by school officials show overall compliance with the requirements of the student health mandates for both immunizations and health examinations. Students not in compliance are required to be excluded from school until their health examination and immunization records are in compliance with state law. Protection levels refer only to immunizations and denote the reported immunity against specific communicable diseases.

Students were identified as being in compliance with state law if they presented proof of immunizations and/or health examinations, had exemptions for religious or medical reasons on file with the local school authority, or were on an approved schedule for completion of immunizations in a series.

Statewide Compliance

Table 1 in the Appendix (page 6) presents the 2012-2013 compliance levels for all reported school-age children in Illinois. The compliance level of 2,279,502 reported public and nonpublic school children in Illinois is 97.01%. The data show 68,139 children (2.99% of the total student enrollment) were not in compliance with immunization and/or health examination mandates. Of this number, 54,495 (2.39% of the total student enrollment) children were not in compliance with immunization requirements in at least one disease category, while 13,644 (0.60% of the total student enrollment) children were not in compliance with the health examination requirement only. As of October 15, or as of an earlier date established by a public school district or nonpublic school, 9,542 children were excluded from Illinois schools. The number of exclusions continues to be significantly lower than the actual number of children not in compliance. Part of this can be attributed to transfer students without records. Transfer students cannot be excluded from school, but they must be reported noncompliant, because records were not available to document immunization status.

Public School Compliance

For Illinois public schools, the compliance level for the total 2,049,010 reported children is 96.85%. (See Appendix, Table 1, page 6.) Of the 64,633 public school children not in compliance, 51,835 children were not compliant in one or more disease categories, while 12,798 were not in compliance with the health examination requirement only. The number of students excluded from school as of October 15, or as of an earlier date established by a school district, was 9,161.

Of the 4,397 public schools required to submit data, 403 had compliance levels of less than 90%. There were 397 public schools that did not submit data. Illinois law does not require compliance levels of 90% or greater for individual schools within public school districts.

Nonpublic School Compliance

For Illinois nonpublic schools, the compliance level for the total 230,492 reported children is 98.48%. (See Appendix, Table 2, page 6.) Of the 3,506 nonpublic children not in compliance, 2,660 children were not in compliance with immunization requirements in at least one disease category, while 846 children were not in compliance with the health examination requirement only. The number of students excluded from school as of October 15, or as of an earlier date established by a nonpublic school, was 381.

Of the 1,626 nonpublic schools required to submit data, 69 had compliance levels of less than 90%. There were 518 nonpublic schools that did not submit data.

Protection Levels Data

In order to be counted as fully protected, a student must present proof that the immunization series has been completed and/or present verification of immunity. The Illinois Department of Public Health has determined that a 90% protection level against each disease is recommended in order to prevent epidemics.

Statewide Protection

Table 2 in the Appendix (page 7) displays the numbers and protection level percentages of all reported students who are fully protected against the diseases of polio, DTP/DTaP/Td, Tdap, measles, rubella, mumps, varicella/chickenpox, hepatitis B, and Hib. Varicella/chickenpox, Hepatitis B, and Hib protection-level percentages are determined based on the actual number of children required to be immunized. Hepatitis B is required for children in preK and grades 5 through 12. Hib is required only for children between 15-59 months of age entering a school program below the kindergarten level (all preK students). Varicella/chickenpox was required for all students entering preK through grade 10 for the 2012-2013 school year.

The 2012-2013 protection level percentages of all reported students are 98.28% for polio; 97.94% for DTB/DTaP/Td; 95.97% for Tdap; 98.24% for measles; 98.61% for rubella; and 98.61% for mumps. The reported levels of protection for varicella/chickenpox, hepatitis B, and Hib are 98.51%, 98.34%, and 99.14%, respectively, based upon the actual number of children required to be immunized.

The percentage of all reported students who are unprotected and not in compliance with immunization requirements is 3.23% or less across all nine disease categories. The reported percentages of students unprotected and not in compliance are 0.68% for varicella/chickenpox, 0.86% for hepatitis B, and 0.51% for Hib.

Public School Protection

As reported in Table 3 in the Appendix (page 8), the levels of protection for public school students by disease category are 98.36% for polio; 97.97% for DTP/DTaP/Td; 95.98% for Tdap; 98.32% for measles; 98.72% for rubella; and 98.72% for mumps. The reported levels of protection for varicella/chickenpox, hepatitis B, and Hib are 98.65%, 98.42%, and 99.33%, respectively, based upon the actual number of children required to be immunized.

The percentage of all reported public school students who are unprotected and not in compliance with immunization requirements is 3.31% or less across all nine disease categories. The reported percentages of students unprotected and not in compliance are 0.67% for varicella/chickenpox, 0.88% for hepatitis B, and 0.47% for Hib.

Nonpublic School Protection

As reported in Table 4 in the Appendix (page 9), the levels of protection for nonpublic school students by disease category are 97.60% for polio; 97.64% for DTP/DTaP/Td; 96.92% for Tdap; 97.49% for measles; 97.57% for rubella; and 97.56% for mumps. The reported levels of protection for varicella/chickenpox, hepatitis B, and Hib are 97.28%, 97.63%, and 96.70% respectively, based upon the actual number of children required to be immunized.

The percentage of all reported nonpublic school students who are unprotected and not in compliance with immunization requirements is 1.40% or less across all nine disease categories. The reported percentages of students unprotected and not in compliance are 0.72% for varicella/chickenpox, 0.68% for hepatitis B, and 0.96% for Hib.
