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USDA Issued Nationwide Waivers

Issued June 25, 2020 and August 4, 2020 for SY20-21

- Allow **Non-Congregate Feeding** in the Child Nutrition Programs
- Allow **Meal Service Time Flexibility** in the National School Lunch Program, School Breakfast Program, and Child and Adult Care Food Program
- Allow **Parents and Guardians to Pick Up Meals** for Children
- Allow **Offer Versus Serve (OVS) Flexibility for Senior High Schools in the National School Lunch Program** for School Year 2020-21
- Allow **Meal Pattern Flexibility** in the Child Nutrition Programs
- **Onsite Monitoring Requirements** in School Meal Programs

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Illinois Free Lunch and Breakfast Program

School Breakfast and Lunch Program Act

- Per [105 ILCS 125/4](#) and [23 Illinois Administrative Code 305.10](#), every public school, including public special education facilities, must have a free lunch program that provides free lunches (and free breakfasts if a school offers breakfast) to students eligible to receive free meals.

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Hunger-Free Students' Bill of Rights Act

- [PA 100-1092](#) is still in effect for SY2020-21
- Provide meals to students onsite or remote locations
- Only a parent/guardian may be given a balance statement and Household Eligibility Application



ISBE Paying Lanter Delivery Fees

ISBE intends to pay the Lanter Distributing delivery fees associated with USDA Foods, for deliveries during school year 2020-2021 (August through April).

Administrative Review Process

The Administrative Review is an assessment conducted by the Illinois States Board of Education (ISBE) of the School Food Authority's (SFA) administration of the NSLP and SBP, and other school nutrition programs. The objectives of the Administrative are to determine whether the SFA meets program requirements, provide technical assistance, secure any needed corrective action, and assess fiscal action, if applicable.

ISBE must conduct Administrative Reviews of all SFAs participating in the NSLP and/or SBP at least once during each three-year review cycle period, provided that each SFA is reviewed at least once every 4 years.

- **Meat/Meat Alternate**
- **Grains**
- **Fruit**
- **Vegetable**
- **Milk**

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NSLP-Meal Pattern Component- Meat

Meat/Meat Alternate

- **Serving sizes by grade groups**
 - **K-5** 1 oz minimum daily and 8 oz weekly minimum
 - **6-8** 1 oz minimum daily and 9 oz weekly minimum
 - **K-8** 1 oz minimum daily and 9 oz weekly minimum
 - **9-12** 2 oz minimum daily and 10 oz weekly minimum



NSLP-Meal Pattern Component- Grains

Grains may be whole grain, whole grain-rich or enriched.
Half of weekly grains must be whole grain-rich or whole grain, remaining grains must be enriched.

- **Serving sizes by grade groups**
 - **K-5, 6-8, K-8** 1 oz minimum daily and 8 oz weekly minimum
 - **9-12** 2 oz minimum daily and 10 oz weekly minimum

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NSLP-Meal Pattern Component- Fruit

Fruit may be fresh, frozen, canned, dried or juice.

No more than half of fruit may be served as juice over the course of one week.

- **Serving sizes by grade groups**
 - **K-5, 6-8 or K-8** ½ cup minimum daily and 2 ½ cups weekly minimum
 - **9-12** 1 cup minimum daily and 5 cups weekly minimum

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NSLP-Meal Pattern Component-Vegetable

Vegetables may be fresh, frozen, canned, dried or juice.

No more than half of vegetables may be served as juice over the course of one week.

Each vegetable subgroup must be served within the week:
Red/Orange, Dark Green/Leafy, Starchy, Beans/Peas/Legumes and Other

- **Serving sizes by grade groups**
 - **K-5, 6-8 or K-8** $\frac{3}{4}$ cup minimum daily and $3 \frac{3}{4}$ cups weekly minimum
 - **9-12** 1 cup minimum daily and 5 cups weekly minimum

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NSLP-Meal Pattern Component- Milk

Milk may be flavored or unflavored and fat-free or 1%.

Two varieties of milk must be offered daily.

Milk may be served in bulk for remote meal access when multiple days/meals are being provided.

- **Serving sizes for all grade group**
 - 1 cup minimum daily and 5 cups weekly minimum

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SBP-Meal Pattern Components

- **Grains**

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SBP-Meal Pattern Component- Grains

Grains may be whole grain, whole grain-rich or enriched.

Half of weekly grains must be whole grain-rich or whole grain, remaining grains must be enriched.

- **Serving sizes by grade groups**
 - **K-5** 1 oz min. daily and 7 oz weekly min
 - **6-8, K-8** 1 oz min. daily and 8 oz weekly min.
 - **9-12 or K-12** 1 oz min. daily and 9 oz weekly min.

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SBP-Meal Pattern Component- Fruit

Fruit may be fresh, frozen, canned, dried or juice.

No more than half of fruit may be served as juice over the course of one week.

- **Serving sizes for all grades**
 - 1 cup minimum daily and 5 cups weekly minimum

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SBP-Meal Pattern Component- Milk

Milk may be flavored, unflavored, fat-free or 1%.

Two varieties of milk must be offered daily.

Milk may be served in bulk for remote meal access when multiple days/meals are being provided.

- **Serving sizes for all grades**
 - 1 cup minimum daily and 5 cups weekly minimum

- Cycle menus
- Hot and cold menu items
- Distribution
 - Onsite
 - Remote

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Menu Planning

- Cycle menus
 - 1 to 2 week cycle
 - Build weeks as the year progresses
 - Trial and error

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Menu Planning

- Hot and cold menu items
 - Cold meals onsite and remote
 - Different menu for remote and onsite
 - Same meal served on repeated days
 - Group A onsite Monday-Tuesday, remote Wednesday-Thursday
 - Group B remote Monday- Tuesday onsite Wednesday-Thursday
 - All students remote on Friday

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Menu Planning

Distribution

- Onsite
 - traditional meal service in cafeterias
 - Classroom delivery
 - Grab and go to classroom
 - Alternate serving locations
- Remote
